Annual report to the **Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)** summarizing how federal entitlement funds were used:

- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
- •HOME Investment Partnerships Program (**HOME**)
- Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)
- Housing Opportunities with Persons with AIDS (HOPWA)
- Community Development Block Grant COVID (CDBG-CV)

Required under HUD's Consolidated Planning Process

Demonstrates how funds were spent, who benefited, and progress toward local goals.



Annual Action Plan (AAP) and 5-Year Consolidated Plan

2024-2025 CAPER closes the HUD's 5-year planning

cycle:

1. 5-Year Consolidated Plan

Long-term strategy outlining community priorities and goals for housing, infrastructure, and services.

2. Annual Action Plan (AAP)

Details **specific projects and budgets** to be implemented each year toward those goals.

The FY 2024-2025 AAP guided all funded activities reported in this CAPER.

3. CAPER

Reports actual accomplishments compared to what was planned in the AAP.

Confirms alignment with the 5-Year Plan's objectives.

ESG

- **Emergency Shelter:** Safe overnight housing for individuals experiencing homelessness
- Street Outreach: Engagement and connection to essential services for unsheltered residents
- Homelessness Prevention: Financial assistance and case management to prevent eviction
- Rapid Rehousing: Short-term rental aid and support to transition families into stable housing

HOPWA

- Housing Assistance: Stable, affordable housing for individuals and families affected by HIV/AIDS
- Case Management: Ongoing support to maintain health, stability, and self-sufficiency
- Supportive Services: Referrals for healthcare, mental health, and transportation
- Tenant-Based Rental Assistance: Preventing homelessness through long-term rent support



Client Impact Highlight

El Paso Human Services Winchester House Emergency Shelter

- Provided emergency shelter and case management to youth experiencing homelessness.
- "MB", an 18-year-old student, found stability through the program: obtaining documents, finishing school, and securing employment."
- Today, "MB" has maintained stable housing for over two years and is working as a security officer. Hopes to start a family and pursue higher education.





Facilities Highlight

PdN Children's Inclusive Learning Center East Campus

Paso Del Norte Children's Development received \$1 million in CDBG funding for the construction of a new early learning facility with eight classrooms now providing high-quality childcare and education for children with disabilities in an inclusive and nurturing environment with a capacity of up to 170 children.
