





Competitive Sealed Proposal (CSP)

- 1. Regulated by Texas Local Government Code 2269: Contracting and Delivery Procedures for Construction Projects
- 2. CSP is a procurement method by which a governmental entity requests proposals, ranks the offerors, negotiates as prescribed, and then contracts with a general contractor for the construction, rehabilitation, alteration, or repair of a facility Sec. 2269.151.
- 3. All other applicable ordinances, policies and/resolutions:
 - 1. Competitive Sealed Proposal Policy
 - 2. Hire El Paso First Program, etc.



Scope of Work

Project includes the following Work:

The Sun Metro LIFT transit vehicle gated parking lot, located on 5081 Fred Wilson Avenue, El Paso, Tx 79906, will be reconfigured and re-striped. The existing parking lot south of the gated pond will be reconfigured to accommodate 25-dual Level 2 Electrical Vehicle chargers and 50-electrical vehicles within the existing parking lot. The parking lot reconfiguration will include open trench excavation and concrete pavement repair to install electrical and communication conduit. The parking lot reconfiguration will also include removal of existing striping, approximately 2050 linear feet of proposed pavement markings, wheelstop installation, and concrete filled permanent bollards. The electrical improvements include installation of new panelboards and dry-type transformers, a new 2,000 amp main switchgear to serve the new electric vehicle chargers, conduit, and wire. Communication improvements include the installation of conduit and ethernet cabling to each charger as well as a new outdoor IT enclosure and fiber optic cable routed in conduit to the main facility IT room.

Scope of this Work also includes re-striping the existing parking lot located east of the gated pond. This work includes removal and re-striping approximately 5001 linear feet of pavement markings.

The following major elements must be covered within the three (3) projects by either the prime contractor or his/her subcontractors: construction of Electric dual charging stations and associated work, special systems and communication system installation including but not limited to fiber optic lines and infrastructure, and installation of electrical conduit, wiring, electrical transformers. The project information submitted representing the project experience of the offeror will be evaluated and scored by the committee. The offeror shall include the following information for each project:

- The project location

- Key contact person, address, telephone number and email address

- 5. Project budget and final construction cost
- Award date and completion date


Criteria Requirement:

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Sec. 2269.153. PREPARATION OF REQUEST. (a) In this section, "civil works project" has the meaning assigned by Section 2269.351.
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- (b) The governmental entity shall prepare a request for competitive sealed proposals that includes construction documents, selection criteria estimated project completion date, and other information that a contractor may require to respond to the request.



The City's Cone of Silence/Anti Lobbying Policy was adopted to ensure a fair and competitive bidding environment by preventing communication between City officials, employees, or representatives and parties involved in the bidding process that could create an unfair advantage to any party with respect to the award of a City contract.

During the period of in which the City has issued a solicitation, including a competitive bid, request for proposal (RFP), request for qualifications (RFQ), highest qualified bid (best value), competitive sealed proposals, design-build, public-private partnership, any other type of solicitation required by law, or the giving of a notice of a proposed project, which shall begin on the day that is advertised and end on the date that the notice of the award has been posted by the City Clerk for placement on the agenda, no person or registrant shall engage in any lobbying activities with City officials and employees.

For an unsolicited or competing proposal for a public-private partnership, the period in which no person or registrant shall engage in any lobbying activities with City officials and employees shall begin on the date that the City receives a notice of intent to submit an unsolicited proposal and end on the date the notice of award has been posted by the City clerk for placement on the agenda.

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

A PDF of the Bid Bond will be attached containing all the required signatures of the principal and surety. Such bid bonds will be returned promptly after the Owner and the accepted Bidder have executed the Contract, or, if no award has been made, within one hundred-twenty (120) consecutive calendar days after the date of the opening of proposals, upon demand of the Offeror at any time thereafter, so long as he/she has not been notified of the acceptance of his/her proposal.

Attorneys-in-Fact who sign bid bond must file with bid bond a certified and effectively dated copy of their power of attorney.

Original Bid Bond and power of attorney MUST to be submitted to Purchasing & Strategic Sourcing, 300 N. Campbell, El Paso, TX 79912, within 7 days of bid opening. Proposal will be considered non-responsive if original documents are not in file with Purchasing & Strategic Sourcing Department within 7 days of bid opening.



The City shall not contact the offeror for replacement references and/or contact information if said e-mail addresses or telephones numbers are not valid or connected. In addition to the above, the Offeror is encouraged to inform said references that they shall initially be contacted via e-mail at the e-mail address provided herein. If a response to the e-mail is not provided within the designated time frame, the City will attempt to contact the reference by telephone at the number provided. 

Ranking Notification Requirement

3. Notice of Initial Ranking and Filing Protests. The Offerors will be notified in writing (email) of the final ranking. The ranking shall be sent with the notice and shall show the order of the ranking and points received by each Offeror. Offerors shall have three (3) City working days from the day of their receipt of the notice to challenge the ranking by filing a protest. The Offeror must write a letter to the Purchasing Director using the phrase "Bid Protest" to the address listed above. Protest must be sent by certified or registered mail or delivered in person. The protest shall state the basis for the challenge of the ranking. All Offerors will be notified of any protests filed.

Selection Requirement:

Sec. 2269.155. SELECTION OF OFFEROR. (a) The governmental entity shall select the offeror that submits the proposal that offers the best value for the governmental entity based on:

- (1) the selection criteria in the request for proposal and the weighted value for those criteria in the request for proposal; and
 - (2) its ranking evaluation.
- (b) The governmental entity shall first attempt to negotiate a contract with the selected offeror. The governmental entity and its architect or engineer may discuss with the selected offeror options for a scope or time modification and any price change associated with the modification.
- (c) If the governmental entity is unable to negotiate a satisfactory contract with the selected offeror, the governmental entity shall, formally and in writing, end negotiations with that offeror and proceed to the next offeror in the order of the selection ranking until a contract is reached or all proposals are rejected.




