Effective as of July 20, 2023



MISSION AND SCOPE OF WORK

The mission of the Internal Audit Department is to provide independent, objective assurance and consulting services designed to add value and improve the City of El Paso's operations. The Internal Audit Department helps the management team of the City of El Paso accomplish its objectives by bringing a systematic, disciplined approach to evaluate and improve the effectiveness of risk management, control, and governance processes.

The scope of work of the Internal Audit Department is to determine whether the organization's network of risk management, control, and governance processes, as designed and represented by management, is adequate and functioning in a manner to ensure:

- Risks are appropriately identified and managed.
- Interaction with the various governance groups occurs as needed.
- Significant financial, managerial, and operating information is accurate, reliable, and timely.
- Employee's actions are in compliance with policies, standards, procedures, and applicable laws and regulations.
- Resources are acquired economically, used efficiently, and adequately protected.
- Programs, plans, and objectives are achieved.
- Quality and continuous improvement are fostered in the organization's control process.
- Significant legislative or regulatory issues impacting the organization are recognized and addressed properly.
- Opportunities for improving management control, accountability, and the organization's image may be identified during audits. These opportunities will be communicated to the appropriate level of management.

ACCOUNTABILITY

The Chief Internal Auditor (CIA), in the discharge of his/her duties, shall be accountable to the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee ("FOAC") to:

- Provide annually an assessment on the adequacy and effectiveness of the City of El Paso's processes for controlling its activities and managing its risks in the areas set forth under the mission and scope of work.
- Report significant issues related to the processes for controlling the activities of the City of El Paso, including potential improvements to those processes, and provide information concerning such issues through resolution.
- Provide quarterly updates on the status and results of the Annual Audit Plan and the sufficiency of department resources to the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee.
- Coordinate with and provide oversight if requested of other control and monitoring functions (risk management, compliance, security, legal, ethics, environmental, external audit).
- Notify the appropriate regulatory, law enforcement, and legal authorities of any
 potential criminal audit findings after the City Manager, the Financial Oversight
 and Audit Committee, and the City Attorney have been notified about such
 pending action.

<u>INDEPENDENCE</u>

The Internal Audit Department shall remain free of influence by any element in the organization, including matters of audit selection, scope, procedures, frequency, timing, or report content to permit maintenance of an independent and objective mental attitude necessary in rendering reports.

To provide for the independence of the internal audit activity, its personnel report to the CIA who reports operationally to the Chairman of the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee and legislatively to the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee in a manner outlined in the above section on Accountability. The City Manager shall be responsible for the implementation of any audit recommendations for changes to City administrative procedures and operations as recommended by the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee and approved by Council via Resolution.

RESPONSIBILITY

The CIA and staff of the internal audit activity have responsibility to:

- Develop a flexible Annual Audit Plan using appropriate risk-based methodology, including any risks or control concerns identified by management, and submit that plan to the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee for review and recommendation subject to final approval by Council.
- Implement the Annual Audit Plan, as approved, including, as appropriate, any special tasks or projects requested by management and the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee and subject to final approval by Council.
- Issue quarterly reports to the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee, and City Council summarizing results of audit findings and special projects.
- Establish a system to follow-up on reported audit findings. The intent of this responsibility is to ensure that past audit findings are satisfactorily resolved.
- Maintain a professional audit staff with sufficient knowledge, skills, experience, and professional certifications to meet the requirements of this charter as authorized by City Council.
- Report to the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee a regular annual report on Internal Audit Department's staffing level and subject to final approval by Council.
- Establish a Quality Assurance Program by which the CIA assures the quality of operations of the Internal Audit Department activities.
- Report to the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee the results of the Quality Assurance and Improvement "Peer Review" conducted every three (3) years.
- Perform consulting services, beyond internal auditing's assurance services, to assist management in meeting its objectives. Examples may include facilitation, reviewing process design, training, and advisory services.
- Evaluate and assess significant merging/consolidating functions and new or changing services, processes, operations, and control processes coincident with the development, implementation, and/or expansion of City operations.



- Keep the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee informed of emerging trends and successful practices in internal auditing.
- Provide copies of all Audit Reports to the entire City Council.
- Provide a report of significant measurement goals and results to the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee.
- Assist in the investigation of significant issues, including suspected fraudulent activities, within the City of El Paso and notify the City Manager, the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee, and the City Attorney of the results before reporting to the whole of Council, including recommended action(s); subject to Council approval.
- Consider the scope of work of the external auditors and regulators, as appropriate, for the purpose of providing optimal audit coverage to the City of El Paso at a reasonable overall cost.
- Provide the following nonaudit services:
 - o Administer the City of El Paso Anonymous Employee Hotline,
 - o Coordinate Hotel Occupancy Tax Audits,
 - o Conduct Sales Tax Discovery Audits,
 - o Conduct Franchise Fee Audits, in coordination with the Chief Financial Officer,
 - o Serve as the Contract Administrator for Sales Tax Analysis & Reporting Service (STARS).

