





- Relating to the conveyance of property by a municipality for the public purpose of economic development.
- Effective immediately

Texas Jobs, Energy, Technology and Innovation
 Act: Relating to agreements authorizing a limitation on
 taxable value of certain property to provide for the
 creation of jobs and the generation of state and local
 tax revenue; authorizing a fee; authorizing penalties



Gun Legislation

HB3*

 Relating to measures for ensuring public school safety, including the development and implementation of purchases relating to and funding for public school safety and security requirements and the provision of safety-related resources.



Education & Workforce Development

HB9 & HJR125

- Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment Program: Relating to the development and funding of broadband and telecommunications services.
- **Enabling Legislation:** Proposing a constitutional amendment creating the broadband infrastructure fund to expand high-speed broadband access and assist in the financing of connectivity projects.





PROCLAMATION

BY THE

Covernor of the State of Texas

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

To consider and act upon the following:

Legislation to cut property-tax rates solely by reducing the school district maximum compressed tax rate in order to provide lasting property-tax relief for Texas taxpayers.

Legislation solely for the purpose of increasing or enhancing the penalties for certain criminal conduct involving the smuggling of persons or the operation of a stash house.

SB 2

 Relating to the creation of the criminal offense of improper entry from a foreign nation.

SB 4

Relating to the punishment for the offense of trafficking of persons.

SB 3

 Relating to the punishment for the criminal offense of operation of a stash house; increasing a criminal penalty.

SB 5

Relating to the punishment for certain criminal conduct involving the smuggling of persons or the operation of a stash house; increasing criminal penalties.
