

Greg Abbott v. City of El Paso

❖ September 30, 2021:

- ❖ 8th COA denied City's request to keep Temporary Injunction in place
- City's Mask Mandate paused to keep status quo

❖ October 5, 2021:

- City submitted reply brief
- ❖ Ruling on Plea to Jurisdiction pending in 8th COA
- Case will return to CC7 for trial





Statewide Mask Mandate Litigation

Obtained TRO & Mask Mandate Temporarily Suspended

- City of San Antonio & Bexar County - 4th COA
- Dallas County 5th COA
- Fort Bend County 1st COA

Obtained TRO & Mask Mandate Still in Place

- La Joya ISD, et. al (Travis County) - 3rd COA
- Harris County 3rd COA





Additional Updates – Land Ports of Entry Travel Restrictions

March 24, 2020

DHS published notice to temporarily limit the travel of individuals from Mexico at land ports along the U.S.-Mexico Border to only "essential travel" due to the COVID-19 pandemic



September 20, 2021

Extended through October 21, 2021

Restricted Non-essential travel—individuals traveling for tourism purposes (e.g. sightseeing, recreation, gambling, or attending cultural events)







Report Additional Updates - Courts Update


- Texas Supreme Court Emergency Orders
 - Effective October 1 December 1, 2021
 - ❖ 42nd Emergency Order Extends Eviction Diversion Program
 - ❖ 43rd Emergency Order Regarding COVID-19
 - ❖ Courts can no longer modify or suspend any and all deadlines or procedures
 - Continues authorizing all courts to require or allow remote hearings
 - Municipal Court presiding judge can mandate compliance with minimum standard health protocols adopted for their courtrooms




- ❖7-day avg of New Cases per 100,000 is seeing an upward trend from Sep 30 after a plateau of 3 weeks
- ❖Hospitalized patients are stable at avg of ≈ 110 patients
- ❖We have fully vaccinated over 76% of eligible population
- Pandemic is currently driven by the unvaccinated
- We STRONGLY continue recommending practicing prevention with vaccination and non-pharmacological interventions






New Cases/Hospitalizations By CDC Week








Level of Community Transmission
