




Current Conditions



City of El Paso STR Survey: How should the City handle short-term rentals?








Zip Code Distribution

National response locations






Word Cloud of Survey Responses

EL PASO CHAMBER





- On February 28th, the El Paso Chamber's Board of Directors voted to oppose the proposed ordinance establishing regulations on short-term rentals.
- Over 77% of the responses received from the Chamber's survey were against any kind of regulations on short-term rentals, citing that the ordinance would greatly reduce the short-term rental operators' ability to conduct a profitable business.





Co-Creation 3-Day Workshop

- Work to address the concerns or issues expressed in complaints or at the feedback sessions
- Identify potential solutions by fostering a collaborative environment with the City of El Paso, STR Hosts and neighborhoods

Create a Pilot that addresses these three areas:

- 311 Focus capture and monitor data on complaints/issues
- Good Neighbor Industry Action
- Identify and outreach stakeholder group




311 Focus

- Change script to include a question asking if the caller believes it is a rental
- Include language to track public safety responses identified as a rental
- Cross-reference potential short-term rental properties with existing complaints
- Offer an opportunity on the website for complaints or concerns about rental properties.




Latest Market Update as of 8/4/23 – Source elpasotx.com


