Retired and Senior Volunteer Program

Providing enrichment to the lives of older adults through significant community service

- One of the largest volunteer networks in the US for people 55 years of age and older.
- RSVP has served the El Paso community since 1974.
- El Paso has over 600 active RSVP volunteers that serve at over 30 organizations and non-profits.
- Encourages seniors to bring a lifetime of talent, experience, skills and hobbies to community projects that impact the quality of life in El Paso.
- RSVP has 4 focus areas: Food Security, Transportation, Respite Care, and Companionship

RSVP volunteers contribute over 85,000 volunteer hours annually.



Nutrition/Food Security

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- Food Distribution
- Nutrition Education classes
- Annual back to school supplies donation drive
- Assistance with SNAP/Food Stamps application
- Conduct bi-annual surveys on food security



Transportation

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- Allows for capacity for Independent Living
- Provides Companionship
- Transportation for seniors to medical appointments, pharmacy, groceries, personal errands
- Conduct Pre and Post independent living surveys



Respite Care

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- Relieves stress of caregiving
- Regular non-medical home visits
- Companionship & re-assurance for client reaching end of life
- Conduct respite surveys for caregivers



Companionship

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- Telephone reassurance program (Calling All Seniors)
- Reestablished in response to the pandemic
- Wellness calls/Referral Service
- Socialize & form friendships
- Independent living and better quality of life
- Battle isolation and depression
- Pre and Post Life Satisfaction Survey



FGP Performance Measures