AUTHORITY

The CIA and staff of the Internal Audit Department are authorized to:

- Have unrestricted access to all functions, records, property, and personnel of the City of El Paso.
- Have full and unrestricted access to the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee.
- Allocate resources, set frequencies, select subjects, determine scopes of work, and apply audit techniques required to accomplish audit objectives.
- Obtain the necessary assistance of personnel within city departments of the City of El Paso where they perform audits, as well as other specialized services from within or outside the City of El Paso.



The CIA and staff of the Internal Audit Department are not authorized to:

- Perform any operational duties for the City of El Paso or its affiliates.
- Initiate or approve accounting transactions external to the Internal Audit Department.
- Direct the activities of any City of El Paso employee not employed by the Internal Audit Department, except to the extent such employees have been appropriately assigned to auditing teams or to otherwise assist the internal auditors.

PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS

The Internal Audit Department will meet or exceed the mandatory guidance contained within the <u>International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing</u> of the Institute of Internal Auditors and the <u>Generally Accepted Government Auditing</u> <u>Standards</u> (GAGAS) of the United States Government Accountability Office.

The Internal Auditing Staff shall govern themselves by adherence to The Institute of Internal Auditors' "Code of Ethics" and the United States Government Accountability Offices' "Ethical Principles."

AMENDMENT OF THE CHARTER

The Chief Internal Auditor is responsible for maintenance of this Internal Audit Charter to ensure that it is reviewed annually and is revised as necessary. Any amendment is subject to review and recommendation by the City Attorney before consideration and approval by the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee.

EXECUTIVE ENDORSEMENT OF THE INTERNAL AUDIT CHARTER

The Internal Audit Charter is the formal document that specifies the Internal Audit Department's authority and responsibilities. The charter is important to management, the activity being audited, and audit staff. Our endorsement of the Internal Audit Charter underscores the importance of the Internal Audit Department's mission. We ask for your continued cooperation as our internal auditors fulfill their important responsibility to the City of El Paso.

FY2023-2024 Audit Plan

Prepared by the Internal Audit Department September 1, 2023

OVERVIEW

In accordance with <u>The Institute of Internal Auditors' International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing</u>, Standard 2010 – Planning, the Internal Audit Department has prepared a risk-based Audit Plan for Fiscal Year 2023-2024. The Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Audit Plan is a description of the internal audit activities that will be performed by the Internal Audit Department during the Fiscal Year.

By periodically reporting the Internal Audit Department's actions to the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee (FOAC) and City Manager's Office, the Internal Audit Department helps support the City of El Paso's Strategic Plan Goals 6.6 and 6.8;

- Goal 6.6: Ensure continued financial stability and accountability through sound financial management, budgeting and reporting.
- Goal 6.8: Support transparent and inclusive government.

The process of preparing the Audit Plan included identifying those areas that are considered the most important and ensuring that activities with the greatest risk are audited. The Financial Oversight and Audit Committee will review and approve the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Audit Plan subject to final approval by City Council. Members of the Financial Oversight and Audit Committee provided input, as did the Department Directors and Managing Directors, where appropriate. The Financial Oversight and Audit Committee (FOAC) is comprised of the following members:

- Brian Kennedy, Representative District 1 FOAC Chair
- Alexsandra Annello Representative District 2
- Joe Molinar, Representative District 4
- Art Fierro, Representative District 6

IDENTIFICATION OF THE AUDIT UNIVERSE AND RISK ASSESSMENT

The Institute of Internal Auditors' International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing requires that Internal Auditors develop an Audit Plan based on the assignment of risk. The Audit Universe is a subjective assessment of auditable areas within the City of El Paso. To identify the Audit Universe, we reviewed the City's Organizational Chart, prior Audit Plans, the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report, and prior Risk Assessments. The auditable areas were broken down into eight distinct areas:

- 1. Mayor & City Council
- 2. City Manager
- 3. City Attorney's Office
- 4. City of El Paso Employee's Retirement Trust
- 5. Senior DCM Economic Development & Tourism
- 6. DCM Public Safety
- 7. DCM Support & Financial Services
- 8. DCM Quality of Life

The following describes our planning process used to prepare the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Audit Plan. The Audit Plan can be found as **Attachment 1**.

