#### RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE RULES OF ORDER FOR THE EL PASO CITY COUNCIL REVISED, AS EFFECTIVE JANUARY 3, 2023

#### **SECTION 1. PURPOSE OF RESOLUTION**

This Resolution is adopted pursuant to Section 3.5.B of the Charter of the City of El Paso as a procedural guide for the benefit of the City Council and for the general information of the public. These rules shall apply to regular, special and work session meetings at which action is to be taken, but shall not apply to meetings for committees of the City Council or to informational gatherings of the Council.

#### **SECTION 2. RULES OF ORDER**

Robert's Rules of Order Revised shall govern the procedures of Council unless they are in conflict with these rules.

#### SECTION 3. EFFECT OF FAILURE TO FOLLOW THESE RULES

No action of the Council that is otherwise legal shall be invalidated merely by reason of the failure of the Council or City staff to follow these Rules of Order, unless the majority of the Council agrees that such action shall be invalidated.

#### **SECTION 4. STANDING**

No one other than a member of the City Council shall have standing to assert before the Council that any action taken by the Council is invalid by reason of the Council's failure to comply with these Rules of Order.

#### **SECTION 5. SUSPENSION OF RULES**

These rules may be suspended temporarily by a majority of the Council members present and voting, except as they pertain to a quorum, or to the majority required for any motion, or to other matters pre-empted by laws other than those Rules of Order.

#### **SECTION 6. PRESIDING OFFICER**

The Mayor shall preside at all meetings of the City Council, but if for any reason he is absent from the City, sick or unable to act, then the Mayor Pro Tempore shall preside at such meetings and at such times shall exercise all of the powers and discharge the duties of the Mayor, except that the Mayor Pro Tempore shall vote as a Representative. In the absence or inability of both the Mayor and the Mayor Pro Tempore, the Alternate Mayor Pro Tempore shall preside and shall vote as a Representative. Upon the arrival of the Mayor, the Mayor Pro Tempore or the Alternate Mayor Pro Tempore, the acting chairman shall immediately relinquish the chair upon the conclusion of the business immediately pending before the Council.

The presiding officer shall preserve strict order and decorum at all regular and special meetings of the Council, and shall state questions coming before the Council as necessary for clarity, and shall announce the decision of the Council on all subjects. The Presiding Officer shall disable the microphone at the podium when he determines that the speaker has violated council rules of order.

#### **SECTION 7. QUESTIONS OF ORDER**

All questions of order shall be decided by the presiding officer with the right of appeal from his or her decision to the Council that is present, the majority of whom, present and voting, may override the decision.

#### **SECTION 8. VOTING**

The electronic voting system shall be utilized for the casting of the roll call votes of the Council in Council Chambers except as otherwise provided herein. The City Clerk shall call for an electronic vote and each Representative shall, without undue delay, cast his or her vote on the electronic voting system. When all votes have been cast, the City Clerk will review, announce and display the results of the voting, and staff will capture the display on the digital recording of the meeting or fully read the results into the record. In the event of a tie vote, the City Clerk will announce the results and call for the Mayor's vote before displaying the results. Any error in voting or any discrepancy between the display of the votes and the City Clerk's announcement of the results shall be corrected prior to the time that the Council proceeds to consider the next agenda item.

The requirements under this section for the use of the electronic voting system shall be automatically suspended under the following circumstances and for the duration as announced by the City Clerk: (a) upon the announcement of the City Clerk that the electronic voting system is not working properly; (b) for votes on procedural matters including motions to recess and to take an agenda item out of order, and votes by acclamation; (c) when the Council is voting on more than one agenda item simultaneously; and (d) when more than one vote will be taken pertaining to an agenda item and in such instance, the City Clerk shall announce which vote shall be taken by use of the electronic voting system and which vote(s) shall be taken only by voice vote.

In the event that the use of the electronic voting system is suspended or the system is otherwise not available, the City Clerk shall call the roll beginning with the Representative seated furthest to the Mayor's right and continuing in that order. Each Representative shall audibly indicate his or her vote.

Records of all roll call votes shall be incorporated in the Minutes of the meeting.

#### **SECTION 9. RECORDED DEBATE**

A Representative may request, through the presiding officer, to have an abstract of his or her statement on any subject under consideration by the Council entered in the Minutes or to attach any document referenced during a Council meeting to the Minutes. The recording secretary may be directed by the presiding officer to enter in the Minutes a synopsis of the discussion on any question coming before the Council.

#### SECTION 10. ORDER OF PRECEDENCE OF MOTIONS

The order of procedure of motions is set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and fully incorporated by reference.

#### **SECTION 11. MOTION TO RECONSIDER**

A motion to reconsider any action taken by the Council may be made at any time prior to adjournment of the same meeting at which such action was taken. The motion can only be made by a member who voted with the prevailing side and can be seconded by any member.

#### **SECTION 12. OBTAINING THE FLOOR**

Every person desiring to speak shall address the presiding officer, and when recognized by the presiding officer, shall address only the item under consideration.

For Regular City Council Meetings, in the debate, each member of Council has the right to speak twice on the same item on the same day, but cannot make a second speech on the same item as long as any member who has not spoken on that question desires the floor. No one can speak longer than ten minutes at a time without permission of a majority of Council. The City Clerk will keep time and will notify the Mayor if a Representative reaches the allotted time.

During Work Sessions, Special meetings, or Agenda Review meetings, there will not be a limit to the time allowed for each Representative to have the floor, and the Presiding officer has discretion to end discussion on an item, or to give the floor to another representative.

#### SECTION 13. RIGHT OF CITIZENS TO BE HEARD

Public Hearings/Agenda Items:

Any member of the public shall have a reasonable opportunity to be heard at all public hearings of the City Council in regard to any and all matters to be considered at such hearings that are germane and relative to any subject matter of City affairs or business which is within the scope of the authority and legislative functions of the City Council. Provided, however, that the time allowed for each citizen's appearance before City Council will be limited to a fixed number of minutes at the discretion of the presiding officer. Members of the public will usually be granted three (3) minutes to present their position on issues. If a member of the public addresses City Council through a translator into English, he or she will be granted six (6) minutes to present. Time will be kept by the City Clerk. The presiding officer may grant a speaker additional time at his or her discretion.

#### Public Comment/Non Agenda Items:

A maximum of sixty (60) minutes will be allotted for a public comment portion of each regular City Council meeting. The City Council will designate time to allow members of the public to have a reasonable opportunity to provide comment on items not already posted on the agenda, except that no person shall engage in political advertising contrary to state law. Persons wishing to provide comment during the public comment portion of the City Council agenda must sign up prior to 9:00 a.m. on the day of the City Council meeting either online or by using the sign-in sheet for the public outside of Council Chambers on the day of the Council meeting up until 9:00 a.m. Any person signing

up to provide comment during the public comment portion of the agenda must provide their name, address, phone number, and a short description of the topic(s) of their comment. Members of the public are required to speak on the topic identified upon the sign-in sheet. If the speaker is a lobbyist, he or she must indicate that fact on the audience participation sheet and prior to commencing his/her comments in compliance with the City's Lobbying Ordinance. Members of the public may not grant their time to another nor may they purport to speak for another who is not present at the meeting. If someone would like a document or letter to become a part of the record, they may do so by providing the City Clerk with copies of the document or letter no later than 9:00 a.m. on the morning of the meeting, which will be distributed to the Council. It shall not be necessary to read the letter into the record. Interpretation services are only to be provided by the certified interpreter provided by the City.

A document camera and projection system ("Overhead Projector") is available for use for public comment on posted items and call to the public. Members of the public shall submit any document they wish to present on the Overhead Projector to the City Clerk no later than close of business on the previous City business day before the meeting date. Any document that contains insulting, profane, threatening or abusive language, nudity, or campaign material will be rejected. City Staff will assist members of the public in using the Overhead Projector during the meeting. In order to ensure cyber security, members of the public are prohibited from sending or utilizing presentations in any electronic format, including but not limited to email, and from using a Universal Serial Bus (USB) compact disk (CD) or digital versatile disk (DVD) for public comment and call to the public. A member of the public who wishes to make an electronic presentation may bring printed documents to the City Clerk's office no later than close of business on the previous City business day before the meeting date to be scanned for presentation during the meeting.

To facilitate the receiving of comment from as many citizens as possible who are interested in bringing topics forward to the City Council for comment, a person may sign up to obtain one-time slot to speak or otherwise make a presentation on one or more specified topics during the public comment portion of a City Council meeting. This provision does not restrict any member of the public from signing up to speak on items posted on the regular agenda or to ask questions regarding items posted on the consent agenda.

The time allotted for the public comment portion of the agenda shall be uniformly divided among those who have signed up to obtain a time slot and participate and except as provided below, no speaker will have more than three (3) minutes to speak or otherwise make a presentation, regardless of the number of topics a speaker wishes to address within his or her time slot. At the beginning of the public comment portion of the agenda, the City Clerk will make one announcement as to the amount of time that each person has to provide comment. The City Clerk will call each person signed up to make comment to the podium in the order that they signed up to speak and will keep time. Each topic brought forward will be for comment from the speaker and may not be deliberated by the members of Council nor rebutted or debated by members of the public. Any member of the City Council may propose that the topic commented on be posted by staff on a future Council meeting agenda for the Council's discussion and action.

The presiding officer at his or her discretion may grant a speaker one (1) additional minute to wrap up his or her comments regardless of whether the allotted sixty (60) minutes will otherwise be taken up by the others making comment.

Members of the public wishing to ask a question regarding an item posted on the consent agenda or to speak regarding an item posted on the regular agenda must sign up prior to 9:00 a.m. on the day of the City Council meeting. The City Clerk shall make available the sign-in sheet for the public outside of Council Chambers on the day of the Council meeting up until 9:00 a.m. or online prior to 9:00 a.m. Persons may sign up to address multiple items, however this does not mean it is permissible to "mark all" or to sign up for every item "just in case" they wish to speak when the discussion on an item takes place. If a member of the public wishes to speak regarding an item, but did not sign up by 9:00 am, he or she may notify the City Clerk at any time prior to the call to vote on the item.

Members of the public who do not desire to speak but want to register support or opposition to an item on the agenda may do so by indicating their position on the audience participation form. The City Clerk will notify the Council of the number of position statements received and the tally when the agenda item is announced.

At the time that the consent agenda is taken up for consideration, the City Clerk shall advise the Mayor Pro Tempore whether persons in the audience have signed up to ask a question regarding an item posted on the consent agenda. The Mayor Pro Tempore shall have the floor and may ask the City Clerk to call those individuals up to the podium to hear their questions. At that time, the City Clerk will announce the agenda item number and call the person to the podium. The Mayor Pro Tempore may request the City Manager to respond to the questions raised by the members of the public. In his or her discretion, the Mayor Pro Tem may move the consent agenda item to the regular agenda for continued discussion and action by the City Council.

Members of Council may move to overrule the determinations by the Mayor Pro Tempore under this section by a simple majority vote of the Council members present and voting.

No person may speak a second time except by permission of the presiding officer, and further, no person shall be heard a second time until all persons desiring to speak once have been given the opportunity to do so.

Personal attacks are not permitted. Members of the public should address their questions to the Council, not to the staff. Council may in turn ask staff to provide input.

Members of the public may be asked to leave or be removed from Council Chambers if it is determined that they are disruptive to the meeting. Such determination will be made by the presiding officer. Members of Council may move to overrule such determination by the presiding officer subject to a simple majority vote of Council, present and voting.

#### SECTION 14. CALLING AND ORDER OF AGENDA ITEMS

Executive Session will be scheduled at the end of the meeting or other such time as determined by the Council. The Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance will take place no sooner than 9:00 a.m. Thereafter, the proceedings will take place as specified on the Attached **Exhibit "B"**.

Items accepting or acknowledging donations to the City will be taken prior to consideration of the consent agenda. Items removed from the consent agenda by the Mayor Pro Tempore or at the request of other Council members will be considered at the time when items for the related department are being considered or as otherwise requested by the Mayor Pro Tempore. The introduction of ordinances will be considered first on the regular agenda, followed by the procurement items posted on the regular agenda by the Financial Services and/or Engineering and Construction Management departments, and any reports or updates from the City's Committees, Boards and Commissions.

Notwithstanding the above provisions, the City Manager shall direct the placement of all matters relating to the City Council's adoption of the annual City budget and associated matters relating to the start of each new fiscal year and the adoption of the tax levy on one or more agendas so as to meet all required statutory and charter deadlines.

At the time that each agenda item is to be considered by the City Council, the City Clerk will announce all agenda items by number and a brief statement as to the nature of the item when appropriate. In the case of a revision, the City Clerk or staff shall read the item into the record, as appropriate.

#### **SECTION 15. PARLIAMENTARIAN**

The City Clerk and the Assistant City Clerk are confirmed to serve as Parliamentarian and Alternate Parliamentarian, respectively.

#### SECTION 16. USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Electronic devices within Council chambers shall be used in accordance with all established City practices and procedures and as directed by Information Technology Department staff providing support services during a meeting. City staff, other than the dignitary protection officers, and members of the public shall turn off the signals of all pagers, cellular telephones and other devices capable of making an audible signal and shall not make or take any telephone calls while in Council chambers once a Council meeting has been called to order.

Members of the City Council shall not use any electronic devices other than the desk top computers provided by the City of El Paso located at their seats during any City Council meeting or City Council work sessions. The use of communication devices of any kind, including but not limited to: hand-held portable communication devices, cellphones, computers, tablets, laptops, watches, etc. is expressly prohibited during City Council meetings and shall not be allowed in the room during closed sessions unless they are being used to aid in executive session presentations.

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The use of the desktop computers during City Council shall be limited to voting, viewing presentations, research to aid the council member and communication via email to staff. During meetings, City Council members shall not text, tweet, blog, post on Facebook, Instagram or use any other social media platform.

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The Mayor and Council may by action of Council approved by a majority of Council, reschedule the time and place of any City Council meeting in accordance with the requirements of the Texas Open Meetings Act.

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Each participant's face in the videoconference call, while speaking, must be clearly visible and audible to each other participant and, during the open portion of the meeting, to the members of the public in attendance at the location where a quorum is present, and at any other location of the meeting that is open to the public. Any council member appearing by videoconference call will be considered absent during any portion of the meeting the audio or video is lost or disconnected in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 551.127.

#### RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE RULES OF ORDER FOR THE EL PASO CITY COUNCIL REVISED, AS EFFECTIVE JANUARY 3, 2023

#### **SECTION 1. PURPOSE OF RESOLUTION**

This Resolution is adopted pursuant to Section 3.5.B of the Charter of the City of El Paso as a procedural guide for the benefit of the City Council and for the general information of the public. These rules shall apply to regular, special and work session meetings at which action is to be taken, but shall not apply to meetings for committees of the City Council or to informational gatherings of the Council.

#### **SECTION 2. RULES OF ORDER**

Robert's Rules of Order Revised shall govern the procedures of Council unless they are in conflict with these rules.

#### SECTION 3. EFFECT OF FAILURE TO FOLLOW THESE RULES

No action of the Council that is otherwise legal shall be invalidated merely by reason of the failure of the Council or City staff to follow these Rules of Order, unless the majority of the Council agrees that such action shall be invalidated.

#### **SECTION 4. STANDING**

No one other than a member of the City Council shall have standing to assert before the Council that any action taken by the Council is invalid by reason of the Council's failure to comply with these Rules of Order.

#### **SECTION 5. SUSPENSION OF RULES**

These rules may be suspended temporarily by a majority of the Council members present and voting, except as they pertain to a quorum, or to the majority required for any motion, or to other matters pre-empted by laws other than those Rules of Order.

#### **SECTION 6. PRESIDING OFFICER**

The Mayor shall preside at all meetings of the City Council, but if for any reason he is absent from the City, sick or unable to act, then the Mayor Pro Tempore shall preside at such meetings and at such times shall exercise all of the powers and discharge the duties of the Mayor, except that the Mayor Pro Tempore shall vote as a Representative. In the absence or inability of both the Mayor and the Mayor Pro Tempore, the Alternate Mayor Pro Tempore shall preside and shall vote as a Representative. Upon the arrival of the Mayor, the Mayor Pro Tempore or the Alternate Mayor Pro Tempore, the acting chairman shall immediately relinquish the chair upon the conclusion of the business immediately pending before the Council.

The presiding officer shall preserve strict order and decorum at all regular and special meetings of the Council, and shall state questions coming before the Council as necessary for clarity, and shall announce the decision of the Council on all subjects. The Presiding Officer shall disable the microphone at the podium when he determines that the speaker has violated council rules of order.

