

FY 2023 PRIORITIES

Service Level Restoration: Recruitment Strategy

Human Resources:

- Additional assistance with scheduling & interviewing
- Acceleration of time between posting, interviewing & onboarding
- Activation of BorderPlex Youth Program for entry level positions
- Pre-screening/Background checks for BorderPlex participants

Strategic Communications

- Marketing campaign for positions needed to open additional facilities:
 - Boosted social media posts
 - Radio & Streaming advertising
 - Digital Advertisements



MAJOR VARIANCES

GOAL 4

- Libraries Increase is due to compensation increases and additional funding for library books
- Museums and Cultural Affairs Increase is due to Children's Museum stipend (1/3 of operations), MACC support positions and compensation increases
- Parks and Recreation Increase is due to compensation increases, additional Parkland Management crews, water cost, maintenance for additional dedicated parkland acreage and restoration of unfunded vacancies
- Zoo & Botanical Gardens Compensation increases and operations and maintenance for new 2012 Capital Projects

- Zoo includes compensation increases and additional positions for Qol Projects

- Capital Outlay increase for vehicle and equipment replacement for Parks






