WHEREAS, books and reading materials from a range of thought are crucial for the educational advancement of students and adults in this modern era; and

WHEREAS, the lack of such reading resources will hinder new growth and thought, negatively impacting our public schools, universities, workforce, and economy; and

WHEREAS, Texas state officials in leadership positions this past October have begun questioning books and reading materials in public schools, particularly those relating to race and sexuality, including Pulitzer Prize winning books and authors; and

WHEREAS, everyone in our community has the right to read whichever book they choose, including books pertaining to race, sexuality, immigration, LGBTQ items, and beyond; and

WHEREAS, the books in jeopardy of being banned tell the stories of people of color and are the stories of the marginally oppressed which should be included in the education of all people; and

WHEREAS, the power of words and books should be used to open the eyes and the world of younger generations; and

WHEREAS, if young people are not encouraged to read the truths of history in school, the El Paso Public Library system can be a resource to their growth and understanding; and

WHEREAS, we have an obligation to make sure all stories are heard. When we talk about inclusivity, we mean that we are one community, that we make sure the voices of all our constituents are represented through diverse storytelling; and

WHEREAS, the over 800 books at risk of being inaccessible to Texas students, by Texas State leadership, include notable titles, such as:
