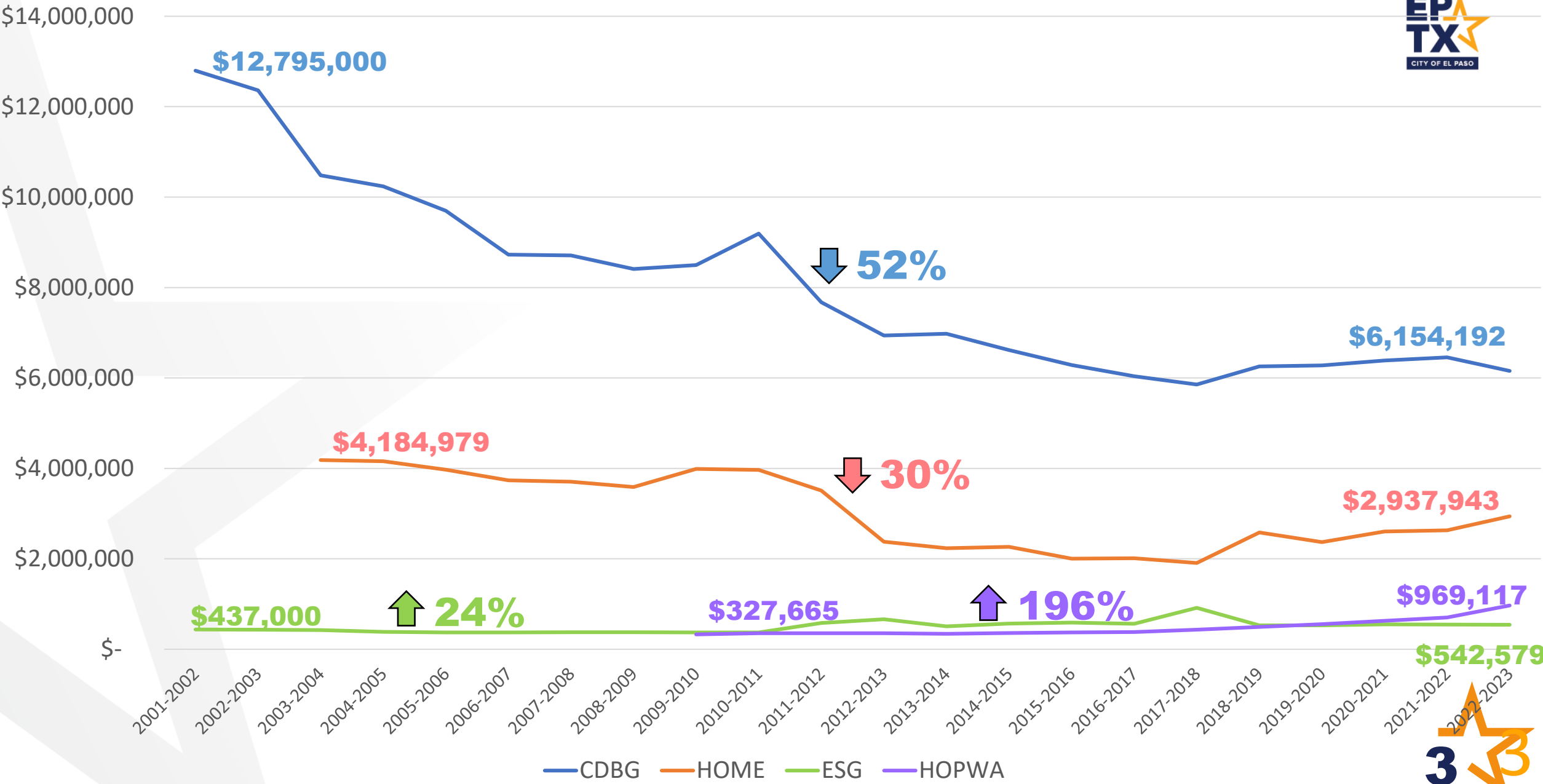

## Summary of Changes

- ### 1 Community Development Block Grant

  - Medical and Mental Health Services: \$252,856.55 (reduction of \$33,544.35)
  - Large-Scale Public Facilities: \$2,525,224.95 (reduction of \$145,359.05)
- ### 2 Emergency Solutions Grants

  - Rapid Rehousing: \$151,109.63 (reduction of \$5,491.65)
- ### 3 Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS

  - Department of Public Health, HOPWA Program: \$947,853 (increase of \$260,328)
- ### 4 HOME Investment Partnerships

  - Multi-Family Affordable Rental Housing by Investors: \$2,466,623 (increase of \$342,737)
