THE CITY OF EL PASO PUBLIC ART PROGRAM



To date the program has:

- Completed 78 Projects
- Established the Art Purchase Program with 192 Acquisitions
- Worked with 233 Artists, 82% being Local Artists
- Provided 43 Local Artists with professional apprenticeships through the Allied Artist Program
- Impacted over 150 Local Businesses with Public Art Projects
- Received 10 National awards and has been featured in 18 National publications

Public Art Process



City of El Paso will invite an artist/artist team to create a unique, new work of art through the following process:

- The selected artist/artists are given a project brief that includes a site (or ideas around siting), a set of goals, a budget and a timeline
- The artist/artists develops a concept design that is responsive to the brief
- An Artist Selection Panel (ASP) convenes (representatives from user department, CID, a neighborhood association/community stakeholder, a local artist and Public Art Committee (PAC)). ASP reviews and scores to select an artist to recommend to full PAC
- The PAC reviews the recommendation and will accept, accept with conditions, or not accept the recommendation
- Artist then contracted and begins working on finalizing a concept design
- Design is presented to the community for input before the artist refines and submits design to PAC for approval
- Final design presented to PAC which approves or requests modifications based on project budget parameters, materials, etc.
- Once final design approved, the artist develops engineering drawings for review and approval by the City before proceeding with fabrication.






