

## FY 2026 Budget Focus

- Prior year reductions have not been restored
- \$26 million in reductions, efficiencies, and adjustments already taken from initial FY 2026
- Increases funding for Police and Fire by \$19.4 million, representing almost 80% of overall General Fund increase
- Provides additional tax relief for seniors and disabled homesteads
- Reduces the use of fund balance to balance the budget



## FY 2026 Budget Focus

- Provides next phase of compensation adjustments
- Identifying new revenue for the General Fund through dissolution of TIRZ #9
- Maintaining infrastructure investment, including pay-go for streets, facilities, vehicles, and equipment
- Further decreases debt burden paid off TIRZ #9 debt early and refinanced old debt

- August 19 Adoption of the FY 2026 Budget and Tax Rate
