










Bond Program Cost by Project Area




Debt Service Property Tax Rate Model

Transparent Project Selection Process from Strategic Planning Session

With limited resources, we must be intentional in the selection of projects for funding.

We propose selection be based on the following criteria:

- Equity—prioritizing areas of highest need;
- •Access—adding facilities in locations where there are gaps in service;
- •Strategic—prioritizing projects identified in the Strategic Plan as a priority area



Adds landscape improvements to existing raised medians.



- Intersection Safety Improvement Program
 - Continue to Develop Data (ISIP)
 - Development High Injury Network Intersection Safety Improvement Program (pilot intersection improvements)
 - Joint project with UTEP's Engineering School
 - Preliminary results were reported to Council April 26
 - Final report has been submitted and City is in process of procuring materials and equipment for intersection improvements


