

- On April 11, 2023, President Biden signed H.J.Res.7 ending the COVID-19 National Emergency
- No impact on the Public Health Emergency by Health and Human Services
- The Public Health Emergency will expire on May 11, 2023








# Additional Updates –COVID-19 Prosecution Update

Trial Settings on COVID-19 Citations through 4/19/2023 in all 5 Municipal Courts







#### National Emergency

- National Emergency was declared in March, 2020 pursuant to Section 201 of the National Emergencies Act.
  - Termination by POTUS or joint resolution of Congress
  - Expires if not continuation notice is issued annually
- Relies on other emergency authority in other statutes
- POTUS must specify which authorities are activated in the declaration
  - HHS authority to waive or modify requirements for Medicare, Medicaid, State CHIP programs, HIPAA health privacy rule under Social Security Act named in March 2020 declaration





#### Public Health Emergency (PHE)

- Public Health Emergency was issued under 42 USC 319
  - renewed every 90 days thereafter
- Make grants;
- Modify the practice of telemedicine;
- Enter into contracts;
- Conduct and support investigations into the cause, treatment, or prevention of the disease or disorder;
- Make temporary personnel available to respond to the emergency;
- · Grant an extension or waiver requirements of certain Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration grants on a state-by-state basis;
- Access so-called no-year funds appropriated to the Public Health Emergency Fund; and
- Grant extensions or waiving sanctions related to submission of data or reports required by statute.





# CDC order tied the PHE to Title 42 expulsions

- 42 USC 265 allows the exclusion of noncitizens due to the existence of communicable disease that could spread within the United States.
- "the expiration of the Secretary of HHS' declaration that COVID19 constitutes a public health emergency," or (b) a determination by CDC that "the danger of further introduction of COVID-19 into the United States has declined such that continuation of the Order is no longer necessary to protect public health." 86 Fed. Reg. at 42,830.




#### COVID-19 Update

- City clinics continue to offer free COVID vaccine