#### **SECTION 7. QUESTIONS OF ORDER**

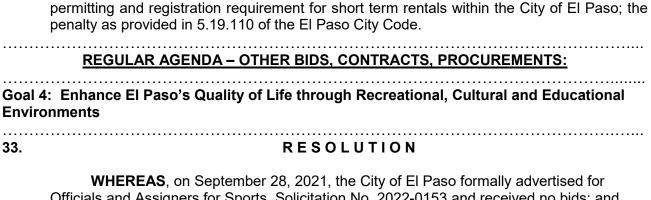

WHEREAS, the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("PUCT") is currently considering, in a utility's base rate case Docket No. 53719, whether it is appropriate for an electric utility in a vertically integrated area to own EV-charging facilities or other transportation electrification and charging infrastructure or whether the ownership of such facilities be left to competitive providers ("Entergy Case"); and

WHEREAS, EPE and the City have agreed that in the event the PUCT rules either in the Entergy Case, a rulemaking proceeding, or a rate case of another utility, that a vertically integrated utility or a transmission and distribution utility area may not own EV-charging facilities or other transportation electrification and charging infrastructure then all investments made by EPE relating to the Application shall be divested by EPE at their sole and exclusive cost and at no cost to City of El Paso ratepayers; and

WHEREAS, EPE has agreed that it will only recover the costs of establishing this program from participating customers, including but not limited to the costs of: purchasing any equipment, meters, other infrastructure, administrative and general expense or vendor fees; and

**WHEREAS**, Rate Schedule PEVC-A attached to this resolution as Attachment "A" provides a reasonable rate structure to implement a pilot program for 20 installations, and

**WHEREAS**, EPE has proposed to limit participation in this pilot program to twenty (20) locations within the City of El Paso, and that any expansion of the pilot program will be subject to approval by the City Council and without waiving any rights; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens and ratepayers to approve the Application under the terms and conditions set forth herein; and

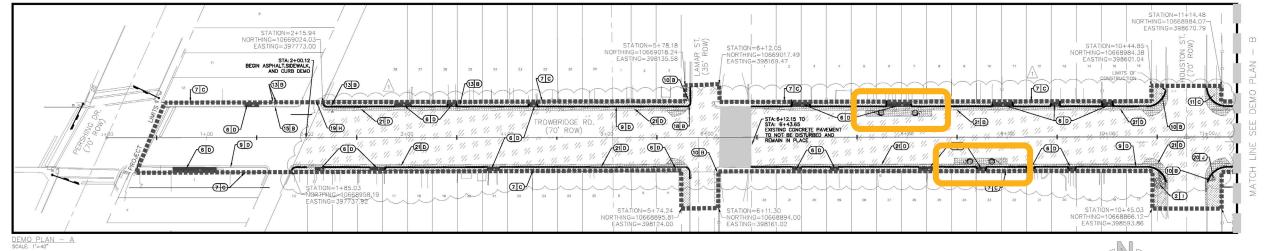

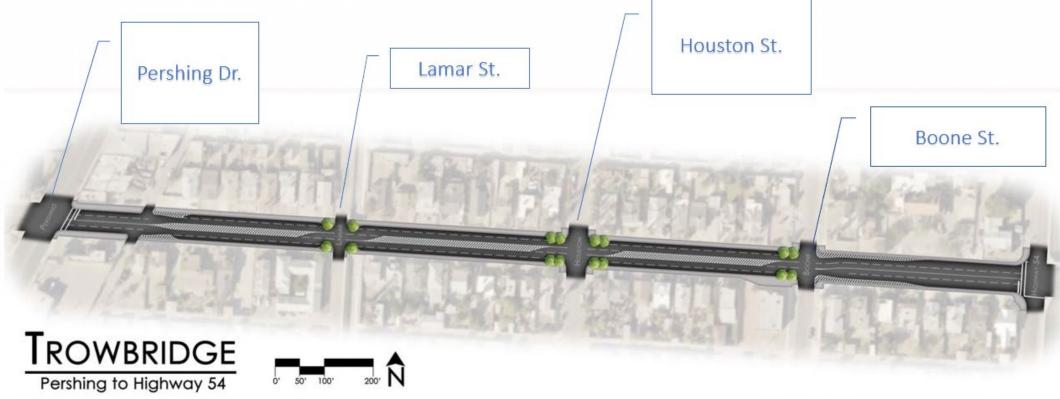

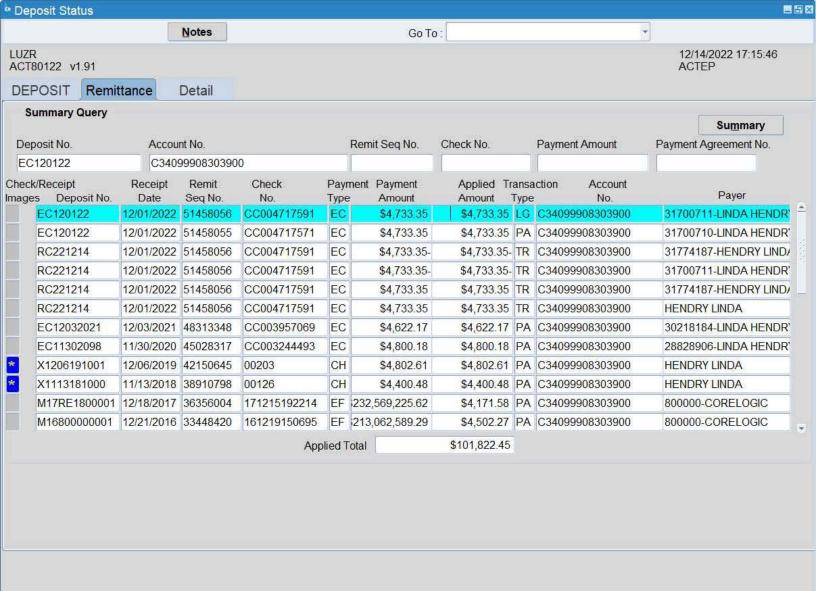

WHEREAS, the City desires to engage the Company to provide professional psychological examination services in accordance with all applicable laws and procedures; and
WHEREAS, psychological examination services are considered as professional services pursuant to Chapter 2254 of the Texas Government Code;
WHEREAS, the City selected Company to provide the professional services on the basis of Company's demonstrated competence and qualifications to perform the services for a fair and reasonable price through request for qualifications No. 2022-0545R.
WHEREAS, Company is willing and able to perform said psychological examination services for the Fire department; and
IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual promises set forth in this Agreement, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:
AGREEMENT
SECTION I. TERM. The effective date of this Agreement is
SECTION II. SCOPE OF SERVICES. The Company hereby agrees to perform the psychological

All services shall be performed with reasonable care, skill, and diligence as would be practiced by the medical and scientific community within the County of El Paso, Texas. The Services shall be conducted by a state licensed doctoral level psychologist or psychiatrist.

examination services in accordance with the scope of work and attached herein as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference on an as needed basis. The scope of services shall be referred to collectively as "Services." The Services shall include, but are not limited to, pre-employment, reinstatement psychological exams and new relicensing requirement psychological exams for the Fire

department.

SECTION III. COMPLETION OF SERVICES. The Service Provider understands that time is of the essence in completing the Services. Results of the psychological examination shall be reported to the Departmental Human Resources Manager, within two (2) business days upon completion of the examination date and shall not be disclosed to the examinee at the time of examination. Provider expressly understands and agrees that all results from the tests to be performed by the Provider under the terms and conditions of this contract shall at all times remain strictly confidential.

**SECTION IV. NON-EXCLUSIVE AGREEMENT.** This Agreement is non-exclusive. The City shall be entitled to enter into other agreements for the Services with other properly selected individuals or businesses that qualify to provide the Services.

**SECTION V. PRE-REQUISITE TO AGREEMENT.** The Service Provider shall comply with applicable state and local licenses, certifications, and other qualification requirements as a prerequisite to entering into this Agreement.

**SECTION VI. LOCATION OF PERFORMANCE**. The Company shall perform the Services in the City and County of El Paso, Texas or such other place(s) as may be necessary to fulfill the terms of this Agreement.

**SECTION VII. REPRESENTATIONS OF THE COMPANY.** The Company represents, warrants, and agrees as follows:

- A. It will comply with all applicable federal, state and local governmental laws, rules, regulations and all provisions of the City of El Paso Charter and the El Paso City Code, now existing or as may be amended, in the performance of its duties under this Agreement.
- B. It shall obtain and pay for all licenses, permits and certificates required by any applicable statue, ordinance, rule or regulation of any regulatory body having jurisdiction over the conduct of its operations hereunder. The Company warrants that it is duly authorized and licensed to perform its duties hereunder in each jurisdiction in which it will act. It further warrants that its employees, agents and subcontractors shall maintain all required profession licenses during the term of this Agreement. If the Company receives notice from a licensing authority of a suspension or revocation of a license of the Company's employee(s), agent(s) or subcontractor(s), the Company shall immediately remove such employee, agent or subcontractor from performing any further services under this Agreement until such license is reinstated and in good standing. If the Company fails to maintain such licenses or fails to remove any employee, agent or subcontractor who performs services under this Agreement whose license has expired or been revoked or suspended, the City shall be entitled, in its sole discretion, to immediately terminate this Agreement upon written notice to the Company.
- C. It warrants that no person or selling agency has been employed or retained to solicit or secure this Agreement upon an agreement or understanding for commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee excepting bona fide employees of bona

fide established commercial or selling agencies maintained by the Company for the purpose of securing business. For breach or violation of this warranty, the City shall have the right in addition to any other right or rights to cancel this Agreement without liability and to deduct from the Agreement price, or otherwise recover the full amount of such commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee.

**SECTION VIII. COMPENSATION AND METHOD OF PAYMENT.** The City shall pay the Service Provider for each psychological examination at the rates set forth in the *Proposal Cost* attached hereto as *Exhibit B*. The Service Provider services shall be limited to those services delineated in the Section III of this Agreement.

It is understood and agreed that the City shall not be liable for any costs that exceed the amount of this Agreement without the prior written approval of the City Manager and compliance with applicable competitive bidding laws and City policies. Said approval must be obtained prior to the Service Provider commencing the services that will result in the cost overrun.

The parties acknowledge and agree that the award of this Agreement is dependent upon the availability of funding. In the event that funds do not become available, the Agreement may be terminated, with a 30-day written notice to the Service Provider by the City. In such an event, the City shall incur no penalty or charge.

The Service Provider shall submit a monthly invoice to the Fire Human Resources Division for each month in which Services are performed pursuant to this Agreement. Invoices shall not be submitted more frequently than once per month. All invoices, including late fee interest, shall be paid in accordance to Texas Government Code Chapter 2251. Applicants and employees in receipt of the Services shall not be invoiced for the Services.

SECTION IX. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR RELATIONSHIP. Nothing herein shall be construed as creating a relationship of employer and employee between the parties hereto. The Service Provider agrees to be responsible for its own acts and omissions and those of its subordinates and employees in the performance of any material services under this Agreement. The Service Provider is an independent Service Provider and nothing contained herein shall constitute or designate the Service Provider or any of his employees as employees of the City. Neither the Service Provider nor his employees shall be entitled to any of the benefits established for City employees, nor be covered by the City's Workers' Compensation Program.

SECTION X. MEDICAL RECORDS AND CONFIDENTIALITY OF RECORDS The Service Provider recognizes that all information and materials received in connection with this Agreement shall be kept in the strictest confidence. All examination records shall be City property for the life of this Agreement. The Service Provider shall keep the records for the life of this Agreement and shall follow the regulations according to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and all subsequent amendments. The Service Provider shall follow the Business Associate Agreement which attached hereto and incorporated to this Agreement through *Exhibit C*. Upon termination of this Agreement all records shall be transferred to the City within ten (10) business days of termination at the City's sole expense of such transfer.

**SECTION XI. INSPECTIONS & AUDITS**. The City shall have the right to perform, or cause to be performed: (1) audits of the books and records of the Company; and (2) inspections of all places where work is undertaken in connection with this Agreement. The Company shall be required to keep such books and records available for such purpose for at least five (5) years after its performance under this Agreement ceases. Nothing in this provision shall affect the time for bringing a cause of action nor the applicable statute of limitations.

**SECTION XII. OWNERSHIP**. All files and documents generated by Company as a result of its activity under this Agreement shall remain at all times the property of the City.

**SECTION XIII. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS.** With no intent to limit the Company's liability or the indemnification provisions set forth hereinafter, the Company shall provide and maintain the following insurance in full force and effect at all times during the term of this Agreement and any extensions thereto. The City shall be provided with certificates of insurance evidencing the required insurance prior to the Effective Date of this Agreement and thereafter with certificates evidencing renewal or replacement of said policies of insurance at least fifteen (15) days prior to the expiration or cancellation of any such policies.

### A. INSURANCES

- 1. Worker's Compensation. A third-party policy of Workers' Compensation insurance coverage providing Statutory Benefits according to the Workers Compensation Act of the State of Texas and/or any other state or federal law as may be applicable to the work and shall cover all of the persons engaged in the work.
- 2. Commercial Liability, Property Damage Liability and Vehicle Liability Insurance. The Company shall procure and shall maintain during the life of this Agreement such Commercial General Liability, Property Damage Liability and Vehicle Liability Insurance as shall protect the Company and the Company's employees performing work covered by this Agreement from claims for damages for personal injury, including accidental death, as well as from claims for property damages, which may arise from services performed under this Agreement, whether such services be performed by the Company or by anyone directly employed by the Company. The minimum limits of liability and coverage shall be as follows:
- a) Commercial General Liability
  Personal Injury or Death
  \$1,000,000 for each person
  \$1,000,000 in the aggregate

Property Damage \$1,000,000 for each occurrence \$1,000,000 in the aggregate

b) Vehicle Liability
Combined Single Limit
\$1,000,000 per accident

- **B.** ERRORS AND OMISSIONS LIABILITY INSURANCE. The Company shall procure and maintain, at the Company's sole expense, Professional Liability Insurance (Such as errors and omissions insurance) for the benefit of the City to cover the errors and omissions of the Company, its principals or officers, agents or employees in the performance of this Agreement with a limit of ONE MILLION AND 00/100 DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) on a claims made basis.
- C. FORM OF POLICIES. The insurance required herein may be in one or more policies of insurance, the form of which must be approved by the City's Risk Manager.
- **D. ISSUERS OF POLICIES.** The issuer of any policy must have a certificate of authority to transact insurance business in the State of Texas. Each issuer must be responsible, reputable, and have financial capability consistent with the risks covered. Each issuer shall be subject to approval by the City's Risk Manager in his sole discretion as to conformance with these requirements.
- **E.** INSURED PARTIES. Each policy, except those for Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability, must name the City of El Paso (and their elected and appointed officials, officers, agents and employees) as Additional Insured parties on the original policy and all renewals or replacements during the term of this Agreement.
- F. MATERIAL CHANGE IN POLICY(IES). Prior to any material change in any policy required herein, the City will be given sixty (60) days advance written notice by registered mail. Further, the City will be immediately notified of any reduction or possible reduction in aggregate limits of any such policy where such reduction, when added to any previous reductions, would exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the aggregate limits.
- H. CANCELLATION. Each policy must expressly state that it may not be canceled or non-renewed unless sixty (60) days advance notice of cancellation or intent not to renew is given in writing to the City's Purchasing Director by the insurance company. The Company shall also give written notice to the City's Purchasing Director within fifteen (15) days of the date upon which total claims by any party against the Company reduce the aggregate amount of coverage below the amounts required by this Agreement.
- I. DELIVERY OF POLICIES. The originals of all policies referred to above, or copies thereof certified by the agent or attorney-in-fact issuing them together with written proof that the premiums have been paid, shall be deposited by the Company with the City's Purchasing Director prior to beginning work under this Agreement, and thereafter before the beginning of each subsequent year of the term of this Agreement. Notices and Certificates required by this clause shall be provided to:

Notwithstanding the termination notice provisions in this Agreement, the failure of the Company to provide the City's Purchasing Director with the above proof of insurance prior to beginning work and

thereafter prior to the beginning of each year of the term of this Agreement, shall constitute a default on the part of the Company entitling the City, upon three (3) days written notice to the Company to terminate this Agreement. This default provision shall also apply to the proof of insurance requirements under circumstances where a policy is canceled or expires during a given year of the Agreement. Notwithstanding the proof of insurance requirements set forth above, it is the intention of the parties hereto that the Company, throughout the term of this Agreement, continuously and without interruption, maintain in force the required insurance coverage set forth above. Failure of the Company to comply with this requirement shall constitute a default of the Company allowing the City, at its option, to terminate this Agreement as referenced above.

SECTION XV. INDEMNIFICATION. The Company or its insurer shall indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the City, its elected officials, agents, employees, officers, directors and representatives of the City, individually or collective, from and against any and all costs, claims, liens, damages, losses, expenses, fees, fines, penalties, proceedings, actions, demands, causes of action, liability and suits of any kind and nature, including but not limited to, personal injury or death of property damage, made upon the City directly arising out of, resulting from or related to the Company's activities under this Agreement for Third Party Claims Administration and Medical Cost Containment, including any act or omission by the Company, its agents, employees or subcontractors while in the exercise of performance of the rights or duties under this Agreement, all, without however, waiving and governmental immunity available to the City. The provisions of this indemnification are solely for the benefit of the parties hereto and not intended to create or grant any rights, contractual or otherwise, to any person or entity. Without modifying the conditions of preserving, asserting, or enforcing any legal liability against the City as required by the City Charter or any law, the City will promptly forward to the Company every demand, notice, summons or other process received by the City in any claim or legal proceeding contemplated herein. In addition, the Company shall promptly advise the City in writing of any claim or demand against the City or the Company known to the Company related to or arising out of the Company's activities under this Agreement. The Company will: 1) investigate or cause the investigation of accidents or occurrences involving such injuries or damages; 2) negotiate or cause to be negotiated the claim as the Company may deem expedient; and 3) defend or cause to be defended on behalf of the City all suits for damages even if groundless, false or fraudulent, brought because of such injuries or damages. The Company will pay all judgments finally establishing liability of the City in actions defended by the Company pursuant to this section along with all attorneys' fees and costs incurred by the City including interest accruing to the date of payment by the Company, and premiums on any appeal bonds. The City, at its election will have the right to participate in any such negotiations or legal proceedings to the extent of its interest without relieving Company of any of its obligations under this paragraph. The City will not be responsible for any loss of or damage to the Company's property from any cause.

