

- Greg Abbott v. La Joya Independent School District, et al.
 - On March 17, 2022, 3rd COA upheld a trial court's temporary injunction granted to 13 school districts over GA-38, allowing the districts' mask mandates to stand.
 - Including El Paso Independent School District

- On March 17, 2022, the U.S. Senate voted to overturn the federal transportation mask mandate. The vote heads to the U.S. House of Representatives next.
- The mandate was recently extended for another 30 days through April 18, 2022.












- ❖Texas Supreme Court Emergency Order
 - ❖ 49th Emergency Order Regarding COVID-19
 - ❖ Effective April 1, 2022- June 1, 2022
 - Sets dismissal dates for certain family law cases
 - Continues authorizing all courts to require or allow remote hearings
 - Municipal Court presiding judge is encouraged to adopt minimum standard health protocols for the courtrooms


Map of COVID-19 emergency orders by state



- Priority is to protect the people at the highest risk.








EX COVID-19 and Variants
