## The Cultural Funding Program

- The Cultural Funding Program (CFP) provides seed funding, project, and operational support to the local creative community through a competitive granting process
  - Operating Support Program (OSP)
  - Project Support Program (PSP)
  - Community Arts Program (CAP)
  - Artist Incubator Program (AIP)
  - Local Filmmaker Program (LFP)
  - KickstArt Downtown
- The CFP has been recognized as a model of transparency by the Texas Commission on the Arts.
- Funds individual artists and non-profit arts and cultural organizations





### Adaptations for FY20 and FY21

- Honored ALL FY20 contracts, when most major Texas cities canceled arts support
- Streamlined application process for OSP in FY21 due to pandemic
- Expedited award process
- Developed micro-funding opportunity for FY21 to help to stabilize the creative sector
  - Awarded: \$138,950
    - Artists: 106
    - Organizations: 12





## **Rationale for Temporary Changes**

- Program is primarily funded by HOT, which has been impacted significantly by COVID-19
- Increased demands on funding
- Need to maximize budget while supporting local artists and non-profit cultural organizations
- Continue to incentivize innovation in programming and impact to local community
- Changes and efficiencies applied to 5 funding programs
- Voice of the customer: input from local creative sector derived from surveys and focus groups





## User-Centered Research and Outreach Methods

- Artist and Organizational Focus Groups
- Review of historical funding data
- Survey of best practices
- Digital surveys





## **Operating Support Program (OSP)**

- Changed from a 1-year contract to a 2-year contract
  - Allows organizations to plan ahead and mirrors state funding best practices
- Reduced maximum award request from \$25,000 to \$20,000
  - Allows MCAD to fund successful applicants increasing funding impact
- Organizations must maintain \$100,000 + budget during two-year award period
- Submit a mid-year and end-of-year report to ensure contract compliance to secure 2<sup>nd</sup> year funding







### **Artist Incubator Program**

- Artists are eligible to receive a total 3 AIP awards
- No other changes have been made to AIP



#### **New Pauses on Programs: CAP and PSP**

- The Community Arts Program (CAP) provides funding for grassroots non-profit arts/cultural organizations and individual artists to provide activities, services, performances and demonstrations in community and neighborhood spaces. The program creates a roster of arts and culture providers available to provide free services throughout the city.
- The Project Support Program (PSP) supports non-profit organizations' highquality arts experiences that are innovative, accessible and appealing to both El Pasoans and visitors. PSP funds can be used for all project-related expenses including administration, production costs, artistic fees, outreach and marketing.





#### **Arts Activate**

- Replaces CAP and PSP
- New for FY22
- Driven by voice of the customer
- Funding limits
  - \$10,000 for artists
  - \$20,000 for non-profit organizations
- Provides project-based support for the creation and presentation of innovative arts and cultural activities that are reflective of the El Paso region's rich and diverse art, culture and heritage.



# **Updates to Eligibility**

Organizations:

- Organizations must be in-compliance with local, state, and federal laws prohibiting discrimination
- Activities and services must be open and accessible to the public and meet the requirements established by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and related City ordinances
- Organizations must be authorized to transact business in the State of Texas





## **Updates to Eligibility**

Artists:

- Insurance may be required for AAP, AIP
- Artists must be ready to secure insurance for projects if required by Risk Management
  - A Certificate of Insurance (COI) must be submitted to the City covering the entire term of the contract.
  - Applicants are required to obtain and maintain all necessary licenses, permits, insurance, royalty permissions and other approvals required by law for the provision of services.





### **Programs on Continued Hiatus for FY22**

- Local Filmmaker Program continued hiatus from FY21
- KickstArt Downtown continued hiatus from FY21