**SECTION XIV. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT**. This Agreement may be terminated under any one of the following circumstances:

A. TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE: This Agreement may be terminated by City for convenience upon written notice, provided such notice specifies an effective date for cancellation of

not less than thirty (30) calendar days from the date such notice is received. It is also understood and agreed that upon such notice of termination, the Company shall cease all services under this Agreement. Upon such termination, the Company shall provide a final invoice for all work completed prior to the City's notice of termination. The City shall compensate the Company in accordance with this Agreement; however, the City may withhold any payment to the Company for the purpose of set off until such time as the exact amount of damages due the City from the Company is determined. Nothing contained herein, or elsewhere in this Agreement, shall require the City to pay for any work which is unsatisfactory, incomplete or not in compliance with the terms of this Agreement and its attachments.

**B. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT:** It is further understood and agreed by the Company and the City that either party may terminate this Agreement for cause. Such a termination may be made for failure of one party to substantially fulfill its contractual obligations, pursuant to this Agreement, and through no fault of the other party. No such termination shall be made, unless the other party being terminated is granted: a) written notice of intent to terminate after thirty (30) consecutive calendar days, enumerating the failures for which the termination is being sought; b) a minimum of fifteen (15) consecutive calendar days to cure such failures; and c) an opportunity for consultation with the terminating party prior to such termination.

However, the City retains the right to immediately terminate this Agreement for default if the Company fails to maintain its licenses, certifications and other standards required to be a qualified Company pursuant and the laws of the State of Texas or violates any local, state or federal laws. In the event of termination by the City pursuant to this subsection, the City may withhold payments to the Company for the purpose of set off until such time as the exact amount of damages due the City from the Company is determined.

#### SECTION XV. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- A. TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE. The Company understands and agrees that time is of the essence for all services and deliverables requested herein and that all tasks of this Agreement are to be completed as expeditiously as possible.
- **B.** ADVERTISING. Neither party will advertise or publish, without the other party's consent, the fact that the City has entered into this contract, except to comply with proper requests for information from an authorized representative of the federal, state, or local government.
- C. SUCCESSOR AND ASSIGNS. The Company shall not assign or attempt to convey an interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the City. This Agreement shall be terminable, at the discretion of the City, without notice to the Company if the Company shall attempt to assign without prior written consent.
- **D. VENUE.** For purpose of determining place of Agreement and the law governing the same, this Agreement is entered into in the City and County of El Paso, the State of Texas, and shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. Venue shall be in the County of El Paso, Texas.

- E. LEGAL CONSTRUCTION. Every provision of this Agreement is severable, and if any term or provision hereof is illegal or invalid for any reason whatsoever, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement. Where the context of the Agreement require, the singular shall include the plural and the masculine gender shall include feminine. Any reference to the City Manager in this Agreement shall mean the City Manager of the City of El Paso or his designee.
- F. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW. The Company shall comply with all Federal, State and local laws and ordinances applicable to the work contemplated herein.
- **G. NOTICE.** Any notice, demand, request, consent or approval that either party may or is required to provide to the other party be in writing and either personally delivered or sent via certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, to the following addresses:

- H. FORCE MAJEURE. The Company shall not be responsible or liable for any loss, damages or delay caused by force majeure which is beyond the control of the parties to this Agreement, including but not limited to riot, insurrection, embargo, fire or explosion, the elements, acts of nature, epidemic, war, earthquake, flood or the official act of any government.
- I. COMPLETE AGREEMENT. This Agreement constitutes and expresses the entire agreement between the parties hereto in reference to the services described in this Agreement for the City, and in reference to any of the matters or things herein provided for, or hereinbefore discussed or mentioned in reference to such services, all promises, representations and understanding relative thereto herein being merged.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the parties hereto have executed this Agreement in El Paso, Texas effective as of the first date appearing heretofore.

#### SCOPE OF WORK

#### Scope of Work and Minimum Requirements

#### PSYCHOLOGICAL EXAMINATIONS

#### Scope of Services and Method of Compensation

- A. Provider will perform pre-employment psychological examinations (PEPE) on all candidates offered a conditional job offer, individuals being considered for reinstatement (as applicable), and candidates offered a conditional job offer for the Fire Communications Department (as applicable). Requests for exam appointments must be accommodated within fourteen (14) days of original request.
- B. The pre-employment psychological examination for Communications applicants must be sufficient to determine if the individual is in satisfactory psychological and emotional health to perform the duties, accept the responsibilities and meet the qualifications established by the El Paso Fire Department's job description (Attachment A).
- C. All psychological examinations for the El Paso Fire Department shall include:
  - a. In preparation for the clinical interview, review relevant background information which may include (but is not limited to) the duties, powers, working conditions, incidences, indiscretions, as well as other analytic information relevant to current or intended position.
  - b. Administer, supervise, and collect written test battery, which is to include an objective and job-related psychological assessment, consistent with established test administration standards. At least two instruments must be used: one which measures personality traits and one which measures psychopathology (example: MMPI-2 for FFDE, MMPI-2 and PAI for PEPE).
  - c. Retain responsibility to verify and interpret all written psychological test results in accordance with the publisher's recommendations.
  - d. A semi-structured, individual, face-to-face, clinical interview which allows sufficient time (30-minute minimum) to cover appropriate background, test results and clinical assessment.
  - e. Follow-up, referral, and/or collateral interviews with relevant third parties, if deemed necessary by the psychologist, EPFD.

Respondent should specify method and equipment to be used for written test battery and state qualifications of technicians who will administer tests. Additionally, the Respondent must guarantee that the test is administered as recommended by the manufacturer.

- D. Service Provider shall conduct evaluations, as necessary, through a counselor who is Board Certified and licensed by the State of Texas.
- E. The licensed physician conducting the pre-employment examination shall complete a L3 examination form (Attachment B) as provided by the City on each individual who passes for Fire Department, and return this form to the El Paso Fire Department's Departmental Human Resources Manager. For those individuals who do not pass, a written notice shall be submitted to the El Paso Fire Department's Departmental Human Resources Manager.

- F. Provider shall return all results of the psychological evaluation, as specified above, to the Departmental Human Resources Manager within 2 (two) business days upon completion of the examination.
- G. City shall not pay for any additional testing conducted without City's prior authorization.
- H. To uphold ethical standards of practice, the Provider will:
  - Adhere to ethical principles and standards of psychological practice, throughout the totality of services with El Paso Fire Department.
  - 2. Maintain their duty to all parties in being fair, impartial, accurate and objective, along with honoring the parties' respective legal rights and interests.
  - Make provisions for the security and confidentiality of all testing materials including materials that
    may be presented electronically. Provisions should also be made for the security of, access to
    psychological reports and raw data, including information stored or transmitted electronically.

Ensure informed consent by providing the examinee with:

- 1. An explanation of the nature and scope of the evaluation,
- 2. The limits of confidentiality, including any information, that may be disclosed to the employer without the examinee's authorization.
- 3. The party or parties who will receive the PEPE or FFDE report, and whether examinee will receive a report,
- Other provisions consistent with legal and ethical standards for mental health evaluations conducted at the request of third parties.

Respondent shall maintain familiarity with employment law impacting the conduct of the PEPE's and FFDE's including but not limited to the American with Disabilities Act (ADA), along with other Federal, State, and Local laws applicable to employment practices.

I. All results of psychological exams, as specified above, must be returned to the Departmental Human Resources Manager, within two (2) business days upon completion of the examination date and shall not be disclosed to the examinee at the time of examination. Provider expressly understands and agrees that all results from the tests to be performed by the Provider under the terms and conditions of this contract shall at all times remain strictly confidential.

#### II. GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. Form to be completed and signed by physician include Attachments B as applicable.
- B. Each applicant shall provide Provider with a waiver permitting Provider to disclose to the Departmental Human Resources Manager or her designee the results of such tests as must be as administered to such applicant under the terms and conditions of this contract.
- C. Provider shall perform all duties as specified under this contract with such reasonable care, skill and diligence as would be practiced by the medical and scientific community, as applicable, within the county of El Paso, Texas.

- D. The City will be obligated to honor a demand for payment for services rendered by the Provider under the terms of this contract only if such demand for payment is made by the Provider, and only if such demand for payment conforms to the rates for compensation as per award.
- E. Provider shall ensure applicants and/or employees that undergo physical exams and drug screening are not in advertently billed for said exams.
- F. Provider shall perform services as per specifications and only as specified by the terms and conditions in this contract, for up to and including twenty-five (25) individuals per week upon reasonable notice from the City and send the results to the Departmental Human Resources Manager within two (2) days of the date of examination.
- G. At the termination of the contract, all medical records produced or obtained as a product of the contract will be forwarded to the City or such other place as the City may designate. All records will be forwarded within twenty-four (24) hours of contract termination.

#### III. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- A. The offeror must specify the names and qualifications of all physicians who will be performing the examinations. Any additional doctors must be submitted to the City for approval prior to performing the examinations. The City will not pay for any psychological exams performed by physicians who do not have City approval.
- B. The Provider must be certified by a State, doctoral Level (PhD, PsyD) psychologist or psychiatrist, with expertise in clinical psychological assessment and testing, along with personnel evaluation using measures of normal personality characteristics, skills, and abilities. Relevant experience and training in psychological evaluations for public safety is required. Provider will provide the EPFD a copy of their documented education, training, and experience in the form of a curriculum vitae (CV).
- C. The offeror must specify how psychologists/psychiatrists will be kept fully informed of the City's standards, procedures and requirements and of any subsequent changes. Additionally, specify how doctors, if more than one, will consistently apply and interpret the City's requirements.

Should the offeror need to outsource any portion of the examinations, the bidder must first obtain City approval and ensure there is no additional cost or hardship to the City.

#### IV. INVOICING

- a. The Provider shall submit monthly invoices, in single copy, on each contract, within 15 days after the end of the billing cycle, to the El Paso Fire Human Resources Division; Attention: Monica Ontiveros. Invoices covering more than one contract will not be accepted.
- b. Invoices shall be itemized and transportation charges, if any, shall be listed separately.
- c. Invoices shall reflect the Contract Number and Purchase Order Number.
- d. Provider shall designate a contact person to address billing issues.
- e. The Contact person will respond to billing issues within twenty-four (24) hours, and shall have the authority to respond by taking corrective action or making necessary adjustments, if needed.
- f. Do not include federal, state, or City sales tax. City shall furnish tax exemption certificate if requested.
- g. Discounts will be taken from the date of receipt of services or date or invoice, whichever is later.

- h. The City's obligation is payable only and solely from funds available for the purpose of this service. Lack of funds shall render this contract null and void to the extent funds are not available and any delivered but unpaid for goods will be returned to the Provider by the City.
- i. Provider shall advise the City of any changes in its remittance addresses.

WHEREAS, CITY possesses individually identifiable health information that is defined in and protected under HIPAA, and is permitted to use or disclose such information only in accordance with HIPAA;

WHEREAS, BUSINESS ASSOCIATE may receive such information from CITY, or create and receive such information on behalf of CITY, in order to perform certain of the services or provide certain of the goods, or both; and

WHEREAS, CITY wishes to ensure that BUSINESS ASSOCIATE will appropriately safeguard individually identifiable health information;

NOW THEREFORE, CITY and BUSINESS ASSOCIATE agree as follows:

#### A. HIPAA Terms

- c. HHS Privacy Regulations shall mean the Code of Federal Regulations ("C.F.R.") at Title 45, Sections 160 and 164, in effect, or as amended.
- d. **Individual** shall mean the person who is the subject of the Information, and has the same meaning as the term "individual" is defined in 45 C.F.R. 164,501.
- e. **Information** shall mean any "health information" provided and/or made available by the CITY to BUSINESS ASSOCIATE, and has the same meaning as the term "health information" as defined by 45 C.F.R. 160.102.
- f. Parties shall mean the CITY and BUSINESS ASSOCIATE.
- g. Secretary shall mean the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services ("HHS") and any other officer or employee of HHS to whom the authority involved has been delegated.
- h. **Catch-all definition:** The following terms used in this Agreement shall have the same meaning as those terms in the HIPAA Privacy, Security, Breach Notification and Enforcement Rules at 45 C.F.R. Part 160 and 164, in effect, or as amended: breach, data aggregation, designated record set, disclosure, health care operations, protected health information, required by law, subcontractor, and use.
- Limits on Use and Disclosure Established by Terms of Agreement.
  BUSINESS ASSOCIATE hereby agrees that it shall be prohibited from
  using or disclosing the Information provided or made available by the CITY
  for any other purpose other than as expressly permitted or required by this
  Agreement (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(i).)
- 3. Stated Purposes for which BUSINESS ASSOCIATE May Use or Disclose Information. The Parties hereby agree that BUSINESS ASSOCIATE shall be permitted to use and/or disclose Information provided or made available from CITY for the following stated purposes: To provide <u>public health, research, and related support services (service)</u> to the community of the CITY for the mutual benefit and general welfare of BUSINESS ASSOCIATE and the CITY (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(i); 65 Fed. Reg. 82505.)
- Use of Information for Management, Administrative and Legal Responsibilities. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE is permitted to use Information if necessary for the proper management and administration of BUSINESS

- ASSOCIATE or to carry out legal responsibilities of BUSINESS ASSOCIATE. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(4)(i)(A-B)).
- 5. Disclosure of Information for Management, Administration and Legal Responsibilities. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE is permitted to disclose Information received from CITY for the proper management and administration of BUSINESS ASSOCIATE or to carry out legal responsibilities of BUSINESS ASSOCIATE, provided:
  - a. The disclosure is required by law; or
  - b. The BUSINESS ASSOCIATE obtains reasonable assurances from the person to whom the information is disclosed that it will be held confidentially and used or further disclosed only as required by law or for the purposes for which it was disclosed to the person, the person will use appropriate safeguards to prevent use or disclosure of the information, and the person immediately notifies the BUSINESS ASSOCIATE of any instance of which it is aware in which the confidentiality of the information has been breached. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(4)(ii)).
- Data Aggregation Services. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE is also permitted to use or disclose Information to provide data aggregation services, as that term is defined by 45 C.F.R. 164.501, relating to the health care operations of CITY. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(i)(B)).

#### 7. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE OBLIGATIONS:

- a. Limits on Use and Further Disclosure Established by Agreement and Law. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE hereby agrees that the Information provided or made available by the CITY shall not be further used or disclosed other than as permitted or required by the Agreement or as required by federal law. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(ii)(A)).
- b. Appropriate Safeguards. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE will establish and maintain appropriate safeguards to prevent any use or disclosure of the Information, other than as provided for by this Agreement. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(ii)(B)).
- c. Reports of Improper Use or Disclosure. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE hereby agrees that it shall report to CITY within two (2) days of discovery any use or disclosure of Information not provided for or allowed by this Agreement. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(ii)(C)).

- d. Subcontractors and Agents. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE hereby agrees that any time Information is provided or made available to any subcontractors or agents, BUSINESS ASSOCIATE must enter into a subcontract with the subcontractor or agent that contains the same terms, conditions and restrictions on the use and disclosure of Information as contained in this Agreement. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(ii)(D)).
  - (i) 45 C.F.R. 164.502(e)(1)(ii) and 164.308(b)(2). In accordance with 45 C.F.R. 164.502(e)(1)(ii) and 164.308(b)(2), if applicable, BUSINESS ASSOCIATE agrees to ensure that any subcontractors that create, receive, maintain, or transmit protected health information on behalf of BUSINESS ASSOCIATE agree in writing to the same restrictions and conditions that apply through this Agreement to BUSINESS ASSOCIATE with respect to such Information.
- e. Right of Access to Information. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE hereby agrees to make available and provide a right of access to Information by an Individual. This right of access shall conform with and meet all of the requirements of Section 181.102 of the Texas Health and Safety Code, requiring that not later than the 15th business day after the date of the receipt of a written request from a person for the person's electronic health record, BUSINESS ASSOCIATE shall provide the requested record to the person in electronic form unless the person agrees to accept the record in another form, and with any further requirements of 45 C.F.R. 164.524, including substitution of the words "COVERED ENTITY" with BUSINESS ASSOCIATE where appropriate. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(ii)(E)).
- f. Correction of Health Information by Individuals. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE shall, upon receipt of notice from the CITY, amend or correct protected health information (PHI) in its possession or under its control.
- g. Amendment and Incorporation of Amendments. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE agrees to make Information available for amendment and to incorporate any amendments to Information in accordance with 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(ii)(F)).
- h. Provide Accounting. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE agrees to make Information available as required to provide an accounting of disclosures in accordance with 45 C.F.R. 164.528, including substitution of the words "COVERED ENTITY" with BUSINESS

- ASSOCIATE where appropriate. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(ii)(G)).
- i. Access to Books and Records. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE hereby agrees to make its internal practices, books, and records relating to the use or disclosure of Information received from, or created or received by BUSINESS ASSOCIATE on behalf of the CITY, available to the Secretary or the Secretary's designee for purposes of determining compliance with the HHS Privacy Regulations. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(ii)(H)).
- j. Return or Destruction of Information. At the termination of this Agreement, BUSINESS ASSOCIATE hereby agrees to adhere to Section B.3. of this Agreement. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(ii)(I)).
- k. Mitigation Procedures. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE agrees to have procedures in place for mitigating, to the maximum extent practicable, any deleterious effect from the use or disclosure of Information in a manner contrary to this Agreement or the HHS Privacy Regulations. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.530(f)).
- Sanction Procedures. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE agrees and understands that it must develop and implement a system of sanctions for any employee, subcontractor or agent who violates this Agreement of the HHS Privacy Regulations. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.530(e)(1)).
- m. Subpart E of 45 C.F.R. Part 164. To the extent BUSINESS ASSOCIATE is to carry out one or more of CITY'S obligations under Subpart E of 45 C.F.R. Part 164, BUSINESS ASSOCIATE shall comply with the requirements of Subpart E that apply to CITY in the performance of such obligation(s).
- n. Prohibition against the Sale of Protected Health Information. The BUSINESS ASSOCIATE shall comply with the requirements of Texas Health and Safety Code Sec. 181.153, and any amendments of that section.
- Notice and Authorization Required for Electronic Disclosure of PHI. The BUSINESS ASSOCIATE shall comply with the requirements of Texas Health and Safety Code Sec. 181.154, and any amendments of that section, regarding the requirement of providing notice to an Individual for whom the BUSINESS ASSOCIATE creates or receives protected health information if the Individual's PHI is subject to electronic disclosure.