The Audit Universe for the City of El Paso was identified by separating the Operational, Administrative, and Executive Management functions within the City of El Paso. The Risk Assessment was designed to measure certain risk factors necessary for the City of El Paso to meet its Mission, Strategic Plan, and its Goals and Objectives. Our goal is to provide reasonable assurance that the concept of risk-based auditing was practiced. The risk factors used were:

- <u>Management Interest</u> Interest by management to have an area audited due to operational or internal control concerns.
- <u>Budget Risk</u> The risk that the City of El Paso's annual budget will be severely affected by factors that are not planned for or anticipated.
- <u>Strategic Risk</u> The risk that poor business decisions or improper implementation of strategic goals will reduce the City of El Paso's ability to meet those goals.
- Reputation Risk The risk that the City of El Paso's public image will be tarnished due to improper actions on the part of officials, management, or staff.
- <u>Compliance Risk</u> The risk that failure to comply with laws and regulations, prudent ethical standards, and contractual obligations will harm the City of El Paso.
- <u>High Level of Decentralization</u> The risk of internal control breakdowns due to the size of large-scale departments or operations.
- <u>Legal Claims</u> The risk of the legal claims being filed against City departments while conducting their core operations.
- <u>Time Last Audited</u> The risk that certain high risks areas within the City of El Paso are not audited on a periodic basis.
- <u>Change in Management</u> The risk of new management being assigned to an area identified in the Audit Universe.

The Annual Risk Assessment can be found as Attachment 2.

SCOPE OF AUDITS

The Institute of Internal Auditor's International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing addresses the scope of work as follows:

- Review the <u>reliability and integrity of financial and operational information</u> and the means used to identify, measure, classify, and report such information.
- Review the systems established to ensure **compliance** with those policies, plans, procedures, laws, and regulations that could have a significant impact on operations and reports.
- Review the means of <u>safeguarding assets</u> and as appropriate verify the existence of such assets.
- Appraise the <u>effectiveness and efficiency</u> of operations within the organization.
- Review <u>operations or programs</u> to ascertain whether results are consistent with established goals and objectives, and whether the operations or programs are being implemented or performed as intended.

In addition, audits are completed under the guidance of the <u>U.S. Government Accountability Office's Generally Accepted Government Auditing Standards (GAGAS)</u>. GAGAS provides a framework for conducting high quality government audits with Competence, Integrity, Objectivity, and Independence. These standards are for use by Auditors of government entities and entities that receive government awards. GAGAS contain requirements and guidance dealing with Ethics, Independence, Auditors' Professional Competence and Judgment, Quality Control, the Performance of Field work, and Reporting. Audits performed under GAGAS provide information used for oversight, accountability, and improvements of government programs and operations. GAGAS contains requirements and guidance to assist Auditors in objectively acquiring and evaluating sufficient, appropriate evidence and reporting the results. When Auditors perform their work in this manner and comply with GAGAS in reporting the results, their work can lead to improved government management, better decision making and oversight, effective and efficient operations, and accountability for resources and results.

BUDGET AND STAFFING

The Available Audit Hours Budget for the Internal Audit Department was prepared in accordance with the City of El Paso's wage and hour guidelines and approved by the City Council.

For Fiscal Year 2023-2024, the Internal Audit Department will be staffed with 8 full-time staff members as per the Staffing Table approved by the City Council. The staff currently consists of the:

- Chief Internal Auditor,
- One Audit Manager,
- Two Auditor IV,
- One Auditor III,
- One Auditor II, and
- Two Auditor I.

Staff development continues to be a strategic goal of the Internal Audit Department. Staff members have been encouraged to attend professional training opportunities offered by the:

- Institute of Internal Auditors (IIA),
- Association of Local Government Auditors (ALGA),
- Association of Government Accountants (AGA),

