


Unrestored Streetcar (Painted Red)









Mandy the Mule Display, San Jacinto Plaza

CAR NO. 1, SAN JACINTO PLAZA El Paso, Texas

This is the first car that ran between El Paso and Ciudad Juarez. It was first used in 1883. It is not a replica, but it has been restored to original condition. Made by the El Paso Original Traction Company, it was the first piece of equipment produced by that company which was formed by two pioneer El Pasoans Joseph Magoffin and Zack White.

Mr. J. B. Brinkley of El Paso, who was conductor on Car #1 in 1901 was responsible for the restoration and subsequent presentation to the city.

"Mandy", the mule is a casting and was presented by the El Paso Odd Fellows Lodge. Car #1 and Mandy were placed in San Jacinto Plaza, September, 1955.