- P. State Law on Medical Records Privacy. The BUSINESS ASSOCIATE shall abide by the requirements set forth in Texas Health and Safety Code Section 181.001 et. seq., and any amendments of that chapter.
- Property Rights. The Information shall be and remain the property of the CITY. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE agrees that it acquires no title or rights to the Information, including any de-identified Information, as a result of this Agreement.
- 9. Modifications. The CITY and BUSINESS ASSOCIATE agree to modify this Business Associate Agreement, in order to comply with Administrative Simplification requirements of HIPAA, as set forth in Title 45, Parts 160 and 164, (Subparts A and E the "Privacy Rule" and Subparts A and C the "Security Rule") of the Code of Federal Regulations.
- 10. Automatic Amendment. Upon the effective date of any amendment to the regulations promulgated by HHS with respect to PHI, this Business Associate Agreement shall automatically amend such that the obligations imposed on BUSINESS ASSOCIATE as a Business Associate remain in compliance with such regulations.

#### B. Term and Termination

- Term. The Term of this Agreement shall be effective as of the date this
  Agreement is executed and shall remain in effect for the same term as the
  Professional Services Agreement or shall terminate on the date covered
  entity terminates for cause as authorized in paragraph (B.2.) of this Section,
  whichever is sooner.
- Termination for Cause. Upon the CITY's knowledge of a material breach by BUSINESS ASSOCIATE, the CITY shall:
  - a. Provide an opportunity for BUSINESS ASSOCIATE to cure the breach or end the violation, and terminate if BUSINESS ASSOCIATE does not cure the breach or end the violation within the time specified by the CITY.
  - b. Immediately terminate the Business Associate Agreement if BUSINESS ASSOCIATE has breached a material term of this Business Associate Agreement and cure is not possible.
  - Notify the Secretary of HHS if termination is not possible.
- Obligations of Business Associate Upon Termination. Upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, BUSINESS ASSOCIATE, with respect

to protected health information received from CITY, or created, maintained, or received by BUSINESS ASSOCIATE on behalf of CITY, shall:

- Retain only that protected health information which is necessary for BUSINESS ASSOCIATE to continue its proper management and administration or to carry out its legal responsibilities;
- Return to CITY, or, if agreed to by CITY, destroy, the remaining protected health information that the BUSINESS ASSOCIATE still maintains in any form and BUSINESS ASSOCIATE shall certify to the CITY that the Information has been destroyed;
- c. Continue to use appropriate safeguards and comply with Subpart C of 45 CFR Part 164 with respect to electronic protected health information to prevent use or disclosure of the protected health information, other than as provided for in this Section, for as long as BUSINESS ASSOCIATE retains the protected health information;
- d. Not use or disclose the protected health information retained by BUSINESS ASSOCIATE other than for the purposes for which such protected health information was retained and subject to the same conditions set out at Section 1.e and 1.f above, which applied prior to termination; and
- e. Return to CITY or, if agreed to by CITY, destroy, the protected health information retained by BUSINESS ASSOCIATE when it is no longer needed by BUSINESS ASSOCIATE for its proper management and administration or to carry out its legal responsibilities.
- f. Survival. The obligations of BUSINESS ASSOCIATE under this Section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- C. Remedies. If CITY determines that BUSINESS ASSOCIATE has breached or violated a material term of this Agreement, CITY may, at its option, pursue any and all of the following remedies:
  - Exercise any of its rights of access and inspection under Section A.7.e. of this Agreement;
  - 2. Take any other reasonable steps that CITY, in its sole discretion, shall deem necessary to cure such breach or end such violation; and/or
  - 3. Terminate this Agreement immediately.

- 4. Injunction. CITY and BUSINESS ASSOCIATE agree that any violation of the provisions of this Agreement may cause irreparable harm to CITY. Accordingly, in addition to any other remedies available to CITY at law, in equity, or under this Agreement, in the event of any violation by BUSINESS ASSOCIATE of any of the provisions of this Agreement, or any explicit threat thereof, CITY shall be entitled to an injunction or other decree of specific performance with respect to such violation or explicit threat thereof, without any bond or other security being required and without the necessity of demonstrating actual damages. The parties' respective rights and obligations under this Section C.4. shall survive termination of the Agreement.
- 5. Indemnification. To the extent allowed and not otherwise prohibited by Texas law, BUSINESS ASSOCIATE shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend CITY from and against any and all claims, losses, liabilities, costs and other expenses resulting from, or relating to, the acts or omissions of BUSINESS ASSOCIATE in connection with the representations, duties and obligations of BUSINESS ASSOCIATE under this Agreement. The parties' respective rights and obligations under this Section 5 shall survive termination of the Agreement.

#### D. Miscellaneous

- Regulatory References. A reference in this Agreement to a HIPAA section means the section as in effect or as amended.
- 2. Amendment. CITY and BUSINESS ASSOCIATE agree that amendment of this Agreement may be required to ensure that CITY and BUSINESS ASSOCIATE comply with changes in state and federal laws and regulations relating to the privacy, security, and confidentiality of protected health information. CITY may terminate this Agreement upon 60 days written notice in the event that BUSINESS ASSOCIATE does not promptly enter into an amendment that CITY, in its sole discretion, deems sufficient to ensure that CITY will be able to comply with such laws and regulations. This Agreement may not otherwise be amended except by written agreement between the parties and signed by duly authorized representatives of both parties.
- 3. <u>Interpretation</u>. Any ambiguity in this Agreement shall be interpreted to permit compliance with HIPAA.
- 4. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice or demand required under this Agreement will be in writing; will be personally served or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, or by a recognized overnight carrier which provides proof of receipt; and will be sent to the addresses below. Either

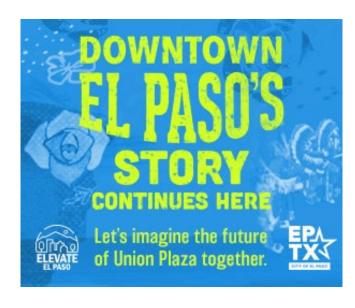

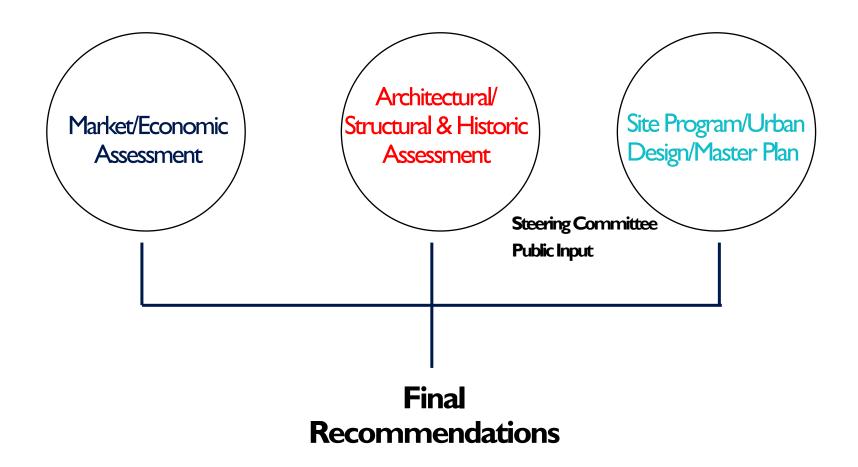

### The Vision

This district should breathe new life into downtown drawing people from all different walks of life to performances, green spaces and food options in the district. At the heart of the district is a multipurpose venue that acts as a concert venue at night but can also support local markets, family events and related local businesses at other times. The venue/site itself should be porous and integrative, connecting to the community on all sides with passthroughs for pedestrians and bikes and pocket parks that support community wellbeing and connection, while also understanding the story of the area it is sited in.

The district should be viewed as an asset to the community, a place where children can **play and learn**, friends can **share a meal**, local businesses can **incubate** and out-of-towners can **marvel** at El Paso.

