Discussion and action on a Resolution authorizing the Mayor to sign an Interlocal Agreement between the City of El Paso and the Camino Real Regional Mobility Authority (CRRMA) for the Medical Center of the Americas (MCA) Placemaking Guidelines Project.

The City of El Paso will contribute \$68,000 toward this effort, which was allocated under the MCA Sun City Lights Program and approved by City Council on May 7, 2024



Why the MCA Area Matters

The Medical Center of the Americas (MCA) District is one of El Paso's most important economic and innovation hubs a 440- acre campus where education, research, and healthcare intersect to drive regional growth.



CRRMA's Role

The Camino Real Regional Mobility Authority (CRRMA) will serve as the lead agency responsible for managing and overseeing the MCA Placemaking Guidelines Project



Oversee and manage consultant in accordance with the interlocal agreement



Coordinating with all participating stakeholders



Reviewing & approving project deliverables, schedules, and invoices to ensure compliance



Facilitating technical coordination meetings



Providing project administration and reporting to all funding partners

The project unfolds over three major phases Discovery, Placemaking, and Project Management

The CRRMA will lead all tasks, with input and review by the City, County, UMC, Texas Tech, and El Paso Children's Hospital.