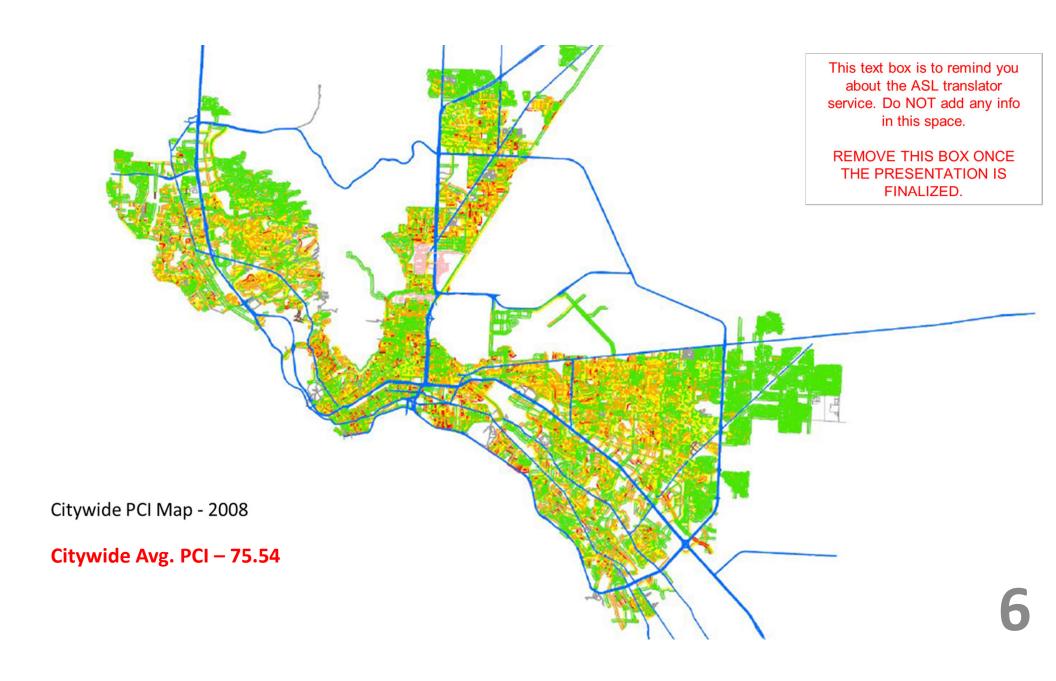

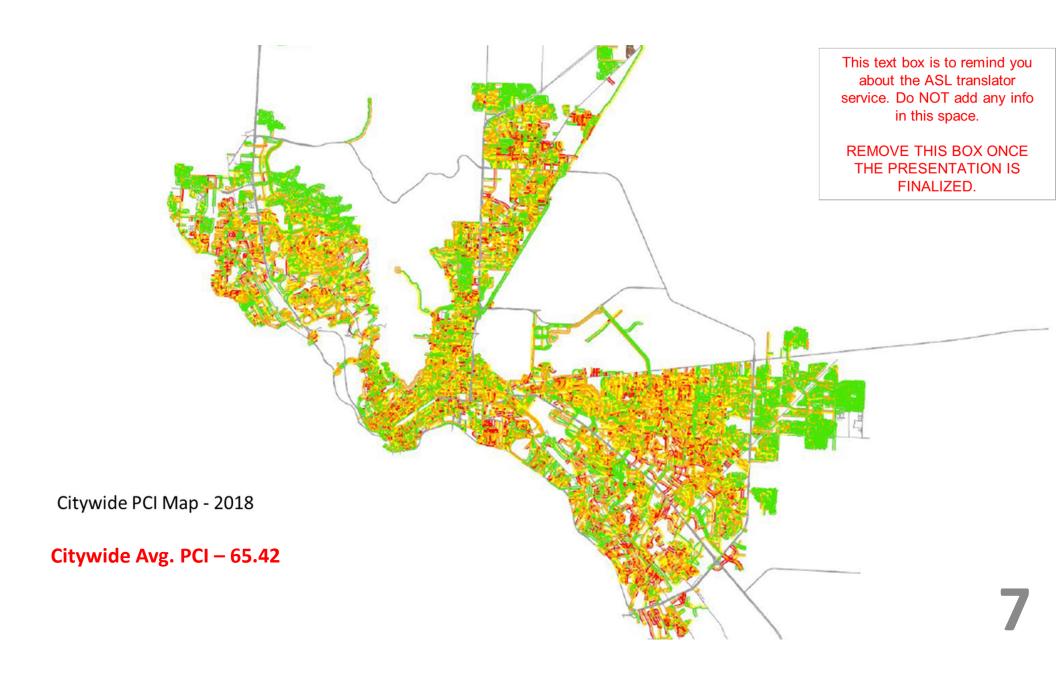

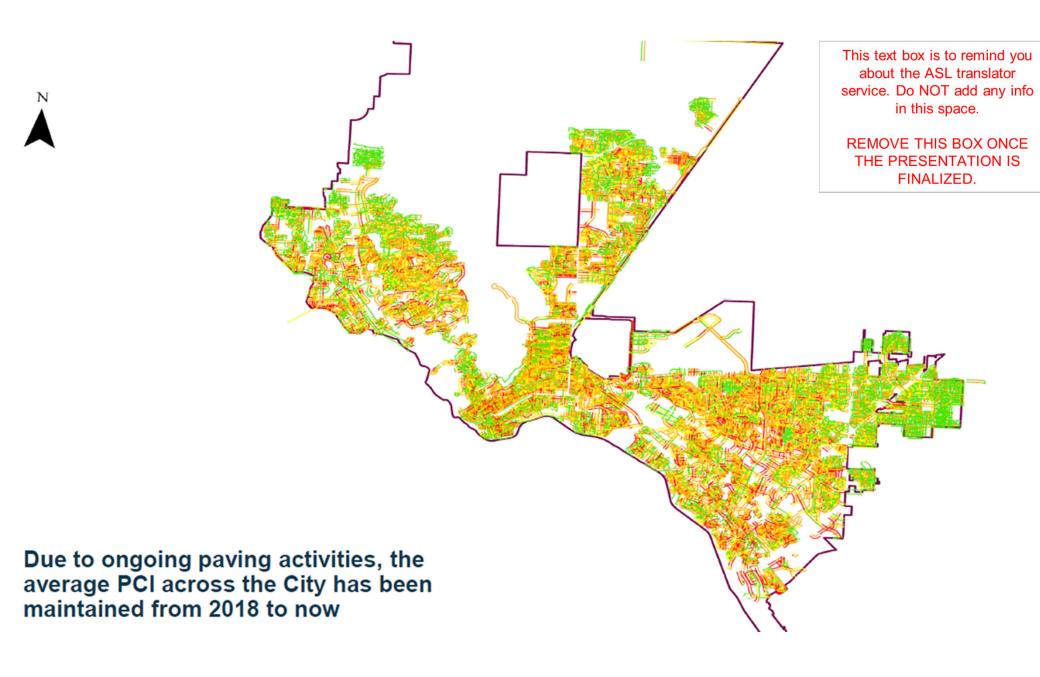

- January 30, 2023 Street locations for Two Year Rollout Plan for Resurfacing - FY2024 and FY2025 - approved at City Council
- Contracts were Solicited in Fall/Winter 2022/23; Bids Opened in Winter 2023
- Bid protests and legal challenges created delays requiring us to revise the Roll Out plan
- As of Sept 2023 we have three active resurfacing contracts in full operation

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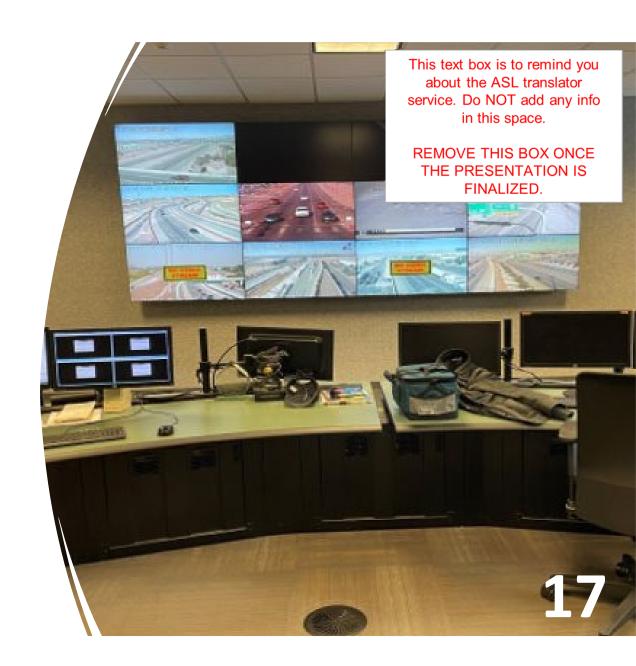

Traffic Management Center (TMC) and Traffic Signal System Upgrade

Traffic Management Center and Traffic Signal System Upgrade

- The City is currently entering into a multi-year project that will upgrade the City's Traffic Management Center (TMC) and Traffic Signal System
- The funding for the project was secured through the MPO
- The Traffic Management Center, located at 7968 San Paulo and is the Control Center for our signalization system
- The upgrade will include upgrades of the TMC and 760 Signalized Intersections; signal control system, traffic cabinets, detection cameras, and communications infrastructure



