




- Founded in 1956 by Dwight Eisenhower, Sister Cities International is the national association representing a

 international communities.
- Formed by a volunteer group of citizens with the support of local elected officials, non profits, private businesses
 and other organizations for long term relationships with people and organizations in a community abroad



- Torreon has expressed an enthusiastic desire to expand toward El Paso to grow its businesses and engage in a global market.
- 2021: Coahuila became the second-largest exporting state in Mexico after Chihuahua. Secondary economic activities, including manufacturing and industrial development, have had an increase of 8.8%, outgrowing primary activities dealing with raw material

Proposed Agreement

Objective: Cooperate with one another in areas of common interest, including:

- Promotion of business through an exchange of business missions, design of strategy to stimulate exports, and participation in events like forums, trade fairs and seminars
- Promote and implement projects with the objective of exchanging technology, knowledge and professional education to promote economic activity
- Promotion of tourism, art, trade shows and destinations
