


- Cases and hospitalizations are growing and continue an upward trend
- Cases have grown an average of about 34% for the last 4 weeks
- ❖7-day rolling avg of new cases have grown about 150% in the last month
- ❖Last month 7-day avg of new cases per capita have grown 2.3 times
- ❖In average last 4 weeks 4 out of 5 new cases were unvaccinated


Cases per Capita (100,000)
















COVID-19 Hospitalizations

- Hospitalizations have seen an increase of 75% over the last month
- Last month only 7.7% of cases were hospitalized
- Last 4 weeks 85% of people admitted to hospitals were unvaccinated
- Hospitalizations more frequent in adults.
- Immunization against COVID-19 is the best defense against hospitalization and death.











Hospitalizations Comparison

















Hospitalization by Age





















COVID-19 and Schools


- A comprehensive layered safety plan proven to be the most effective prevention strategy



























The path to economic recovery seems to be gaining steam driven by lower unemployment



El Paso County Unemployment


El Paso County Weekly Unemployment Insurance Claims (in thousands)

International Bridge Crossings




Percent change of mobility compared to January 3-February 6 (Baseline) for each day of the week


Percent change of mobility compared to January 3-February 6 (Baseline) for each day of the week

Hybrid Staffing Update

- From the onset of the Stay at Home Directive, 42% of our workforce has remained onsite delivering essential services
- Return to work site decision point has always been condition based on vaccination rate, current infection rate and evaluation of ICU bed and hospital bed capacity
 - Target date of September 13th for Phase I
- Hybrid Staffing
 - Phase 1 1 day in the office
 - Phase 2 2 days in the office, 60 days following Phase I
- City Core Hours: Monday through Thursday 8am 5pm
- Department Flexibility To Meet Operational Needs