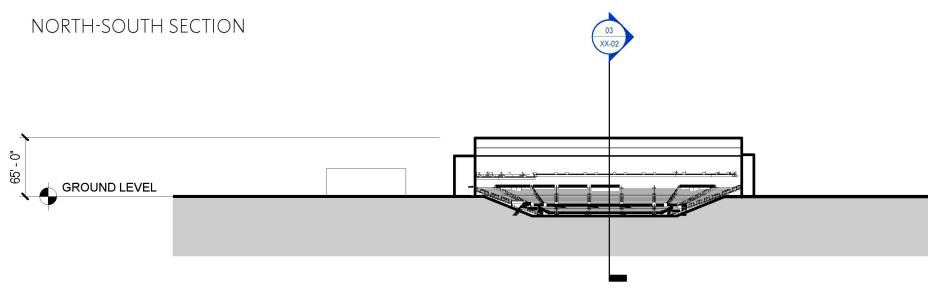
OVERALL FLOOR PLAN LEVEL 01 WIREFRAME

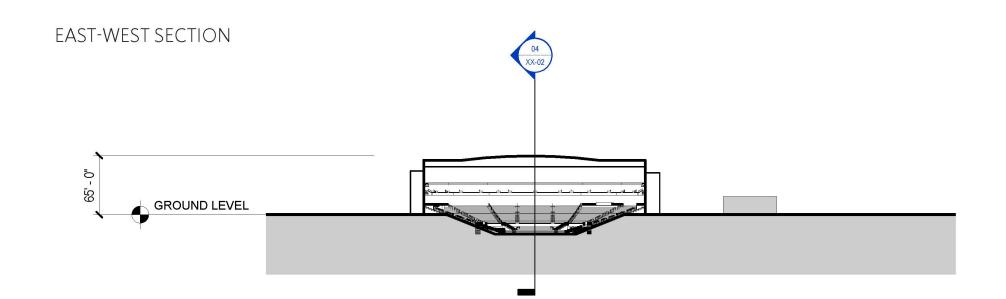

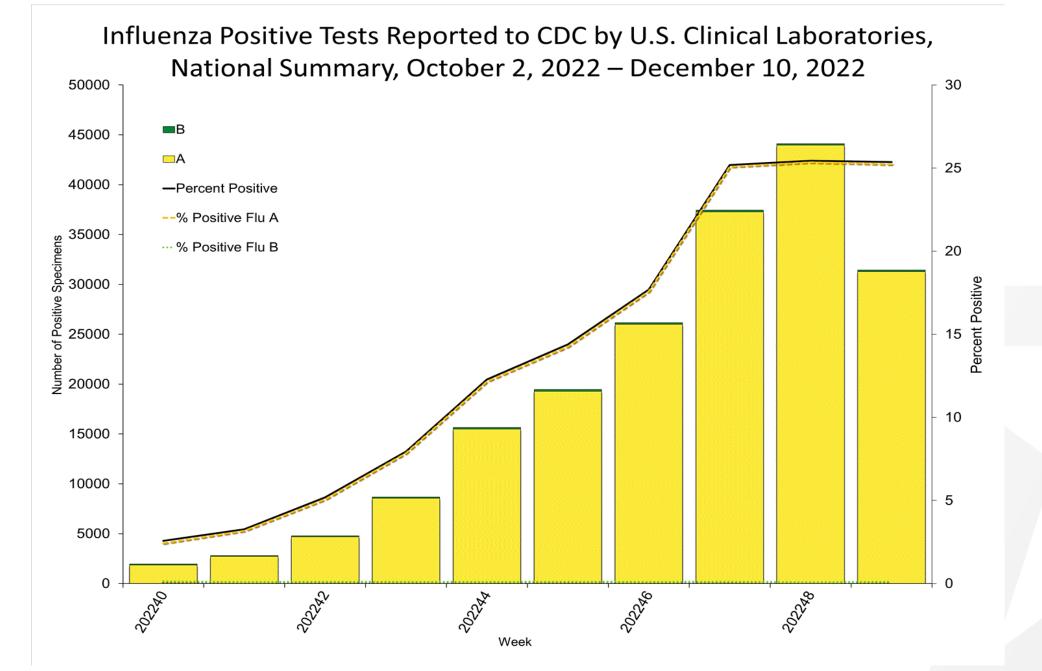

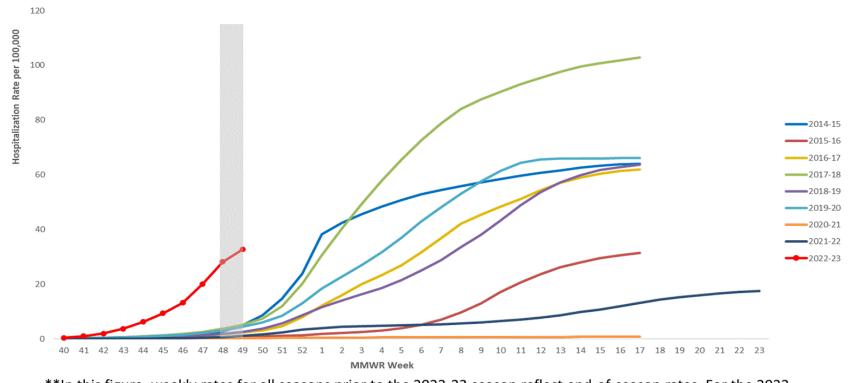








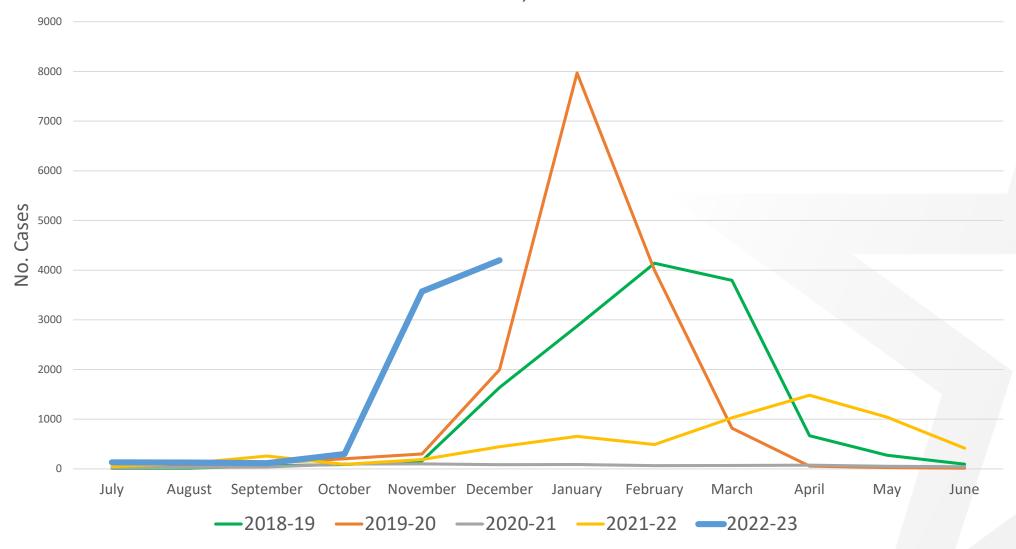

#### Influenza Activity 2018-22 El Paso, TX



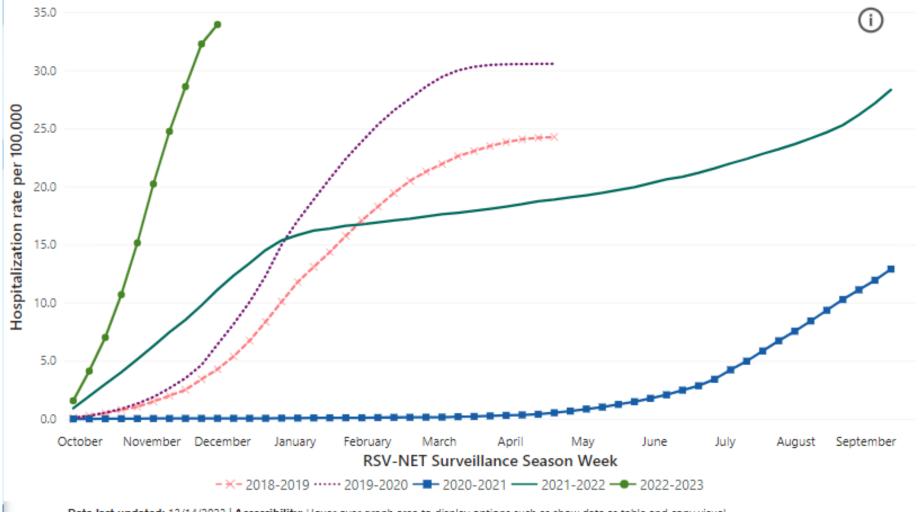

#### Rates of RSV-Associated Hospitalization, all seasons



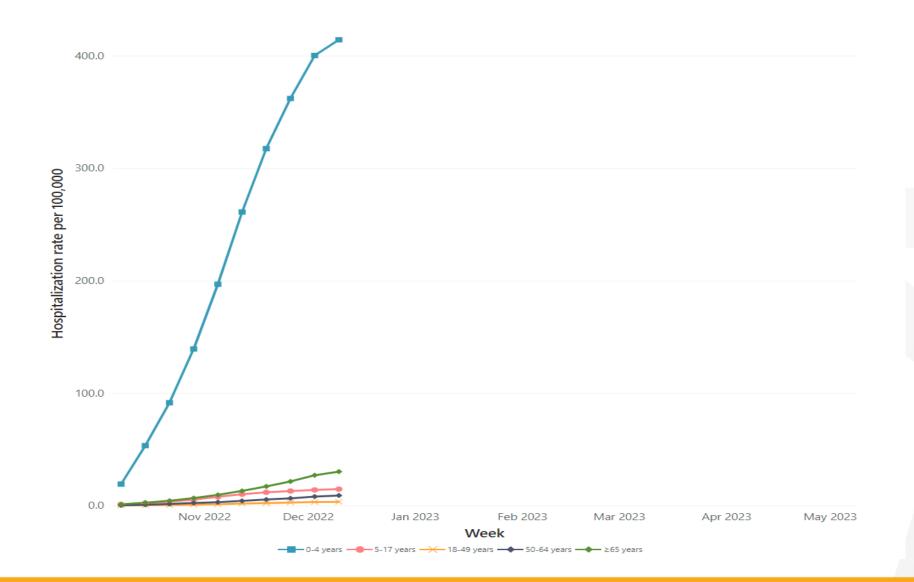

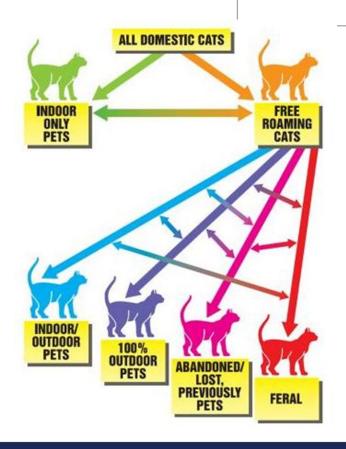




# What is the Community Cat Program?

- EPAS promotes and follows the Community Cat Program as a humane and non-lethal approach to long term freeroaming cat population control.
- Community Cats are often semi-friendly or unfriendly cats that wouldn't be suitable for adoption into homes and are already considered free-roaming. Don't worry, Community Cats are already accustomed to living outside and are happier this way!
- Cats that go through the Community Cat Program are humanely Trapped are Spayed/Neutered, have their ear tip to symbolize they have been through the program, Vaccinated and Returned to the trapped location.
- This program is free to the community!

### **Trap and Euthanize**

- Ineffective
- Fails to curtail population growth

- Leads to Compassion Fatigue
  - High turnover in shelters

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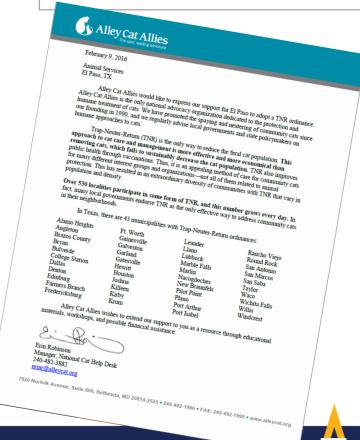




### **Community Cat Program**

- Decades of euthanizing has proven unsuccessful
- Shelter Reform 2016 Best Practice
- Established March 2016 by City Ordinance
- Provides strategies to humanely manage cat populations
- April 3, 2016 traps not supplied by EPAS
- April 17, 2016 personally owned traps not picked up by EPAS

#### **Benefits**

- Allows spayed/neutered, vaccinated, ear-tipped cats to be returned to their outdoor area to live out their lives. (Ear-tipping is a universal symbol of a spayed/neutered cat.)
- Evaluated by a Veterinarian.
- Humanely controls the community cat population so there are fewer cats over time.
- Reduces the number of cats killed by keeping these cats out of municipal shelters.
- Minimizes nuisance behaviors like spraying, fighting, howling and roaming.
- Improves the health of cats and neighborhood relations.
- Provides access to grant funding and volunteer participation.



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### **Terminology**

- Ear-Tipped Cat
  - Title 7 means a cat upon which a surgical process is performed during neutering as part of the trap-neuterreturn protocol overseen by a licensed veterinarian, in which a one-quarter-inch diagonal cut is made to remove the point of a cat's ear, and is preferably, but not exclusively, on the cat's left ear, to identify the cat as being sterilized and lawfully vaccinated for rabies
- Feral
  - Animal that escaped from domestication and become wild.
  - Unsocialized and tend to be fearful of people and keep their distance

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### **Terminology**

- Colony
  - Simply a group of free-roaming cats living together.
- Colony Manager/Caregiver
  - Eyes and ears for the colony
  - Cat population
  - Feeding times
  - Monitor for new intact cats



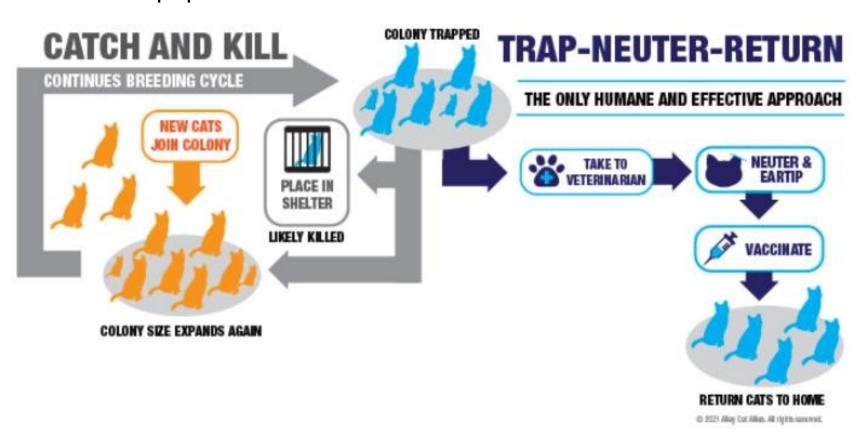

# AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE EXTENDINGEMERGENCY ORDINANCE NO. 019333 AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ASSIGN PERSONNEL AND RESOURCES TO ASSIST IN ADDRESSING THE HUMANITARIAN AND PUBLIC SAFETY CRISIS RESULTING FROM A MASS MIGRATION THROUGH EL PASO

WHEREAS, on May 23, 2022, the Mayor and City Council of the City of El Paso (the "City") passed an Emergency Ordinance No. 019333 "Authorizing the City Manager to Assign Personnel and Resources to Assist in Addressing the Humanitarian and Public Safety Crisis Resulting from a Mass Migration through the City of El Paso"; and

WHEREAS, thousands of migrants from Latin America have already gathered at or near the U.S.- Mexico border in hopes that President Biden will ease immigration restrictions that will make it easier to enter the United States; and

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2022, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") announced the repeal of the Public Health Services Act, 42 U.S.C. §265 ("Title 42"), which was expected to allow for the inflow of migrants from the southern border; and

WHEREAS, federal litigation ensued to enjoin the CDC from repealing Title 42 on the intended date of May 23, 2022; and

WHEREAS, on June 30, 2022, a United States Supreme Court ruling allowed the President to end the Migrant Protection Protocols, which would allow for the inflow of migrants from the southern border; and

**WHEREAS,** Title 42 was struck down by a federal court with the parties agreeing that the injunction would end on December 21, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Southwest had 230,678 land border encounters in the month of October, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the El Paso sector of CBP had 53,284 land border encounters in the month of October, 2022 and a total of 53,284 encounters for federal fiscal year 2022; and

WHEREAS, in the month of December 2022, approximately 6000 migrants have been arriving weekly; and WHEREAS, when the City faced a migrant surge in March of 2019, the Annunciation House, a local non-governmental organization ("NGO"), was able to establish over thirty hospitality sites throughout the El Paso region, versus today's fifteen hospitality sites; and

WHEREAS, the primary challenge is that the NGO does not have the volunteer base to

sustain or increase current capacity at its current hospitality sites (ten in El Paso, Texas, three in Las Cruces, New Mexico, one in Deming, New Mexico, and another in Albuquerque, New Mexico); and

WHEREAS, although NGO volunteer recruitment efforts will continue, it is not anticipated that the volunteer base will keep up with the current demand, despite the NGO having identified additional facilities that could receive migrants; and

WHEREAS, when the U.S. Customs and Border Protection's ("CBP") Central Processing Center is over capacity and NGO space is unavailable, that is when the potential for street releases arises; and

WHEREAS, on May 15, 2022, the federal authorities released 119 single adults on the downtown streets of the City of El Paso; and

WHEREAS, in response to the May 15, 2022, street release, the El Paso City-County Office of Emergency Management ("OEM") reallocated twenty-nine COVID-19 Operations staff to assist as migrant shelter surge staff, and on May 17, 2022, this staff began orientation training at Casa del Refugiado, the NGO's largest hospitality site; and

WHEREAS, OEM has created a job specification, for general disaster operations to include humanitarian relief duties to hire and assign staff to assist with NGO capacity with over 40 staff currently assigned; and

WHEREAS, the El Paso City Charter Section 3.10, allows for the adoption of one or more emergency ordinances to meet a public emergency affecting life, health, property, or the public peace; and

WHEREAS, Section 121.003 of the Texas Health & Safety Code states that a municipality may enforce any law that is reasonably necessary to protect public health; and

WHEREAS, Section 122.006 of the Texas Health & Safety Code provides home-rule municipalities express authority to adopt rules to protect the health of persons in the municipality, including quarantine rules to protect the residents against communicable disease; and

WHEREAS, OEM continues to provide COVID-19 isolation and quarantine hotel support to migrant shelters, expanding operations when outbreaks occur in congregate shelter facilities; and

WHEREAS, OEM has provided isolation and quarantine services to over 2,708 migrants in close coordination with NGOs since April 2020; and

WHEREAS, beginning in late August 2022, the El Paso sector experienced a surge of over 2,000 migrants presenting themselves daily to CBP, primarily made up of unsponsored single adults from Venezuela, resulting in over 1,000 street releases by CBP; and

WHEREAS, due to this high volume, the number of refugees and asylum seekers released to the NGO and the City's Migrant Welcome Center, was over 1,000 on a daily basis; and

WHEREAS, on September 7, 2022, the City and OEM stood up a migrant Welcome Center to assist with transportation assistance providing services to over 19,300 migrants through October 20, 2022, and

WHEREAS, there was over 40,000 community releases to local NGOs and the City during this period; and

WHEREAS, the City's Welcome Center has sponsored 294 charter buses with 13,900 unsponsored migrants aboard to New York City and Chicago as final destinations; and

WHEREAS, Sun Metro buses have transported upwards of 4,800 migrants to the El Paso International Airport ("EPIA"), bus stations, the Welcome Center, and shelters; and

WHEREAS, the City has provided over 39,000 meals to migrants at the local facilities, and for travel aboard the outbound charter buses; and

WHEREAS, the release of mass groups of people without access to potable water, food, or shelter exposes the migrants and El Paso residents to the origination and spread of potential and actual disease; and

WHEREAS, there are significant public safety and security concerns related to the wave of migration, including but not limited to the risk to injury or loss of life with migrants in El Paso streets with little or no resources on days that reach hot or cold temperatures and the inherent risks that come with increased demand on local shelters; and

WHEREAS, for these reasons, the City is faced with the imminent threat of widespread injury or loss of life resulting from a surge in transient migrants traveling to the region during an ongoing global pandemic; and

WHEREAS, there is the potential for loss of property for both residents and migrants due to those who would take financial advantage of this wave of migrants; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Aviation has the authority, as granted by the El Paso City Council, to manage the day-to-day operation of EPIA and to ensure that those operations are conducted in compliance with the rules and regulations regarding airports under Title 14 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter 22 of the Texas Transportation Code, and Title 14 of the El Paso City Code, as well as federal, state, and local health and safety regulations to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of all occupants and travelers making use of EPIA facilities; and

WHEREAS, EPIA has become saturated with migrants awaiting air travel and could need to take measures to preserve the health and safety of its customers, employees and the public, as well as measures to secure its facilities as the demand for air travel increases exponentially; and

WHEREAS, CBP has released many migrants onto downtown streets leaving many migrants without shelter; and

WHEREAS, the City of El Paso is home to 4 of the 28 international ports of entry between Texas and Mexico; and

WHEREAS, based on mass migration events in the recent past, the City anticipates significant delays at the international ports-of-entry to include trade; and

WHEREAS, the potential encampment of large groups of migrants on City rights of way, parks and other City property poses safety risks to migrants and citizens alike; and

WHEREAS, in awaiting the due support of the federal government, the City finds that the expenditure of public funds for staff to coordinate resources and supplies, serve as shelter surge staff and transport migrants released in the City of El Paso accomplishes a valid public purpose of protecting public infrastructure, and protecting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of El Paso; and

WHEREAS, in order to protect the health of persons in the municipality, the City Council wishes to continue to assist the local NGO with surge staff, coordination of resources and supplies, and transportation in light of the continued high number of community releases; and

WHEREAS, OEM and the City will continue to prepare and evaluate the need for mass emergency sheltering in anticipation of the eventual repeal of Title 42 and other regional migration surges that may impact the El Paso region; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance shall remain in effect until otherwise terminated, re-enacted, or superseded by a conflicting ordinance, El Paso Local Health Authority Ordinance, or state or federal law.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO:

- 1. That the Emergency Ordinance No. 019333 passed and adopted by the City Council of the City of El Paso on May 23, 2022 is hereby re-enacted and shall continue for thirty (30) days unless re-enacted in accordance with City Charter Section 3.10 or until terminated by City Council, whichever is sooner.
- 2. This ordinance is adopted as an emergency measure with the unanimous vote of the City Council Representatives present and the consent of the Mayor and pursuant to City Charter Section 3.10.

## **BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION:**

This item is to support restaurants and similar establishments in their efforts to safely operate during the COVID-19 pandemic by further facilitating outdoor service and dining opportunities. To achieve this, this item would re-enact Emergency Ordinance No. 019241 for 30 days to continue the suspension of various sections of the El Paso City Code to facilitate temporary uses on the public right of way and private property and continue the pilot program.

#### PRIOR COUNCIL ACTION:

March 13, 2020, the Mayor declared a local state of disaster for the City of El Paso resulting from a public health emergency.

March 17, 2020, El Paso City Council adopted Emergency Ordinance No. 019035 extending the City's Disaster Declaration due to a Public Health Emergency. Also on, March 17, 2020, El Paso City Council reenacted its Emergency Ordinance extending the City's Disaster Declaration monthly, with the most recent extension taking place on August 31, 2020.

August 31, 2020, El Paso City Council adopted Emergency Ordinance No. 019091, which suspended various sections of the El Paso City Code to facilitate temporary uses on the public right of way and private property and established a pilot program.

September 28, 2020, El Paso City Council enacted an Emergency Ordinance Re-Enacting Emergency Ordinance No. 019091.

October 27, 2020, El Paso City Council enacted an Emergency Ordinance Re-Enacting Emergency Ordinance No. 019091. Also, City Council approved increasing the fine for all emergency directive violations from \$500 to \$1,000.

November 23, 2020, El Paso City Council enacted an Emergency Ordinance Re-Enacting Emergency Ordinance No. 019091, which included the amendment to increase the fine to \$1,000 (Ordinance No. 019119).

- **WHEREAS**, by proclamation issued on March 13, 2020, the Mayor declared a local state of disaster for the City of El Paso resulting from a public health emergency; and
- **WHEREAS**, on March 17, 2020, El Paso City Council adopted Emergency Ordinance No. 019035 extending the City's Disaster Declaration due to a Public Health Emergency; and
- WHEREAS, since March 2020, El Paso City Council has re-enacted Emergency Ordinance No. 019035, with the most recent re-enactment taking place on November 07, 2022; and
- **WHEREAS,** Governor Abbott has similarly renewed the State's COVID- 19 Disaster Declaration, with the most recent extension taking place on December 16, 2022; and

## AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A FRANCHISE FOR STAR Inc, d/b/a Revive Mobile Health, TO OPERATE A NON-EMERGENCY AMBULANCE TRANSFER SERVICE

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to Section 3.18 of the El Paso City Charter the right of control, ownership and use of streets and alleys is declared to be inalienable except as provided by ordinance passed by the Council; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of El Paso is authorized by Section 7.13 of the El Paso City Charter to levy and collect franchise fees in accordance with the laws of the state of Texas; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the authority granted by the City Charter, this franchise agreement is a valid exercise of the City's broad police powers and based upon the City's statutory regulatory authority, including but not limited to, Texas Local Government Code Chapters 51 and 52; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of El Paso requires in City Code Section 9.85.050, that all entities engaging in furnishing a transfer ambulance service are required to enter into a franchise agreement with the City; and

WHEREAS, STAR Inc, d/b/a Revive Mobile Health("GRANTEE") has applied for a franchise to provide non-emergency ambulance transfer services under the El Paso City Code Title 9 (Health and Safety) Chapter 9.85(Emergency and Transfer Ambulance Services).

