


FEMA Flood Risk Study Overview

El Paso County Flood Risk Study:

- County-wide update to regulatory Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM)
- □ County-wide BLE available
- Detailed study in areas impacted by Rio Grande levees
- Includes latest data, engineering & analysis
- Updated to include City of El Paso and El Paso County comments





Completed Steps in Mapping Process

- El Paso Preliminary Map Release: July 8, 2020.
- Appeal Period: May 23 August 21 of 2021.
- Appeals and Comments Resolved May 2023.
 - City of El Paso Appeal/Comment Package 800 Comments
 - El Paso County 100 Comments
 - 3 Other Comments
- Extensive Quality Assurance Reviews Summer 2023.
- Revised Preliminary FIRM November 15, 2023.




Current and Future Steps in Mapping Process

- New 90 Day Comment Period: June 6, 2024
 - Only information that has changed from original to Revised Preliminary FIRM eligible for comments.
- Letter of Final Determination: End of 2024/Beginning 2025
- New FIRM Goes Effective: 180 days after LFD (Summer 2025)






Where can I find my Preliminary FIRM?

- Base Level Engineering available on Estimated BFE Viewer: https://webapps.usgs.gov/infrm/estBFE





 - Clarifies what is eligible for appeal






Natural Valley Flood Analysis

- New properties will be added to the Special Flood Hazard Area in the preliminary FIRM.
- Area that is particularly impacted is the Upper Valley.
- In map to right, area in red is Special Flood Hazard Area (Zone AE/A), yellow is 500-year floodplain (shaded Zone X), and purple is the area of reduced risk due to El Paso 2 levee (shaded Zone X).





Future Levee Accreditation Efforts

- Coordination with City of El Paso, El Paso Water, USIBWC, and other stakeholders on levee accreditation continues, per 44 CFR 65.10
- Levee accreditation through the LOMR process available at any time
- Flood Insurance will continue to be based on current effective maps