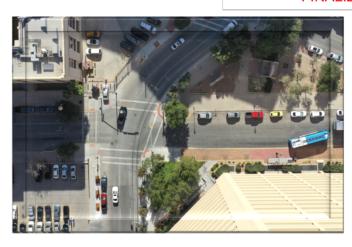

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- The new Traffic Signal Control System will be a real-time multi-tasking operating system – Al adaptive capabilities within pre-set parameters (the system can detect congestion and automatically implement appropriate incident timing)
- Will have ability to hold more timing/progression plans to accommodate future's complex traffic signal needs (presently can hold 12 Incident plans to manage traffic in the event of emergencies – new systems hold up to 48)
- Pre-defined Flashing Yellow Arrow (FYA) setting, popular feature that is replacing the traditional left-turn protected & permissive signal phase (Copia/Montana was first one in City)
- System will also be pre-defined for HAWK System and Texas Diamond interchange

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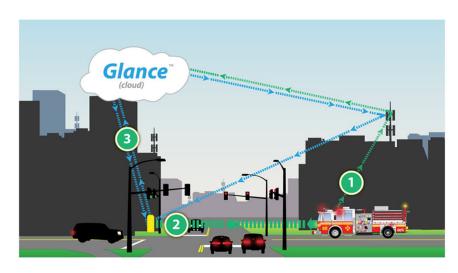


Preemption and Priority Systems

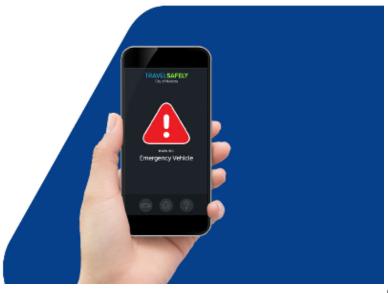
The moment a route starts, the in-vehicle unit uses a cellular signal to alert Glance of the emergency call.