**WHEREAS,** on evidence received, City Council finds that public convenience and necessity justify granting a franchise to **GRANTEE** to operate a non-emergency ambulance transfer service in the City of El Paso, Texas.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO, TEXAS THAT:

## ARTICLE I. GRANT OF THE FRANCHISE AND GENERAL PROVISIONS

## A. Grant of Non-Exclusive Franchise

A non-exclusive franchise, subject to the Grantee's compliance with the requirements and limitations set forth herein and by local, state and federal laws, is hereby granted to **STAR Inc**, **d/b/a Revive Mobile Health**, Grantee, to operate a non-emergency transfer ambulance service within the City and upon the public streets, rights-of-way and alleys of the City of El Paso.

#### B. Definitions

For the purpose of this franchise the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the following meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words in the plural number include the singular number, and words in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is mandatory and the word "may" is permissive.

- 1. "City" shall mean the City of El Paso, Texas and any department or board that may be designated by the City Council to administer, oversee or enforce the provisions of this franchise.
  - 2. "City Council" shall mean the council of the City as the governmental, legislative and administrative body of the City.
  - 3. "Customer" shall mean any person who requests or receives the services of the Grantee.
  - 4. "DSHS" shall mean the Texas Department of State Health Services.
  - 5. "Fire Chief" shall mean the Fire Department official responsible for the management of emergency ambulance service for the City of El Paso or his designee.
  - 6. "Franchise Area" shall mean that portion of the City for which a franchise is granted under the authority of this agreement. If not otherwise stated in the franchise, the Franchise Area shall be the corporate limits of the City of El Paso including all territory hereafter annexed to the City.
  - 7. "Grantee" shall mean **STAR Inc, d/b/a Revive Mobile Health**
  - 8. "Net Receipts" shall be defined as all cash, credits and property of any kind or nature received as consideration directly or indirectly by the Grantee, its affiliates, subsidiaries, parent and any person in which Grantee has a financial interest, or from any source whatsoever, arising from or attributable to the transport of patients or services rendered in relation to the transport of a patient by the Grantee or in any way derived from the operation of its franchise. These net receipts shall not be reduced for any purpose and shall be the basis for computing the franchise fee.
  - 9. "Non-emergency ambulance transfer service" shall mean the operation of a service whereby persons are transported by ambulance under the supervision and care of duly licensed and certified emergency medical technicians in non-emergency situations except that a non-emergency ambulance transfer service may transport persons in emergency situations as permitted by the terms of this franchise and other applicable laws.
  - 10. "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, limited partnership, association, corporation, company, and organizations of any kind, or any other legally recognized entity.
  - 11. "Public Rights-of-Way" shall mean the surface, the air space above the surface, and the area below the surface of any public street, highway, land, path, alley, sidewalk, boulevard, drive, bridge, tunnel, parkways, waterways, utility easements or other public right-of-way now or hereafter held by the City.
  - 12. "Service" shall mean any service which is authorized pursuant to the terms of this Franchise Agreement.

## C. Term and Effective Date

Regardless of the date upon which the ordinance granting the franchise is adopted, the term of this franchise shall be commence on 12:01 a.m., January 1, 2023 (the "Effective Date"), with the possibility to renew the franchise as set forth below, with the initial term ending at 11:59 pm on April 30, 2023.

## D. Operational Timeframe

This franchise shall automatically expire if Grantee's non-emergency ambulance transfer service is not fully operational, as verified by the Fire Chief, within ninety (90) days of the date the Franchise is approved by City Council.

## E. Renewal of Franchise

- 1. Renewal Procedure. If the Grantee wishes that the City renew this franchise, Grantee shall submit a request in writing to the City Clerk's Office, P.O. Box 1890, El Paso, Texas 79950-1890, by at least three (3) months prior to the expiration date of this franchise, whether it be during the initial term or any renewal period. The City shall consider Grantee's written request and shall determine whether public convenience and necessity justify renewal of this franchise, including during any renewal period.
- 2. Should Grantee fail to submit a request for the renewal of this franchise to the City as herein required, this franchise shall expire upon the expiration date and a new franchise shall be required if Grantee desires to operate a non-emergency ambulance franchise within the City of El Paso.
- 3. Notwithstanding Article I, Sections E.1 and E.2 of this franchise, the City Manager is authorized to grant a thirty (30) day extension of this franchise, under the same terms and conditions in effect at the time that Grantee makes its written renewal request, whether or not Grantee timely submits the renewal request notice prior to the expiration of this franchise during the initial term or any renewal periods.
- 4. City's Right to Modify Terms of Franchise and Require Additional Information Reserved. Grantee understands, agrees, and accepts that the City reserves its rights to require a) that the terms, conditions, and provisions of this franchise be modified upon Grantee's request for renewal of the franchise and b) that Grantee submit additional information and documents as conditions for renewing the grant of this franchise to operate a non-emergency ambulance transfer service.

## F. Business Entity

1. Registered Business Entity and Assumed Name. Grantee shall, forward to and maintain on file with the Fire Chief a certified copy of its corporate Articles of Incorporation, Partnership Agreement and Bylaws, or a sworn and notarized statement of sole proprietorship for the purpose of identifying Grantee's business entity status and a sworn and notarized statement of any name by which it does business if different than the business entity name within 15 days of the grant of this franchise, unless required to be performed at an earlier time by other legal provisions.

- 2. Sale of Business. Grantee shall notify the City immediately of the proposed sale or actual sale of the Grantee's business entity. Grantee shall give notice to the City of any actual sale of the Grantee's business entity no less than ten (10) business days prior to the actual sale or transfer.
- 3. Business Officers, Supervisors and Managers. Grantee shall, within fifteen (15) days of the grant of this franchise, submit to the Fire Chief, the names and business addresses of all owners, officers and supervisory and management personnel of Grantee.
- 4. Financial Interest. Grantee shall, within 15 days of the grant of this franchise, submit to the Fire Chief the names and business addresses of all persons having a financial interest in the Grantee or any parent, affiliate or subsidiary of Grantee's business entity.
- 5. Fiscal Year. Grantee shall, within 15 days of the grant of this franchise, submit to the Fire Chief the beginning and ending dates of its fiscal year.
- 6. Changes. Any additions or changes in the information, which is required to be submitted to the City pursuant to this section, shall be forwarded in written form by the Grantee to the Fire Chief within 15 days of such changes.
- 7. Non-compliance and Revocation. Failure to comply with this section shall constitute a material breach by Grantee and shall constitute grounds for revocation of this franchise by the City.

# G. <u>Indemnification and Public Liability Insurance</u>

- 1. Indemnification. Grantee shall, at its sole cost, fully indemnify and hold harmless the City, its officers, boards and commissions, and city employees against any and all claims or actions for damages arising out of Grantee's actions or omissions under this franchise, including, but not limited to, expenses for reasonable legal fees and disbursements and liabilities assumed by the City in connection with any such claims or actions.
- 2. Grantee shall be required to obtain and maintain in effect throughout the term of the Agreement a public liability insurance policy which meets the requirements set forth in this Agreement. This policy shall be for the protection of any person, whether a passenger or patient in Grantee's ambulance or not, whether injured or killed by the negligence of Grantee or its agent or employee and shall not contain a passenger liability exclusion.
- 2.1 Grantee shall obtain and maintain in effect throughout the term of this Agreement public liability insurance in an amount of not less than \$500,000. Grantee shall immediately advise the Fire Chief of any claim or litigation which affects Grantee's insurance coverage.
- 2.2 Grantee shall maintain comprehensive general and automobile liability coverage with limits of no less than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) per occurrence and one million dollars (\$1,000,000) annual aggregate. Grantee shall maintain medical professional liability coverage with limits of no less than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) per occurrence and one million dollars (\$1,000,000) annual aggregate. These

amounts are not a limitation upon the Grantee's agreement to indemnify and hold the City harmless. Grantee shall immediately advise the Fire Chief of any claim or litigation which affects Grantee's insurance.

- 2.3 The policy of public liability insurance shall be written by an insurance company with an A rating, authorized to do business in the State of Texas.
- 2.4 The policy of public liability insurance shall provide that it cannot be suspended, revoked, canceled or reduced in coverage without sixty (60) days written notice to the City.
- 2.5 The policy shall provide that the insurer will defend against all claims and lawsuits which arise and will pay any final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction against the City, its officers, agents, servants or employees and Grantee, his officers, agents, servants or employees. The policy shall name the City of El Paso, its officers, agents, servants and employees as additional insureds to the full amount of the policy limits.
- 2.6 Grantee shall not operate its service during any period for which: 1) its insurance lapses for any reason; 2) its insurance is suspended, revoked or canceled; or 3) the amount of effective coverage of its insurance has been reduced below the minimum coverage amounts required by this Agreement. Failure to keep the policy in full force and effect throughout the term of the special privilege shall be grounds for termination of the Agreement.
- 2.7 Grantee shall forward to the Fire Chief a copy of each certificate of insurance issued within fifteen (15) days after the execution of this Agreement and as such policy or policies are modified, renewed, suspended or canceled.
- 2.8 Certificates of insurance that state that the insurer shall endeavor to give notice and/or that there shall be no liability for the failure to give the notice required herein shall not meet the requirements of this section.

# H. Compensation and Payment of Franchise Fee

- 1. Compensation Franchise Fee. As compensation for the grant of this franchise to use the public rights-of-way of the City of El Paso, Grantee shall pay to the City 2.75% of Grantee's monthly net receipts.
- 2. Franchise Area For Which Net Receipts Are to Be Reported. The Grantee shall report its net receipts for all transports, treatment or other services rendered to any customer, which commence within the Franchise Area as defined herein.
- 3. Net Receipts. Net receipts shall include those items of revenue as defined by generally accepted accounting principles and as defined herein for the type of business and accounting method used.
- 4. Payment Due Date. Grantee's payments shall be paid monthly and shall be postmarked by the 15th day of the month following the month for which net receipts are reported.

- 5. Interest Charged for Late Payments. In the event that any payment required by this Section is not made when due, interest shall be compounded daily from such date at the annual rate equivalent to the then existing prime rate reported in the Wall Street Journal on the due date plus four percent (+4%).
- 6. Statement Required Where No Net Receipts Reportable. If Grantee has no net receipts for a given month, Grantee shall provide written verification that it has no net receipts which shall be postmarked no later than the 15th day of the month following the month for which the Grantee has no gross revenues. Failure to provide such notice to the City shall result in commencement of proceedings to terminate the franchise.
- 7. Payments to City Comptroller. All payments are to be sent to the City Comptroller with copies of all accompanying correspondence sent to the Fire Chief.

# I. Ad Valorem Taxes

Grantee will also pay before delinquency all ad valorem taxes lawfully assessed against its property.

# J. <u>City Inspection of Grantee's Books and Audits</u>

Grantee agrees that it will keep a true and accurate set of books, accounts and records. The City shall have the right to inspect the books of Grantee during the term of this franchise and shall further have the right to order an independent audit of said books made when, in the opinion of the City, the condition of said books justifies such actions. In the event the audit proves that the Grantee has kept true and accurate records on book accounts, the cost of such audit will be borne by the City. In the event that the audit shows that the Grantee has failed to keep true and accurate records and books of accounts, the cost of said audit will be borne by Grantee.

# K. Annual Audited Statement of Net Receipts Required

The Grantee shall submit to the City Comptroller an annual audited statement of net receipts by month for fees derived in the Franchise Area. Such annual audit shall reflect the Grantee's fiscal year and shall be submitted to the City Comptroller within sixty (60) days of the close of Grantee's fiscal year. A copy of this audit shall be sent to the Fire Chief. The annual audit shall be conducted at no expense to the City.

# L. Grantee to Keep Separate Records

Grantee shall maintain separate records if other services are provided outside the scope of this franchise.

#### M. Franchise Not Transferable

This franchise is not for the benefit of any third party and is not transferable.

# N. Failure to Enforce Franchise Agreement No Waiver of Terms Thereof

The Grantee or other parties shall not be excused from complying with any of the terms and conditions of this franchise by any failure of the City upon any one or more occasions to insist upon or to seek compliance with any such terms or conditions.

# O. <u>Judicial Relief, Costs and Attorneys' Fees</u>

In addition to all remedies provided in this franchise, the City shall have the right to apply to any court of competent jurisdiction to secure judicial relief, as it shall deem proper. The City's costs and attorney's fees for such action shall be paid by the Grantee if the City obtains a judgment or other relief.

# P. Contractual Relationship

Nothing contained herein shall be construed as creating the relationship of employer and employee between the City and the Grantee, their employees, or between the City and the Grantee's employees. The Grantee shall be deemed at all times to be an independent franchisee. In carrying out the terms of this franchise, the Grantee shall employ its own personnel, and such employees shall be and act under the exclusive and complete supervision and control of their employer.

# Q. Notice

Wherever any notice is required or permitted hereunder such notice shall be in writing. Any notice or document required or permitted to be delivered hereunder shall be deemed to be delivered whether actually received or not when deposited in the United States Mail, postage prepaid, Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, addressed to the individuals named herein and to whom copies or notice are required to be provided at the respective addresses as follows:

City of El Paso Attn: City Manager P.O. Box 1890 El Paso, Texas 79950-1890

and

Fire Chief Fire Department 416 N. Stanton, Ste. 200 El Paso, Texas 79901

and

STAR Inc, d/b/a Revive Mobile Health Attn: EMS Chief Carlos Alarcon 12285 Pellicano Drive, Suite A2 El Paso, Texas, 79936

or to such other addresses as the City or Grantee may designate to each other in writing via certified, postage pre-paid, first class mail. It shall be the duty of the Grantee to provide the City with Grantee's most current mailing and business addresses no less than ten (10) business days prior to any change of same.

# R. Revocation and Termination

- 1. Public Protection and Welfare. Should the City at any time, for any reason, decide that the public protection or welfare is not being met as contemplated by this franchise, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Grantee, the City Council may cancel, terminate and revoke this franchise at no cost to the City. Any and all rights of the Grantee in the use of City streets, alleys or public rights-of-way shall then be terminated.
- 2. Failure to Use Public Rights-of-Way. In addition, if Grantee has ceased to use the City streets, alleys, or public rights-of-way for the purposes herein contemplated for a period of thirty (30) days or if Grantee defaults in any of Grantee's obligations under the franchise and fails to correct such default within thirty (30) days after written notice to do so, the City Council may cancel, terminate and revoke this franchise at no cost to the City. Any and all rights of the Grantee under this franchise shall then terminate.
- 3. Breach of Franchise Agreement Terms. After thirty (30) days written notice, the City Council may cancel, terminate and revoke this franchise for breach by the Grantee of any of its obligations hereunder or for failure of the Grantee to pay any final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction in a suit on any claim in connection with the operation of the ambulance service. If court proceedings are instituted to determine the legality of such revocation, and Grantee does not prevail, the Grantee shall pay the reasonable expenses incurred by the City in connection with such litigation. Article II, Section C.3 of this franchise contains specific terms regarding termination for failure to meet response times. The City may at any time make an inquiry as to whether Grantee is able to comply with each and every term of this franchise.
- 4. Convenience. This non-exclusive franchise for non-emergency ambulance transfer service may be terminated in whole or in part by the City by giving thirty (30) days' written notice of termination to Grantee. Such right of termination is in addition to and not in lieu of rights of the City set forth in Article I, Sections R.1-3 and Article II, Section C.3 of the present franchise.
- 5. Annual Review. The City shall conduct a compliance review regarding all aspects of this franchise ninety (90) days prior to the end of each twelve month period. Should the City determine that compliance is not being met, the City shall proceed under the provisions of Art. I, Sec. R.3 of this franchise.

# S. <u>Entire Franchise Agreement</u>

This document contains all of the terms of this franchise and may not be modified, except by an agreement in writing signed by both parties.

## T. Severability

The invalidity or illegality of any one or more provisions of this franchise by any court of competent jurisdiction shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions hereof.

#### U. Acceptance of Terms by Grantee Required

This franchise shall be null and void unless Grantee, before the grant of this franchise, files with the City Clerk its written acceptance of the franchise. Grantee's failure to accept the terms and conditions of this franchise and file its acceptance thereof with the City Clerk prior to the grant of this franchise shall render the grant of this franchise null and void.

# V. <u>Acceptance by Grantee's Authorized Representative</u>

The individual accepting the terms and conditions of this franchise on behalf of the Grantee affirmatively acknowledges that he is authorized to do so and said individual further warrants that he is authorized to commit and bind the Grantee to the terms and conditions of this franchise.

# W. <u>Rights of Individuals</u>

- 1. Service and Rates. The Grantee shall not refuse non-emergency ambulance transport service to any person or customer who requests the service for a lawful purpose and which the Grantee has the ability to render. The Grantee shall not, as to rates, charges, quality of service, or in any other respect, make or grant any unreasonable preference or advantage, nor subject any person to any prejudice or disadvantage. The Grantee shall take affirmative steps to disseminate the information concerning the availability of its service to all persons. The Grantee shall ensure that all services are equally available to all persons. This provision shall not be deemed to prohibit promotional campaigns to stimulate requests for service, nor shall it be deemed to prohibit the establishment of a graduated scale of charges and classified rate schedules to which any customer coming within the classification shall be entitled, provided the schedules have been filed with and approved by the City Council as provided in Article I, Section Y ("Amendments") of this franchise.
- 2. Personnel and EEOC. The Grantee shall strictly adhere to the equal employment opportunity requirements of Federal and State statutes and local regulations, as amended from time to time. The Grantee shall comply at all times with all other applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations, and all executive and administrative orders relating to nondiscrimination which are incorporated in this franchise by reference.
- 3. Customer Medical Records and Privacy. The Grantee shall be responsible for protecting the rights of customers as set forth in the Emergency Health Care Act, TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ANN., CHAPTER 773, (VERNON'S 1997), and other applicable laws, as amended.

