#### **Program Focus**

Application request for residential traffic calming devices

- Speed Cushions
- Pavement Markings
- Speed Feedback Signs (Collector streets)

Traffic Study / Eligibility Notice



Design / Public Notification



Installation / After-Study







#### **Pre-Qualifications**

- Paved street within City Limits
- Local or Collector street
- One travel lane of traffic in each direction
- Speed limit between 20 to 35 MPH
- Primarily composed of singlefamily or duplexes housing



### **Eligibility Criteria**


- Petition of Support Submit application with at least 51% residential household signatures from subject street
- Traffic Volume 500 to 7,500 vehicles per day
- Traffic Speed 10% of traffic volume traveling 5 MPH or more over the speed limit (90<sup>th</sup> percentile)

After Studies – FY20-23 NTMP Projects

- **25%** Average Traffic Volume Reduction
- **16%** Average Speed Reduction (85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed)








#### **General Funds**






#### Fund Usage

# NTMP Application Status by Fiscal Year







#### **FY2024 NTMP Active List**