2. Preempt

Glance processes the route and communicates wirelessly with the traffic cabinet to clear traffic ahead of the vehicle's arrival.

3. Adapt

Glance monitors route progress in real time and dynamically adapts preemption requests as the situation changes.

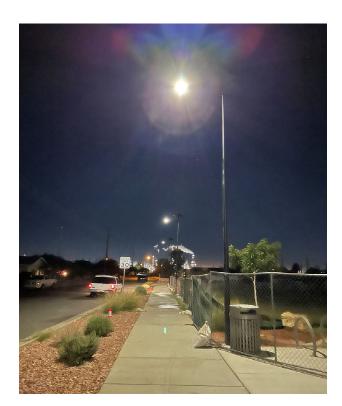

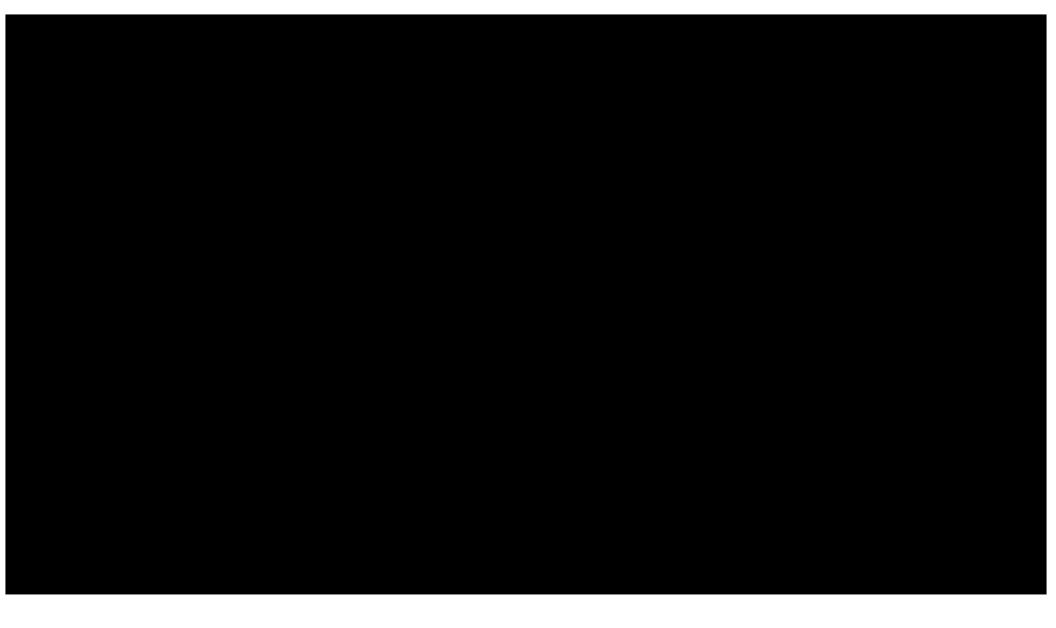

Discussion and action on the amendments directed by the City Council to City Code chapter 2.92.080 to require additional disclosures regarding contributions or donations from individuals or business entities receiving a benefit from the City, 2.92.120, 2.92.130(A)(5) and 2.92.160(B) to include jurisdiction over candidates, political committees and individuals or business entities in certain circumstances, 2.92.160(C) to include that the Chief Internal Auditor reports to the Council, 2.92.170(A) to adjust the time for response to be due to 14 days after the City Attorney refers a complaint to the commission and 2.92.200(D) to authorize the commission to issue a fine of up to \$500.

BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION:

The amendments to Chapter 2.92 include amending the sections to include adding reporting requirements for when someone who has contributed to a council member is receiving a benefit from a council decision on an agenda, jurisdiction over candidates, political committees and individuals of business entities in certain circumstances, include the chief internal auditor, adjust the time for response to be due 14 days after the City Attorney refers a complaint to the commission, and lastly, authorize the commission to issue a fine up to \$500.