# X. Time is of the Essence

Whenever this agreement shall set forth any time for an act to be performed by or on behalf of the Grantee, the time shall be deemed of the essence and any failure within the control of the Grantee to perform within the time allotted shall be sufficient ground for the City to invoke an appropriate penalty including possible revocation of the franchise.

# Y. Amendments

The City reserves the right to amend the terms of this ordinance and franchise in any manner necessary for the safety or welfare of the public or to protect the public interests.

# Z. Police Powers

- 1. Compliance by Grantee Required. In accepting this franchise, the Grantee acknowledges that its rights under this franchise are subject to the police power of the City to adopt and enforce general ordinances necessary to the safety and welfare of the public and the Grantee agrees to comply with all applicable general laws and ordinances enacted by the City pursuant to this power.
- 2. Conflict of Laws. Any conflict between the provisions of this franchise and any other present or future lawful exercise of the City's police powers shall be resolved in favor of the City except that any such exercise that is not of general application in the jurisdiction or applies exclusively to the Grantee which contains provisions inconsistent with this franchise shall prevail only if the City finds their exercise necessary to protect the public health, safety, property or general welfare or the exercise is mandated by law. Should the terms of this franchise conflict with any other law or regulation, this franchise shall control where any law or regulation permits the City to impose more stringent standards or requirements upon Grantee.

# AA. Compliance with Laws

The Grantee shall comply with all laws and regulations of the United States, the State of Texas and the City of El Paso. Grantee shall comply with all applicable statutes, laws, codes, regulations, and ordinances applicable to Grantee's use of City streets, alleys, and public rights-of-way for the purposes permitted herein. Failure to comply with these laws and regulations shall constitute a material breach by Grantee and shall constitute grounds for cancellation, termination and revocation of this franchise by the City.

# BB. Governmental Powers Not Surrendered

The granting of this franchise does not surrender any governmental powers now or hereafter conferred upon the City.

#### CC. Law Governing

The laws of the State of Texas shall govern the validity, performances and enforcement of this franchise.

# ARTICLE II. SERVICE OPERATIONS, STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS

# A. Availability of Service

The Grantee shall offer service on a twenty-four hour basis to the general public within the Franchise Area.

#### B. Radio Communications

- 1. Communications Center. Grantee must provide, at its own expense, a communications center, which will include 24-hour day telephone access for the public and direct radio communication with all company ambulances used under this franchise.
- 2. Communications with El Paso Fire Department (EPFD). Grantee shall equip each ambulance with a radio capable of maintaining direct radio communication with the EPFD Communications Center through either an 800 Mhz trunked commercial radio system or UHF National EMS Frequency, Channel 2. Grantee shall so equip each ambulance at its sole expense and such radios shall be used to coordinate disaster and emergency relief with EPFD when responding to an incident as directed by the Fire Chief or when an emergency is encountered within the Franchise Area.

# C. <u>Response Time Requirements</u>

- 1. Grantee's Response to Customers' Requests for Service. Grantee shall respond to a customer's request for non-emergency transfer service, at any time of day on any day of the week, no later than eighty minutes for at least ninety percent (90%) of the time after the request for service is received unless pre-arrangements are made.
- 2. Grantee's Response Per Request of Fire Chief. Grantee shall respond to non-emergency incidents upon the request of the Fire Chief or his designee. Grantee agrees to send the earliest available ambulance to non-emergency incidents as requested by Fire Chief or his designees, but in no case shall response time exceed twenty five minutes for at least ninety percent (90%) of the time for non-emergency calls.
- 3. Failure to Meet Response Time. In the event that Grantee fails to meet the response times indicated in this Section C, during four consecutive months, the City shall notify Grantee of such failure and that failure to meet the response times during the immediately following month shall be grounds for immediate termination of this franchise.

# D. Emergency Aid to City of El Paso

Grantee shall provide emergency aid assistance to the City of El Paso in cases of system overload or multiple patient incidents as requested or directed by the Fire Chief or his designee. Such assistance shall be provided on an emergency basis with immediate priority being given to those requests.

# E. Grantee's Costs

The City shall not be responsible for any cost incurred in providing services as described in this franchise.

# F. <u>Billing and Collection for Services</u>

The Grantee shall bill and collect charges for services from the patient or responsible party at Grantee's sole expense.

# G. <u>Transportation Logs</u>

The Grantee shall be required to submit monthly or more frequently as directed by the Fire Chief, a log showing the following information:

- 1. list of emergency transports commencing within the Franchise Area for the month, to include date, time, transport commencing address and destination address;
- 2. the total number of non-emergency transports commencing within the Franchise Area for the month; and
- 3. the number of transports originating within the Franchise Area for the month.

# H. <u>Personnel Requirements</u>

- 1. Records of Personnel. The Grantee shall be required to submit to the Fire Chief, prior to the commencement of operations, a list identifying all of its employees hired to drive or attend Grantee's customers. The list shall identify each employee by name and shall identify the employee's current DSHS certification status, driver's license status, and Defensive Driving Course Status. The Grantee shall forward written notice of any addition or change in the information required to be submitted within fifteen (15) calendar days of the addition or change.
- 2. Monthly Report Noting Changes of Personnel or Personnel License Status. Grantee shall submit to the Fire Chief monthly reports to include additions and changes of personnel and personnel records information as required in Article II, Section H(1) of this franchise.
- 3. DSHS Certification of Grantee's Employees. Each of Grantee's attendants and drivers employed by Grantee must be currently certified as an Emergency Medical Technician-Basic with the Texas Department of State Health Services, Emergency Medical Services Division. Individuals providing a higher level of care to customers must be currently certified with the Texas Department of Health at the level consistent with the type of care for which that ambulance is equipped as identified in this franchise.
- 4. Driver's License Required. While on duty, each of Grantee's attendants and drivers must possess at all times a license issued by the State of Texas or New Mexico which is valid to operate an emergency vehicle and transfer ambulance.
- 5. EMT Identification Required. While on duty, each of Grantee's attendants and drivers shall be required to possess proof of EMT certificate issued to the EMT by the Texas Department of State Health Services;
- 6. Statement from Physician; Reportable Communicable Diseases. Within fifteen (15) days of employment of each attendant and driver, the Grantee must submit to the Fire Chief a written statement from a physician authorized to practice medicine in the State of Texas stating the person is free of the following communicable diseases (Tuberculosis, Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Hepatitis B, and Tetanus) and is physically capable of performing the

required duties. If an individual contracts a communicable disease which is required to be reported to appropriate federal, state or local health authorities, Grantee shall immediately notify the Fire Chief that the individual is unable to perform duties as an EMT and shall, prior to permitting the individual to resume his or her duties as an EMT, submit to the Fire Chief, a physician's statement that the individual has recovered from his or her illness and may resume providing care under the individual's EMT license as permitted by those laws governing emergency medical technicians and communicable diseases.

7. Defensive Driving or Emergency Vehicles Operation Course Certificate. Within ninety (90) days of employment, the Grantee must submit to the Fire Chief, for each of Grantee's employees, evidence showing completion of a National Safety Council Approved Defensive Driving Course or an Emergency Vehicles Operation Course, the latter from the El Paso Fire Department, while operating under this franchise.

# I. <u>Ambulance Staffing Requirements</u>

- 1. Basic Ambulance Staffing. Each ambulance being used for basic care must be staffed by no less than an EMT-Basic driver and an EMT-Basic attendant, and any other personnel needed to sustain current level of care for the patient as determined by the attending physician.
- 2. Advanced Life Support Ambulance Staffing. Each ambulance being used for advanced life support care (ALS) must be staffed by no less than an Advanced EMT and an EMT-Basic, and any other personnel needed to sustain current level of care for the patient as determined by the attending physician.
- 3. MICU Ambulance Staffing. Each ambulance being used for mobile intensive care (MICU) must be staffed by a minimum of an EMT-Paramedic, an EMT-Basic, and any other personnel needed to sustain current level of care for the patient as determined by the attending physician.

#### J. Vehicle Inspections

- 1. Inspection of Ambulances Prior to Initial Operation. Prior to the commencement of operations, the Fire Chief or his designee shall inspect all ambulances used by Grantee in operating its transfer service at a reasonable time. An ambulance must pass inspection and have a current valid permit sticker prior to any use for customer transportation or care. Subsequent to the initial inspection, all ambulances which are subject to this franchise shall be inspected by the Fire Chief or designee every two years, except as noted in Article II.J.2.
- 2. Field Inspections. Ambulances may be inspected in the field at any hour by the Fire Chief or designee, and he may require any ambulance to proceed to a specified location for further inspection. If Grantee has three ambulance field inspection failures within a 12-month period, then the City shall re-inspect Grantee's entire ambulance fleet within 30 days of the last failed field inspection.
- 3. Non-Compliance. The Fire Chief or designee shall flag the ambulance and remove the permit sticker from an ambulance that fails an inspection. Grantee shall not

operate an ambulance without a valid permit sticker. It shall be an event of default for Grantee to operate a vehicle without a valid permit.

- 4. Inspection Process. Each inspection shall include:
  - a. Confirmation that the vehicle has a current motor vehicle registration sticker on the front windshield in compliance with Texas Transportation Code §502.059(c), as amended, with proof of vehicle inspection pursuant to the requirements of Texas Transportation Code Chapter 548, as amended.
  - b. Confirmation that the Grantee has a current EMS Provider License issued by Texas Department of State Health Services, Emergency Medical Services Division as provided for under 25 T.A.C. §§ 157.2 and 157.11.
  - c. Visual inspection of the vehicle(s) for the purpose of determining full operation of the following motor vehicle equipment:
  - (1) headlights, tail-lights, back-up lights, ambulance body clearance lights (if appropriate), brake lights and license plate lights, and appropriate emergency lights and sirens; and
  - (2) tires.
  - d. Visual and mechanical inspection of equipment for the purpose of determining compliance with the medical equipment specifications of the franchise.
- 5. Written Inspection Report. EPFD shall give the Grantee a written report at the time of inspection indicating any deficiencies.
- 6. Permit Sticker. A vehicle that meets the requirements of this franchise under this ordinance shall be issued a permit sticker indicating its validity for a twenty-four month period from the date of inspection. The sticker's expiration date shall not be deemed to impair or limit the City's ability to conduct field inspections or perform any other function under the terms of this franchise. An ambulance that has met the inspection requirements of this franchise shall display the permit sticker on the vehicle's rear window and said sticker shall be visible from the exterior of the vehicle at all times.
- 7. Permit Sticker Non-transferable. A permit sticker is not transferable from one vehicle to another.
- 8. Ambulances Not Passing Inspection. Any ambulance found not to be in compliance with the requirements of this franchise or of any other ordinance of the City regulating the use of ambulances on the streets and alleys of the City of El Paso shall 1) fail inspection, 2) be considered not safe or useable and 3) have any existing permit sticker removed. Thereafter, until the vehicle passes inspection, it shall not be operated for customer transportation or care upon the streets of the City of El Paso.

- 9. Re-inspection. At the request of the Grantee, EPFD shall re-inspect a vehicle that has failed inspection to determine if the deficiencies have been corrected. EPFD may require review of written documentation, such as equipment repair bills or sales receipts, and may re-inspect the vehicle and equipment visually and mechanically for compliance with this franchise.
- 10. Specialty Ambulance. The City, upon verification of the licensing of a vehicle as a specialty ambulance by the Texas Department of State Health Services, shall issue a sticker, as described in Article II, Section J.5, for any such vehicle.

# K. Vehicle, Equipment and Supply Requirements

- 1. DSHS Regulations. Vehicles are required to meet all applicable Texas Department of State Health Services Regulations in effect at the time of inspection.
- 2. DSHS Vehicle Equipment and Supply Requirements. The following equipment and supplies are required for each ambulance operated in the Franchise Area by the Grantee:
  - a. Each ambulance being used for Basic Life Support Care must comply fully with DSHS requirements for Basic Life Support Ambulances, as amended.
  - b. Each ambulance being used for Advanced Life Support Care must comply fully with DSHS requirements for Advanced Life Support Ambulances, as amended.
  - c. Each ambulance being used for Mobile Intensive Care Unit services must comply fully with DSHS requirements for Mobile Intensive Care Ambulances, as amended.
- 3. Ambulance Markings. Grantee shall mark each ambulance distinctly with its company's name. Grantee's name shall be marked with a minimum one inch wide and five inch tall lettering on at least three sides of the ambulance. The color of Grantee's name must contrast with the color of the ambulance or the wrap. The Texas of Department of State Health Service provider's license number shall be displayed on the sides of the ambulance with "TX" appearing prior to said number in the width and height required by the State of Texas. Business phone numbers and logos are permissible; however, the words "Emergency Medical Services" or "EMS" shall not be used in any fashion.
- 4. Grantee shall submit to the Fire Chief or designee the Grantee's Medical Equipment checklist for approval. Grantor shall conduct the required vehicle inspection with said checklist to ensure that Grantee meets state and local requirements. Changes to Grantee's medical equipment as listed on the checklist shall be submitted to the Fire Chief or designee within fifteen days prior to the change to be in effect.
- 5. Grantee to Comply with Most Comprehensive Requirements. Grantee shall comply at the time of inspection or re-inspection with the supply and medical equipment list required

in this ordinance or by the Texas Department of State Health Services, whichever is more comprehensive.

# L. Operational Requirements

- 1. Permits. Grantee shall obtain and maintain, at its own expense, all required permits necessary for the operation of Grantee's service under applicable laws and the terms of this franchise.
- 2. Lights and Sirens. Grantee shall not avail himself of the permission given ambulances to disregard traffic laws except in those instances as expressly permitted under federal, state or local laws and with the permission of the Fire Department as may be granted upon a case-by-case basis.
- 3. Transportation and Treatment Decisions. Transportation and treatment decisions shall be made in accordance with Grantee's established policies and in accordance with the usual and customary medical practices of the medical community.
- 4. Treatment Protocols and Transfer Policies. Grantee shall file a copy of its treatment protocols and transfer policies with the Fire Chief and shall forward any changes in such protocols or procedures no less than five (5) working days prior to implementation of same.
- 5. Dispatcher's Responsibilities. Grantee's Dispatchers shall make reasonable efforts to determine if a request for service is an emergency or non-emergency. Upon receipt of a request for emergency service within the City limits of El Paso, or if Grantee responds to a call within the City limits that in good faith was taken as a non-emergency and then upon arrival it is determined that the call is an emergency, the call shall be immediately relayed by Grantee to EPFD Communications via radio or, if necessary, Grantee shall relay the call via 911 or 915-832-4429. EPFD will either elect to respond to the call or give Grantee permission to handle the incident.
- 6. Response to Emergency Situations. Unless authorized to do so by the Fire Chief or his designee, Grantee, its agents, or its employees, shall not knowingly go to the scene of an emergency within the City limits of El Paso with the intent to provide emergency service and transportation; provided, however, if Grantee discovers an emergency situation within the City limits of El Paso it shall immediately notify the EPFD Communications via EPFD radio and shall remain to render aid until an EPFD vehicle arrives or may transport if instructed to do so per EPFD Communications via EPFD radio. Such aid must be comprehensive and at the maximum level allowed for those personnel by the Grantee's medical director.
- 7. Uniforms. Grantee's employees shall be required to wear uniforms while performing duties associated with the transportation and care of a customer. Uniform style and color provided by Grantee shall have the prior written approval of the Fire Chief and shall not resemble the uniform of the Fire Department.
- 8. Representation as EMT. Neither Grantee nor its employees shall hold out to the public in any manner that they are trained Emergency Medical Technicians or Paramedics

unless they have been so certified by the Texas Department of State Health Services, Emergency Medical Services Division.

- 9. EMT to Attend Customer. All patient care and transport decisions are the responsibility of the highest medically trained and highest credentialed person on the scene. After a complete patient assessment and if the patient is stable, patient will be attended by the most appropriate certified EMT. In the event of an emergency situation, Grantee shall adhere to Article II.L.6 of this Franchise.
- 10. Ambulance for Customer Transport Only. Ambulances shall be used only for the purpose of transporting customers.

### ARTICLE III. ADMINISTRATION AND REGULATIONS

## A. State-Issued EMS Provider License

- 1. State License to Be Filed with City. Before commencing operations under this franchise, Grantee shall file with the City Clerk and the Fire Chief, a copy of its EMS Provider License as issued by the State of Texas, Department of State Health Services.
- 2. Suspension, Revocation, Non-Renewal of State License. Should Grantee's state-issued EMS Provider License be suspended, revoked or not renewed by the State of Texas, Grantee shall not operate any ambulance upon the streets, alleys or public rights-of-way within the City of El Paso until such time as Grantee's EMS Provider License is reinstated or renewed by the State of Texas. Grantee shall immediately notify the Fire Chief of any suspension, revocation, or non-renewal of its state-issued EMS Provider License.
- 3. Termination of Franchise Where Grantee Not Licensed by State. The basis set forth by the State of Texas for the suspension, revocation, or non-renewal of Grantee's EMS Provider License shall constitute a reasonable basis for the cancellation, termination or revocation of this franchise by the City of El Paso.

