MARCH 24, 2020

DHS published
notice to temporarily
limit the travel of
individuals from
Mexico at land ports
along the U.S.Mexico Border to
only "essential travel"
due to the COVID-19
pandemic



FEB. 22, 2021

Extended through March 21, 2021

Restricted Non-essential travel—individuals traveling for tourism purposes (e.g. sightseeing, recreation, gambling, or attending cultural events)

EXCOVID-19 Snapshot

- Declining trend on positive cases continues.
- Cases have declined about 32% from February 1st. to February 24.
- Positivity rate is declining now at around 5%
- Demand for testing continue to be low.
- Slow downward trend hospitalizations (-13%) February 1 to February 24

COVID-19 Snapshot

- ❖Rate of Asymptomatic patients about 16%
- Currently our TSA area COVID Hospitalization declining and now at 16%
- **❖**CFR is 1.66%

- Variants of Concern spreading around the world.
- Other variants of interest are circulating in the US
- We remain vigilant for new variants of concern
- COVID-19 vaccination an important tool in prevention and protection
- New Johnson and Johnson vaccine in the horizon

- Food & Drug Administration advisory panel approval
- CDC ACIP recommendations





Johnson & Johnson /Janssen Vaccine Update

- ❖18 years of age and older
- ❖No special refrigeration; 3 month; 2 Yr. frozen

Findings:

- ❖Tried on over 40,000 several w/ co-morbidities
- ❖66% overall efficacy
- ❖85% efficacy for preventing hospitalization/severe illness
- ❖3-4 million doses allocation at EUA
- ❖20 million by end of March





Education Taskforce Community Outreach

Senior Center Outreach - County meals program

❖ 12 City, 4 County = 16

Activities:

- On-site registration
- Calls determine vaccination status, register
- Identify homebound
- Collaborate with community agencies for outreach in county areas





Education Taskforce Community Outreach

Outcomes

Target population 1,680 (meals enrollment)


- ❖Total centers =7: Hilos de Plata, Happiness Senior Center, Grandview, Eastside, Polly Harris, South El Paso, Wellington Chew
- Next: Memorial, Friendly, and Chihuahua
- 1,466 reached, 176 enrolled
- ❖1866 homebound throughout City-County

Community Outreach: Door-to-Door

Segundo Barrio Neighborhood Outreach

- ❖ Identify elderly, determine vaccine status, register
- Identify homebound
- Identify transportation needs

Activities:

- ❖ 6 teams of 2
- Door-to-door outreach
- ❖ Register ≥ 65, chronically ill





Community Outreach

Outcomes:

Target- Segundo Barrio 2084 households

As of 2/25/21:

- 1,422 households visited
- UMC/Housing Authority partnership -700 targeted & reached
- 2,122 total jointly reached
- ❖ 154 registered; UMC vaccinated














Business Grant Recipient Industries













El Paso Business Metrics

Number of Employees – August to December












Post-Pandemic Capital Needs








Does your business currently have a banking relationship with a bank or credit union?





Most pressing concerns for businesses




Top 5 concerns:

How do you intend to use the grant for?












How long can your business survive with your current capital?