The Financing of Election Campaigns Cross Functional Team presented the redlined chapter with the amendments mentioned above to the Ethics Commission on October 30, 2023. The Ethics Commission voted on recommendations to the redlines presented. The CFT will be presenting the recommendations received by the Ethics Commission.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 2 (ADMINISTRATION AND PERSONNEL), CHAPTER 2.92 (ETHICS), TO AMEND THE FOLLOWING: SECTION 2.92.080 (DISCLOSURE OF CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS) TO REQUIRE ADDITIONAL DISCLOSURES REGARDING CONTRIBUTIONS OR DONATIONS FROM INDIVIDUALS OR BUSINESS ENTITIES RECEIVING A THE CITY; SECTIONS 2.92.120 (JURISDICTION), BNEFIT FROM SUBSECTION 2.92.130(A)(5) (DUTIES) AND SUBSECTION 2.92.160(B) (FILING A COMPLAINT) TO INCLUDE JURISDICTION OVER AND PROCESS FOR COMPLAINTS REGARDING CANDIDATES, POLITICAL COMMITTEES AND **INDIVIDUALS** OR **BUSINESS ENTITIES** IN **CERTAIN** CIRCUMSTANCS: SECTION 2.92.160(C) (FILING A COMPLAINT). TO INCLUDE THE CHIEF INTERNAL AUDITOR AS REPORTING TO THE COUNCIL; SECTION 2.92.170(A) (COMPLAINT REVIEW) TO AMEND THE TIME PERIOD FOR RESPONSE TO AN ETHICS COMPLAINT; AND SECTION 2.92.200 (DISPOSITION) TO INCLUDE A FINE OF UP TO \$500 AS A POSSIBLE SANCTION FOR VIOLATION OF THE ETHICS CODE.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL PASO:

SECTION 1. That El Paso City Code Title 2 (Administration and Personnel), Chapter 2.92 (Ethics), Section 2.92.080 (Disclosure of Campaign Contributions) is hereby amended to read as follows:

2.92.080 - Disclosure of campaign contributions and donations

- A. The following definition applies to these terms as used in this section; Contribution and contributor are as defined in this chapter, and shall include, but not be limited to cash, loans, offsets to expenditures, in-kind contributions—and, donations, and gifts—"Donation" means cash, the value of any in-kind contributions or gifts to the council member for use by their office or in their district. The term "donor" includes an individual and spouse, a business entity, or and individual who owns a business entity in whole or in part, or is operated by the individual, that is the subject of a council agenda item. Benefiting as used in this section shall include but not be limited to any contract, bid award, franchise, permit, zoning or rezoning, and other award that council will vote on.
- B. Reporting of Contributions and Donations by Council member: Council members must verbally disclose any contributions or donations received totaling an aggregate of \$500 or more prior to discussion or vote on any council item benefiting the contributor or donor. This requirement includes any contribution received at any time during the council member's campaign(s) or term(s) of office for city council. Such member shall file a written notation to the City Clerk to be included with the agenda backup documentation. This disclosure

shall be recorded in the minutes of the meeting. If a member of the city council has received campaign contributions from a contributor totaling five hundred dollars or more subsequent to the date that the member last files a campaign finance report pursuant to state law, such member shall disclose the receipt of such contributions to the city council before any deliberation or vote of the city council regarding any matter on a meeting agenda which concerns or relates to the contributor(s) individual, business entity owned in whole or in part or operated by the contributor(s) or which employs the contributor(s), or any other time that the contributor(s) appears to address the council during the meeting.

- C. Reporting of Contributions and Donations by Contributors: No later than one week prior to the relevant Council meeting, a donor or contributor benefiting from an agenda item, and who has contributed or donated an accumulated total of \$500 or more to any current member of City Council or to the City through their office for use by the member's office or in their district at any time during their campaign(s) or term(s) of City office shall notify the City of the amount and to whom. It shall be the responsibility of the contributor or donor to report the contribution so the notice of the contribution is posted on the City Council agenda with the posting for the relevant item.
- D. These is requirements shall apply to all meetings of the city council.
- E. Such disclosure shall be orally made by the member and shall be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.
 - C. If a member of the city council accepts a campaign contribution from a contributor of five hundred dollars or more, he shall report the amount and the donor by an item for notation on the consent agenda of a city council meeting within thirty days of the date of such contribution.
- F. No later than 30 calendar days after the end of each fiscal year, each member of Council shall file a report listing all campaign contributions and donations to the City for use by their office received during that fiscal year, to include the identity of each contributor or donor and total amount from each contributor or donor.
- G. No action of the council which is otherwise legal shall be invalidated merely by reason of the disclosure of a campaign contribution by a member of the city council or the failure of a member to disclose a campaign contribution or donation.

SECTION 2. That El Paso City Code Title 2 (Administration and Personnel), Chapter 2.92 (Ethics), Section 2.92.120 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2.92.120 - Jurisdiction.

The ethics review commission shall have jurisdiction to review alleged violations of Article II (Standards of conduct) of this chapter by officers, <u>candidates</u>, <u>and political committees</u> that

occurred within two years of the complaint being filed. <u>Additionally, the ethics review commission shall have jurisdiction over contributors, individuals and business entities only to review alleged violations of Section 2.92.080 by individuals or business entities who have obligations under that section.</u>

SECTION 3. That El Paso City Code Title 2 (Administration and Personnel), Chapter 2.92 (Ethics), Section 2.92.130, Subsection (A)(5) is hereby amended to read as follows, all other portions and subsections of City Code 2.92.130 remain in full force and effect:

(A)(5). Review, evaluate and issue determinations, impose sanctions and provide recommendations to the city council on complaints regarding officers, <u>candidates</u>, <u>political</u> <u>committees</u>, <u>and for compliance with City Code section 2.92.080, individuals and business</u> entities described therein.