#### B. Rates

- 1. Grantee's Rates. The Mayor and City Council hereby approve the schedule of maximum rates attached hereto as "Exhibit A" and by reference made a part hereof. Any increase to the listed rates under this franchise shall be subject to the prior approval of the Mayor and City Council before being assessed to any patient or client by Grantee. Grantee shall indicate where any discounts to third parties have been given when providing its payment to the City.
- 2. Rates for EPFD-directed Emergency Response. Whenever the Grantee shall be directed by the Fire Chief to respond to an emergency as permitted by this franchise or other applicable law, the Grantee shall charge the City of El Paso rates established in the City's Budget Resolution or other resolution appropriately adopted by the El Paso City Council for Grantee's services provided to this franchise, instead of the rates listed for emergency response in the attached "Exhibit A". The discounts referenced in Article III, B.1 above are not applicable to EPFD-directed emergency response.

- 3. Special Segments: The following shall be handled as stated below:
  - a. Long Distance. Long Distance transport fee shall only include the base rate and shall exclude mileage from the computation.
  - b. Airport Transfer. For calls that originate in the City of El Paso and request transfer to the El Paso International Airport the fee shall only include the base rate and shall exclude mileage from the computation.
  - c. Special Events. Special events shall be billed only when an actual transport is required to an El Paso hospital from a special event and shall include both the base rate and the mileage.

# C. <u>Grantee's Office and Telephone Number</u>

The Grantee shall, at its own cost, maintain an office within the City, which shall be open during all usual business hours, have a publicly-listed telephone with a locally accessible number and sufficient lines and be operated so that complaints and requests for billing or adjustments shall be received on a twenty-four (24) hour basis.

# D. <u>Billing Statements</u>

- 1. Franchising Authority Identified. Grantee's billing statements shall include the Grantee's proper phone number and street address for its El Paso office and shall identify the City as Grantee's franchising authority as follows: Franchising Authority: City of El Paso, Attn: Fire Department, Community Health Program, 416 N. Stanton, Ste. 200, El Paso, Texas 79901.
- 2. Complaints May Be Sent to City of El Paso. Grantee shall include in each of its billing statements a notice to its clients and patients that copies of complaints may be forwarded to the Grantee's franchising authority, the City of El Paso.

#### E. <u>Customer Complaints</u>

- 1. Complaint Procedure shall, in addition to the requirements mandated elsewhere in this franchise, establish procedures for receiving, acting upon, and resolving complaints. A copy of the most current procedures shall be filed with the Fire Chief. The Grantee shall furnish a notice of such procedures to its patients and clients on each of its billing statements.
- 2. Complaint Logs. The Grantee shall keep a log, which will indicate the name of the complainant, the name of the customer (if different from the complainant), the nature of each complaint, the date and time it was received, the disposition of said complaint and the time and date thereof. This log shall be made available for periodic inspection by representatives of the City.
- 3. Retention of Complaint Logs. All complaint entries shall be retained on file for a period of two (2) years from the date the complaint entry was made.

- 4. Multiple complaints City-ordered Investigation, Analysis and Report. When similar complaints are filed or when other evidence exists which casts doubt on the reliability or quality of Grantee's service, the City shall have the right to require the Grantee to investigate, analyze, and report on the performance of the transfer service and the personnel involved. Such report shall be delivered to the City no later than fourteen (14) days after the City formally notifies the Grantee and shall include, at a minimum, the following information: the nature of the complaints which precipitated the investigation; the equipment used in rendering services; the procedures employed in rendering services to the complainant or patient; a narrative of the incident and the resulting outcome; and the method by which said complaints were resolved.
- 5. City May Conduct Own Investigation. The City may conduct its own investigation, analysis and draft reports regarding the Grantee's customer service. The City may also require that an investigation, analysis and report be conducted or supervised by an independent health care professional with demonstrated knowledge and understanding of appropriate EPFD and Medical Transfer procedures and protocols and who is not on the permanent staff of the Grantee.
- 6. Selection of Independent Health Care Professional. An independent health care professional shall be selected by the Grantee from a list of no less than two persons or firms nominated by the City of El Paso through its Fire Chief. Should Grantee fail to select an independent health care professional from the list of nominees within ten days after receiving the notice identifying the nominees, the City shall be entitled to select the independent health care professional and such selection shall be final. The aforesaid professional shall sign all reports of the investigation and analysis and shall forward the report, including such records as necessary to properly interpret the results of the investigation and analysis, to the City or other designated City representative. The report shall recommend actions to be taken by the Grantee and the City. The reasonable costs of such independent investigation shall be paid by the Grantee is operating in accordance with all performance standards and requirements of this franchise, all costs for such independent investigation shall be paid by the City.
- 7. Basis for Investigation. The City shall require investigations, analyses, and reports when and under such circumstances as the City has reasonable grounds to believe a) that the health or welfare of the public may be at risk or b) that Grantee's level of service does not meet or comply with the standards of care and service which are customary in the emergency medical profession or which are required by federal, state, or local laws.
- F. HHS PRIVACY REGULATIONS. The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information (Privacy Rule), as amended by the HITECH Act and regulations promulgated thereunder by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, and any subsequent amendments or modifications thereto (collectively, "HIPAA"); see 45 CFR Part 160 and Subparts A and E of Part 164, requires that Grantee offer assurances to the City that the Grantee will safeguard any protected health information received or created on behalf of the City. Pursuant to this requirement, the following is set forth:

- 1. **Definitions**. The following terms shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this Section. Other capitalized terms shall have the meaning ascribed to them in the context in which they first appear, or as provided in (1)(h) to this Section.
  - a. **Agreement** shall refer to this document.
  - b. **Business Associate** means Grantee.
  - c. **HHS Privacy Regulations** shall mean the Code of Federal Regulations ("C.F.R.") at Title 45, Sections 160 and 164, in effect, or as amended.
  - d. **Individual** shall mean the person who is the subject of the Information, and has the same meaning as the term "individual" is defined in 45 C.F.R. 164.503.
  - e. **Information** shall mean any "health information" provided and/or made available by the CITY to BUSINESS ASSOCIATE, and has the same meaning as the term "health information" as defined by 45 C.F.R. 160.103.
  - f. **Parties** shall mean the CITY and BUSINESS ASSOCIATE.
  - g. **Secretary** shall mean the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services ("HHS") and any other officer or employee of HHS to whom the authority involved has been delegated.
  - h. Catch-all definition: The following terms used in this Agreement shall have the same meaning as those terms in the HIPAA Privacy, Security, Breach Notification and Enforcement Rules at 45 C.F.R. Part 160 and 164, in effect, or as amended: breach, data aggregation, designated record set, disclosure, health care operations, protected health information, required by law, subcontractor, and use.
- 2. Limits on Use and Disclosure Established by Terms of Agreement. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE hereby agrees that it shall be prohibited from using or disclosing the Information provided or made available by the CITY for any other purpose other than as expressly permitted or required by this Agreement (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2).)
- 3. **Stated Purposes for which BUSINESS ASSOCIATE May Use or Disclose Information.** The Parties hereby agree that BUSINESS ASSOCIATE shall be permitted to use and/or disclose Information provided or made available from CITY for the following stated purposes:

  To provide ambulance, public health, and related support services (service) to the community of the CITY for the mutual benefit and general welfare of BUSINESS ASSOCIATE and the CITY (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(2)(i); 65 Fed. Reg. 82505.)
- 4. Use of Information for Management, Administrative and Legal Responsibilities. BUSINESS ASSOCIATE is permitted to use Information if necessary for the proper management and administration of BUSINESS

ASSOCIATE or to carry out legal responsibilities of BUSINESS ASSOCIATE. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(4)(i)(A-B)).

- 5. **Disclosure of Information for Management, Administration and Legal Responsibilities.** BUSINESS ASSOCIATE is permitted to disclose Information received from CITY for the proper management and administration of BUSINESS ASSOCIATE or to carry out legal responsibilities of BUSINESS ASSOCIATE, provided:
  - a. The disclosure is required by law; or
  - b. The BUSINESS ASSOCIATE obtains reasonable assurances from the person to whom the information is disclosed that it will be held confidentially and used or further disclosed only as required by law or for the purposes for which it was disclosed to the person, the person will use appropriate safeguards to prevent use or disclosure of the information, and the person immediately notifies the BUSINESS ASSOCIATE of any instance of which it is aware in which the confidentiality of the information has been breached. (ref. 45 C.F.R. 164.504(e)(4)(ii)).

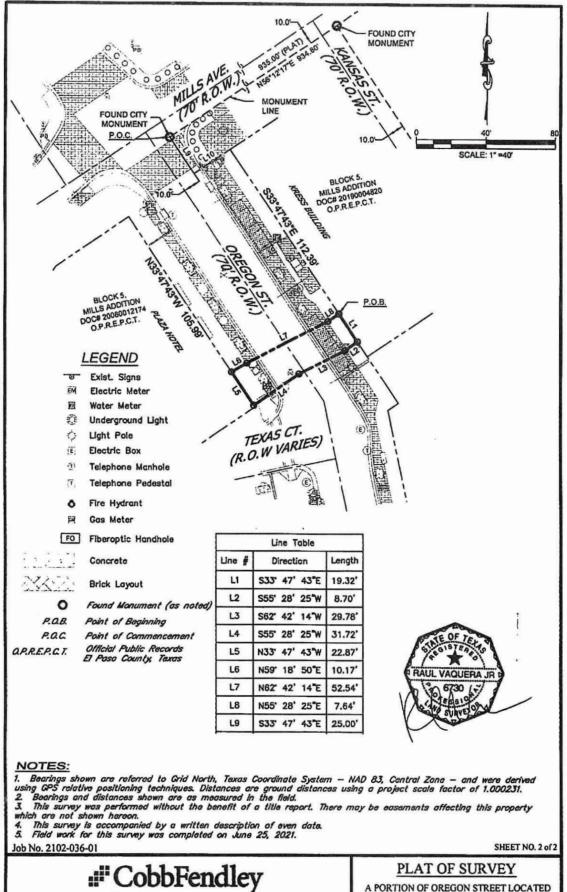

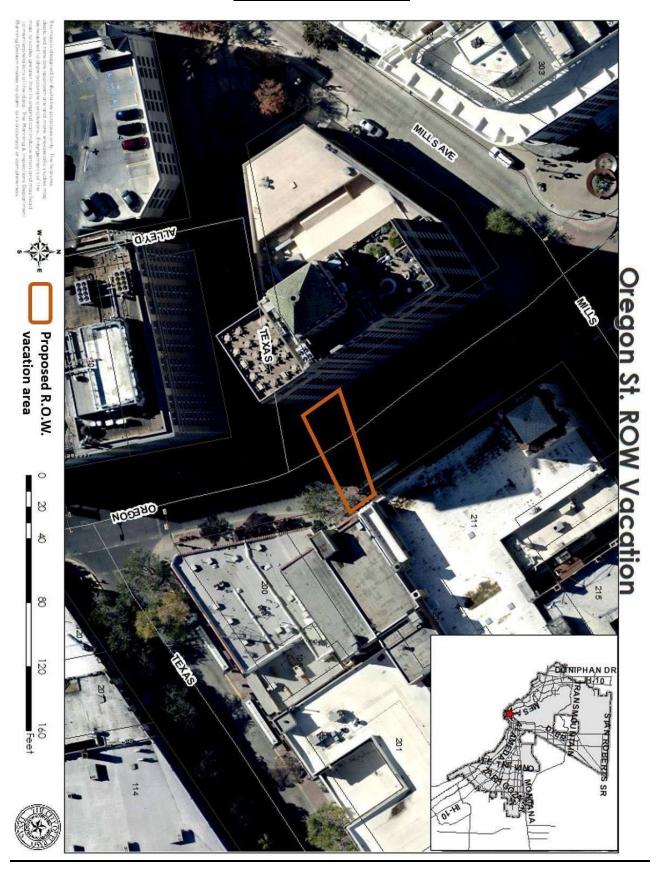

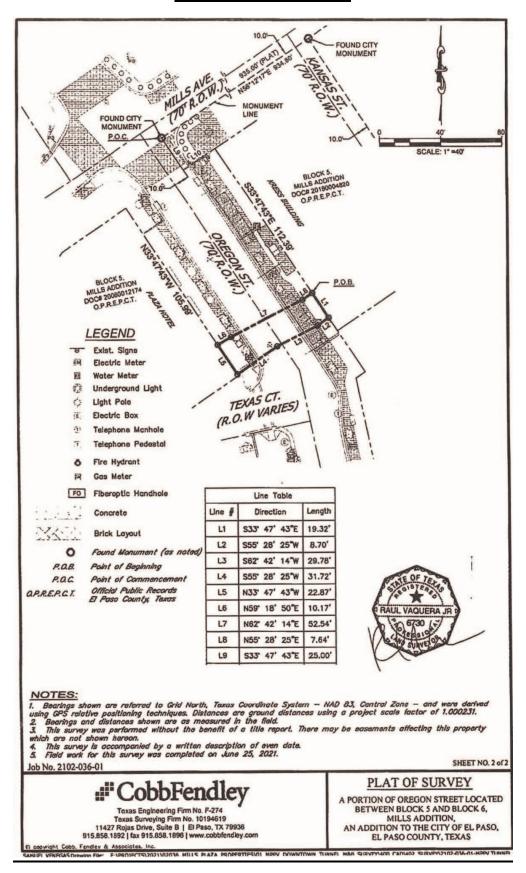

### Planning and Inspections Department- Planning Division

Staff recommends approval. The surface roadway must be maintained for vehicular and pedestrian traffic. In addition, the City of El Paso must have access for maintenance to the roadway and all other surface level improvements. Note AT&T, El Paso Water, and El Paso Electric comments regarding continued coordination and in retaining access and utility/drainage easements.

#### AT&T

AT&T has no objection subject to continue coordination and a utility easement is granted for existing structure that would not require relocation.

### **El Paso Water**

EPWater does not object to the vacation subject to continued coordination with the applicant on the final water/sewer/stormwater to address the outstanding comments. \*Utility and drainage easement is to be retained.

### El Paso Electric

If EPE existing facilities need to be relocated, then the customer will need to coordinate with our Distribution Engineering Department.

EPE will retain an easement right for any lines we have: "A utility easement along the entire roadway/alleyway will remain in favor of El Paso Electric Company and their successors and assigns for the infrastructure in existence in the roadway/alleyway on the date of this vacating ordinance. The rights granted by this utility easement include rights of access, operation, inspection, repair, replacement with like-kind infrastructure, removal, and maintenance by El Paso Electric Company and their successors and assigns."

### Planning and Inspections Department-Land Development Division

We have reviewed subject plats and recommend Approval.

The Developer/Engineer shall address the following comments.

1. No objections to proposed right-of-way vacation. All comments made in 5 day review were addressed in Packet Documents.

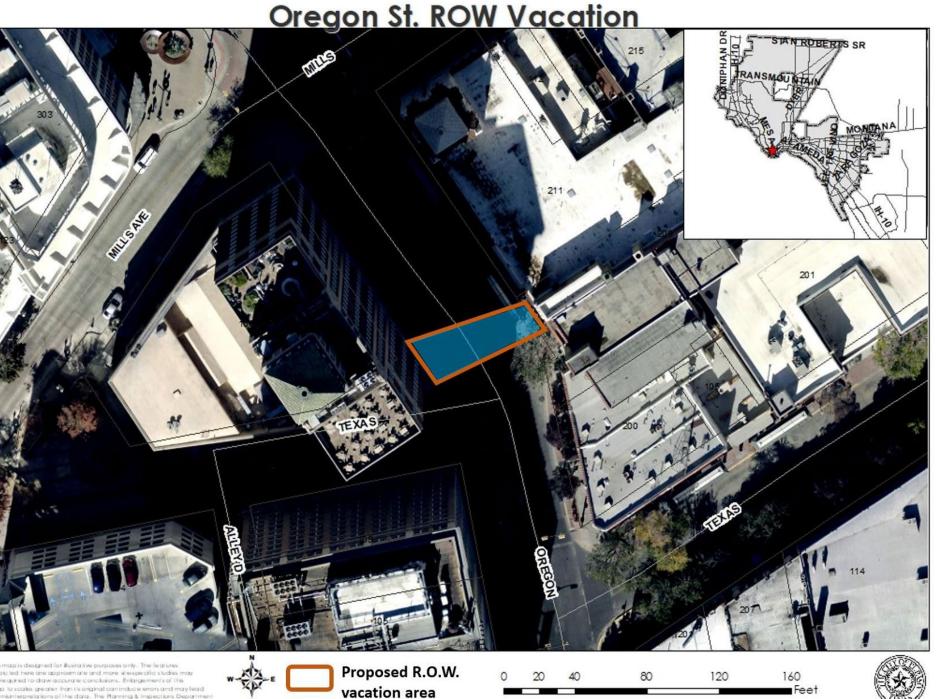

- As of August 25, 2022 the Planning Division has not received any communications in support nor opposition to the request.



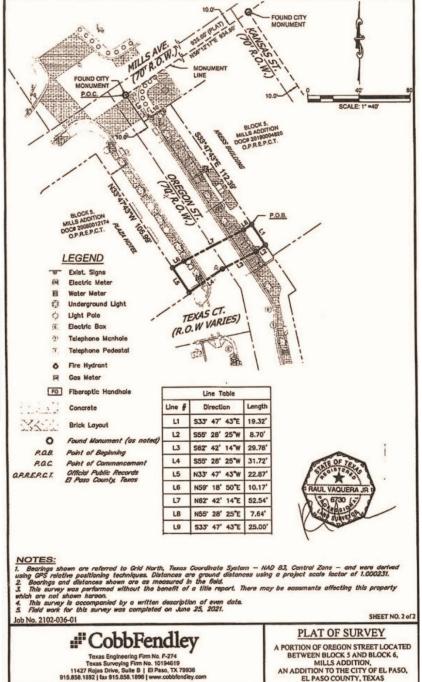
