






# VISION DE RAFE STREET

#### **Intersection Safety Improvement Program**

- Focuses on intersections with high # of crashes
  - Tier 1 Re-Striping/Signage/Signals \$447,622
  - Tier 2 Enhanced Striping/Signal Flashers/Mast Arms \$762,000
  - Tier 3 Complete Streets \$2,941,000 (unfunded)




## **Priority Project Categories Safe Users**

- Signature Projects (\$6 million)