SECTION 4. That El Paso City Code Title 2 (Administration and Personnel), Chapter 2.92 (Ethics), Section 2.92.160, Subsections (B) and (C) are hereby amended to read as follows, all other portions and subsections of City Code 2.92.160 remain in full force and effect:

2.92.160 Filing a complaint.

- B. (1) Any resident of the city (including a member of the ethics review commission) or natural person conducting business with the city who believes an officer, <u>candidate</u>, <u>political committee</u>, has violated Article II of this chapter <u>within the last two years</u>, may file a sworn complaint with the city clerk.
 - (2) Any resident of the city (including a member of the ethics review commission) or natural person conducting business with the city who believes a contributor, individual, or business entity has violated City Code section 2.92.080 within the last two years, may file a sworn complaint with the city clerk.
- C. Any resident of the city (including a member of the ethics review commission) or natural person conducting business with the city who believes the city attorney, or the city manager or the chief internal auditor has violated Article II of this chapter within the last two years, may file a sworn complaint with the mayor and the mayor pro tempore.

SECTION 5. That El Paso City Code Title 2 (Administration and Personnel), Chapter 2.92 (Ethics), Section 2.92.170 (Complaint review), Subsection (A) is hereby amended to read as follows, all other portions and subsections of City Code 2.92.170 remain in full force and effect:

2.92.170 Complaint review.

A. The city clerk will review a filed complaint to ensure it is properly sworn and complete. If the complaint is missing required information, the city clerk will send the complaint back to the complainant through regular mail and/or electronic mail, and the complainant will have twenty-one days to correct the complaint and refile it otherwise the city clerk may reject the complaint. If the complaint is complete the city clerk will forward the complaint to the city attorney and the respondent within seven days. If the City Attorney refers the complaint to

the ethics review commission under subsection 2.92.170(B)(2) below, respondent has fourteen days from notice to respondent of such receipt of the complaint to file a response with the city clerk.

SECTION 6. That El Paso City Code Title 2 (Administration and Personnel), Chapter 2.92 (Ethics), Section 2.92.200 (Disposition), Subsection (D) is hereby amended to read as follows, all other portions and subsections of City Code 2.92.200 remain in full force and effect:

2.92.200- Disposition.

- D. If after hearing the issues, the ethics review commission determines through clear and convincing evidence that a violation of this chapter has occurred, then the ethics review commission may issue on of the following sanctions:
 - 1. Letter of notification. A letter of notification may be issued when the ethics review commission finds that a violation of this chapter was clearly unintentional. A letter of notification may advise the person to whom the letter is directed of any steps to be taken to avoid future violations.
 - 2. Letter of admonition. A letter of admonition may be issued when the ethics review commission finds that the violation of this chapter was minor and/or may have been unintentional, but where the circumstances call for a more substantial response than a letter of notification.
 - 3. Letter of reprimand. A reprimand may be issued when the ethics review commission finds that a violation of this chapter was committed intentionally or through disregard of this chapter.
 - 4. Recommend removal from office. In addition to a letter of reprimand, removal from office may be recommended to the city council for action when the ethics review commission finds that a serious or repeated violation of this chapter was committed by an officer intentionally or through culpable disregard of this chapter.
 - 5. <u>Issue a fine not to exceed \$500 payable to the City comptroller within 30 days</u> of such order by the ethics review commission.

SECTION 7. That El Paso City Code Title 2 (Administration and Personnel), Chapter 2.92 (Ethics), Section 2.92.020 (Definitions), Subsection (10) is hereby amended to read as follows, all other portions and subsections of City Code 2.92.020 remain in full force and effect:

10. Contribution means a direct or indirect transfer of money, goods, services, or any other thing of value and includes an agreement made or other obligation incurred, whether legally enforceable or not, to make a transfer. The term includes a loan or extension of credit, other than those expressly excluded by the Texas Election Code, and a guarantee of a loan or extension of credit. The term does not include an expenditure required to be reported under Section 35.006(b), Texas Government Code. In-kind expenses, as defied in this section, is not a contribution.

SECTION 8. Except as expressly herein amended, all other provisions of the El Paso City Code shall remain in full force and effect. Any violation of a provision of this ordinance shall be deemed illegal shall be severed and the remainder shall remain in effect. The requirements of this ordinance shall take effect 90 days from its adoption and publication in accordance with and as provided by law and the City Charter.
